Seasonal Affective Disorder (SAD) Awareness Month to raise awareness about SAD, a type of depression linked to biochemical imbalance in the brain due to changes in seasons, especially the reduced sunlight and colder weather of fall and winter. Seniors are particularly vulnerable to symptoms of SAD.

SAD symptoms include:

- Tiredness
- Lack of interest in normal activities/hobbies
- Withdraw inward
- Cravings for high-carb foods or increased appetite/weight gain.
- Irritability

Ways to reduce SAD symptoms:

- Exercise; even short walks can help (check with your physician first)
- Have your Vitamin D levels checked. Levels too low can impact the amount of serotonin and dopamine that lead to feelings of depression.
- Regular sleep schedule
- Medication
- Other forms of therapy

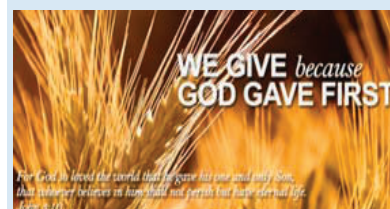


Super Bowl Hoagie Sale

Something from the Pastor

We have begun the liturgical season known as Ordinary Time. The word “ordinary” is not to be understood as normal, run-of-the-mill, common or average. Rather, it refers to the ordinal numbering of the weeks, 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, etc. This numbering is more than just counting. The order in the ordinal numbers, as well as the order in ordinary, calls to mind the Divine Plan; that God has ordered time for the purpose of coming to know and love Him, so to share in His Divine life.

This hope of eternal life is symbolized by the green vestments worn during the season. Green represents life, hope and the Holy Spirit, the giver of life and sustainer of hope. Our hope is rooted in our faith in Jesus Christ; our faith is the beginning of eternal life. With faith comes the Holy Spirit, who leads us to cry out Father (cf. Galatians 4:6-7, Romans 8:15-16). To call God Father by the Holy Spirit means that we are a new creation in Christ Jesus, sharing now in his Sonship.

The liturgy, particularly the Mass, strengths one to life as a child of God. Every Mass is like a small Pentecost, filling us with the Holy Spirit, so that we might go forth and bear witness to Jesus in all that we do. Living as disciple of Christ in the world begins to set us apart, as we live in the midst of the world following the teachings of Jesus and not the flow of the crowd.

Living in the world in imitation of Jesus led the disciples of Christ to be called Christians in Antioch (Acts 11:26). The same ought to happen today, here in Cherry Hill. Allow your observance of Ordinary Time to lead you to follow Christ more closely, so to witness to him more profoundly in the midst of the world today.

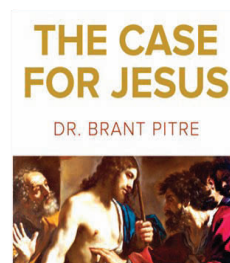
Lectio: The Case for Jesus
