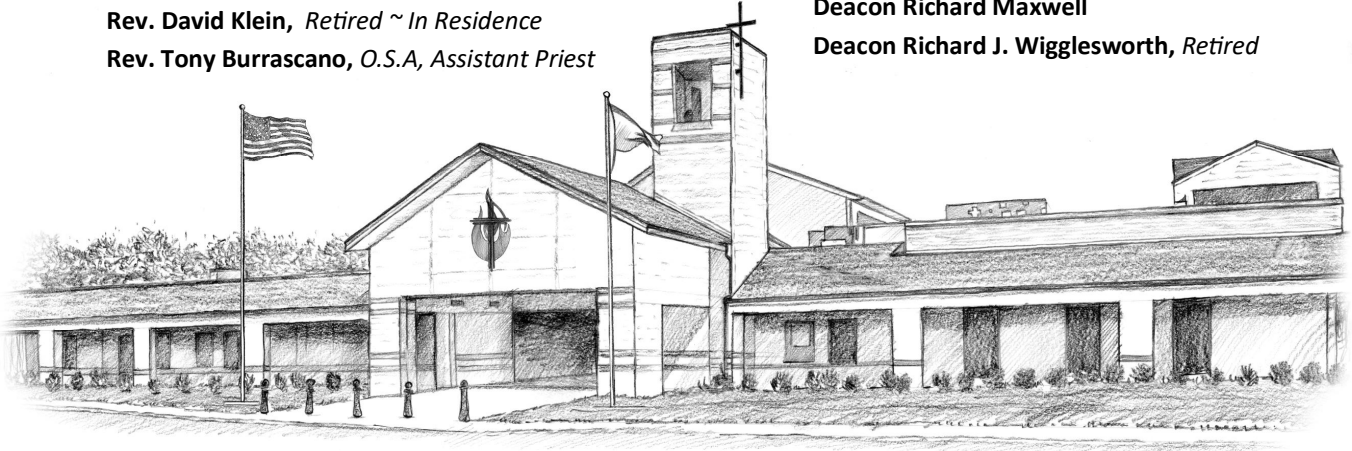

PARISHIONER PICK ~ Deacon Richard J. Wigglesworth



My name is Deacon Richard J. Wigglesworth, I was born on July 31, 1941. I was born and raised in Bellcolville, N.J. My wife Janet was raised in Dorothy N.J. We attended the same grammar school, and have known each other since the second or third grade. Our parents were Catholic. My father was a convert to Catholicism.

We dated through High School and were married at Saint Bernard Church in Dorothy on September 9, 1961. We will be celebrating our 65th wedding anniversary this September. We were later blessed with four healthy sons. Janet was a stay at home mom and loved every minute of it.

In my career, I was a member of an Electrical Union and I worked as a journey lineman. I was employed by various electrical contractors over the years.

Concerning our faith, we were “once a week” Catholics. We just went to Church on Sundays, although we always believed in God, His Church, His Holy word, and the Sacraments. One day Janet was invited to go to a prayer meeting with a neighbor.

The neighbor was persistent, and continued to invite her until after a few weeks, Janet agreed. In the following weeks I noticed a big difference in her. She was happier and was changing for the better. I decided that I wanted what she had, so I went to my first prayer meeting. There was something special there. The people were filled with the love of Christ and had a personal relationship with the Holy Spirit. After a short time, Janet and I attended a six week seminar on the further outpouring of the Holy Spirit. At the conclusion of the seminar we were both prayed over and we received many of the gifts of the Holy Spirit including the gift of tongues. What a powerful and awesome experience!

I was told that a new Diaconate program was about to begin. I applied, and after a series of tests, interviews and close scrutiny by the Diocese of Camden I was accepted. After a few years of Diaconate formation, I was ordained as a Permanent Deacon in September of 1988, and began serving at Saint Vincent de Paul parish that same year. Around that same time, Janet became a lector, CCD teacher, joined the church choir, and assisted me at baptism classes and RCIA classes. For over fifteen years, every Friday, we visited Wood View Estates, an assisted living facility in Mays Landing where we would pray the rosary and distribute Holy Communion to the many residents there. In addition to that I would regularly make many home visits to those who were house bound, praying with them as well as administering Holy Communion to them, as well as to those who were hospitalized. I have also baptized many children, as well as some adults over the last 38 years here at Saint Vincent DePaul parish (perhaps hundreds). There was always so much to do.

In conclusion I would like it to be known that, Jesus Christ and His Holy Spirit are truly working in our lives!

Symptoms of Tickborne Disease

Many tickborne diseases can have similar signs and symptoms. If you get a tick bite and develop the symptoms below within a few weeks, see your healthcare provider. The most common symptoms of tick-related illnesses include:

- **Fever/chills** - All tickborne diseases can cause fever.
- **Aches and pains** - Tickborne diseases can cause headache, fatigue, and muscle aches. People with Lyme disease may also have joint pain.
- **Rash** - Lyme disease, Southern tick-associated rash illness (STARI), Rocky Mountain spotted fever (RMSF), ehrlichiosis, and tularemia can cause distinctive rashes.

Tick paralysis is thought to be caused by a toxin in the saliva of an attached tick. People with tick paralysis can experience weakness or paralysis that gradually moves up the body. These symptoms can sometimes resemble other neurologic conditions. Patients typically regain movement within 24 hours of removing the tick.

Before deciding on a plan for treatment, your healthcare provider should evaluate your symptoms, the geographic region where you were bitten, and lab tests.

Dear parishioners,

A summer full of prayer, fun, and good work is coming to an end.

I did not know what to expect when I first arrived. This was my first experience assigned to a parish as a seminarian. However, whatever anxieties I may have felt before my arrival were quickly put to rest by your warm welcome.

For as long as I can remember, I have been told that the Church is experiencing a vocations crisis. Fewer men are becoming priests. Projections show that the number of newly ordained priests is only a fraction of those set to retire. With so much work to do and fewer hands available to do it, seminarians and priests must be aware of new challenges that will arise. The faculty at my seminary are well aware and are warning me and my brother seminarians of the very real threat of "priest burnout."

"The harvest is plentiful but the laborers are few" (Matt. 9:37) encourages us of all that can be gained for the kingdom of heaven through our work here on earth. But we must take care to remember that we alone can only carry so much—or as Fr. March put it during an earlier conversation we had, "the needs are infinite but individually we are limited."

My experience this summer certainly helped me gain a greater appreciation for this sentiment. Days fill up fast, especially in a parish as active as this. Applying what I have learned from seminary has helped me manage my time so that I am able to handle the day's tasks. The key is identifying what gives you energy (a deposit) and what uses it up (a withdrawal). Some deposits for me include enjoying a good meal, praying in front of the Blessed Sacrament, or playing tennis. Withdrawals include long meetings or exposing my precious Irish skin to the brutal sun for too long. The goal is to know yourself and to keep your withdrawals and deposits balanced.

However, even someone excellent at self-management can fall victim to burnout, as I am sure some of you can relate. That is why my time with you this summer has been so encouraging. You have shown me that even if vocations are declining, I will not be working alone.

The Gospel for this Sunday (July 26) puts it perfectly: "the kingdom of heaven is like a treasure in a field." That treasure shines brightly in the community at St. Vincent's. It shines in the work you selflessly put into event planning and execution, the uplifting prayers you offer, and the laughs you share. We are called not to simply wait to receive the kingdom's treasure, but to actively build it up here and now. I've seen a lot of laborers in my time here, which means the treasure being harvested must be all the more plentiful.

Thank you for all the kindness you have shown me these last 7 weeks. I am all the richer for it.
