Something from the Pastor

"Jesus of Nazareth God hath raised up, having loosed the sorrows of hell, as it was impossible that he should be holden by it" (Acts 2:24).

This is the cause of our joy. This is the cause of our hope. Jesus is risen from the dead!

We are approximately half-way through our observance of Easter. I am sure that for most of us, our Easter candy is all gone, as are our Easter eggs! The Easter candy reminds us that our Lenten fast is over, while also reminding us of the sweet joy of the resurrection. The Easter eggs represent the new life we partake in by our faith in the resurrection of Jesus. While our Easter candies and eggs might be gone, our Easter Joy must continue, even well past Pentecost.

A good way to keep the Easter Joy alive is to ponder the resurrection.

As the Gospel accounts relate, Jesus appeared in his body, the same one which hung upon the cross and was placed in the tomb; the same bodily Jesus who died is now resurrected. Recall that Jesus showed his wounds and allowed his Apostles to touch him. Jesus even ate after the resurrection! Truly Jesus was not a ghost, a spirit or even a shared memory.

Jesus' bodily resurrection confirms the importance of our own bodies. Our bodies are not some external things that just happen to cover our souls or some clothing to be discarded after death. Rather, our bodies are very much an integral part of who we are as individuals. To put it simply: my body is part of what makes me to be me. Of course, at the resurrection of the dead our bodies will be perfect and will be like that of the glorified body of Jesus. How awesome that will be!

Jesus' bodily resurrection makes clear that death is not the end. This eases the sadness that comes with death. As the passage quoted above states, "he (Jesus) loosed the sorrows of hell". The sadness that come with death gives way to hope. This hope points to a future. This future is the glory of heaven. The hope of the resurrection spurs us on to persevere in every trial and to imitate Jesus in all things so to share in his resurrection.

Let us not allow the Easter Joy to wane. Rather, let us keep celebrating these 50 days by keeping the sweet joy of the new life of the resurrection fresh by pondering the resurrection.
