Sisters Meeting

Last week I had the pleasure of meeting with all of the Sisters who live in St. Peter Convent. It was the first time that we all got together since I came to St. Peter, and I enjoyed being with them. We discussed the living agreement we share with the Sisters of St. Joseph. I informed the Sisters that it had not been reviewed in over 16 years and that we would have to ask their community to contribute a little more to St. Peter's parish for the upkeep of the property. They all said they understood. Ours is a unique situation; normally when a religious community no longer serves in a parish, they leave the Convent, and the parish repurposes it.



Here at St. Peter, the Sisters, many of whom are retired, requested and were allowed to remain in the Convent. In a sense our Convent has become an independent living facility of St. Joseph, and they are most grateful.



I asked the Sisters if they had any concerns, needs or maintenance issues that we have yet not addressed. They informed me that they had none. I apologized once again for the time it took to address the plumbing issues last year and they assured me it was okay. Last year I tried to give each sister \$500.00 for the inconvenience they endured during the repairs. They refused to take it and only after my insisting did they finally agree to keep \$100.00 each for a little extra treat.

Because all of them have dedicated their lives to children we spent most of our time talking about St. Peter School. I explained to them where we are enrollment wise, and where we hope to go. They all shook their heads with understanding because they had walked down our road many times. Sr. Jude, who is the Director of Development at Our Lady of Mount Carmel in Asbury Park, mentioned several ideas they are trying and offered to be of assistance in any way she could. I thanked Sr. Jude and promised that the members of our School Board would be in touch to learn from her experience. Sr. Chris also offered to help in any way she could.



I also had the pleasure of meeting the next day Sr. Kathleen Boyle from the Mother House in Philadelphia. She is the Sisters' area delegate and visits each Convent on a regular basis. We discussed the living agreement the parish has with the Sisters of St. Joseph. She also said that the Community was very grateful for the chance to stay in the St. Peter Convent even though the Sisters were no longer employed by the parish. She promised to take our request for an increase in subsidy to the Community Leadership.

The Sisters who live in our Convent have dedicated their lives to the Church. They have all served the Church faithfully for many years and I am sure we are all grateful for their service. They deserve to live in a place where they enjoy their retirement, possibly closer to their families, and near the shore. I am grateful that St. Peter parish afforded them this opportunity.

We all understood that should the number of Sisters living in the convent decrease or if the Sisters found a better opportunity, or if St. Peter wanted to repurpose the Convent for another purpose, that we would part ways as friends. They were both good meetings for sure.

Parent's Meeting

One of my best moments in the past couple of weeks was my meeting with the parents of our 2nd grade children from CCD who made their First Confession yesterday. They will make their First Holy Communion at Sunday Masses in the Spring. At first, with everyone coming late and getting settled, it was a little like herding cats. However, once they all settled in it was beautiful.

I spoke with them about the importance of teaching their children to say they are sorry. I also stressed how important it also is for them to teach their kids to accept forgiveness. Both of these abilities are essential for our relationship with God and our relationships with each other. I explained that God does not want us to carry all of our faults on our backs for the rest of our lives. At the end I asked them to consider going to Confession themselves before their child's big day and bringing their children to watch them do it. Here is a portion of the email I sent them:

Please come to Church and model going to Confession for your children. Teach them that it is good to go to Confession and that saying I'm sorry is important.

It doesn't matter how long it's been.

It doesn't matter how big you think your sins are.

If doesn't matter if you remember the prayers or not, we will help you.

No one will speak harshly or try to make you feel bad. We will try to do the opposite.

This is one of the most important things you can do for your children and for yourself.

To my surprise several families followed my advice. I'm not sure of the count, but I am guessing that 25% of the families came. It was very moving for most of them and very moving for Fr. Noel and myself. As you might expect, some of them had not been to Confession in years. One family even received the Plenary Indulgence together. (Beautiful!)

We can never give up on our young families. The love they have for their children is beautiful to behold and salvific for sure. This parish has to continue to try and find ways to connect our families with their parish and offer them support as they raise their children in what seems to be a strange world which keeps getting stranger.

Here is a picture I took of our St. Peter School 2nd graders peeking out of the confessional. We wanted to make them feel comfortable in the confessional, so we let them explore. Rest assured, they did just that.

This Week's Gospel Reading

Mark 1:21-28

Jesus heals a man with an unclean spirit and his fame spreads throughout Galilee.

Background on the Gospel Reading

Today's Gospel continues our reading from Mark and describes what some believe was likely to have been a typical day in Jesus' ministry. Jesus and the disciples that chose to follow him in last week's Gospel arrive at Capernaum, a small village on the Sea of Galilee. Jesus teaches in the synagogue on the Sabbath. Mark reports that the people respond to Jesus' teaching with astonishment, noting Jesus' authority and contrasting it with the scribes. Early in Mark's Gospel we already find evidence of the tension that will manifest itself fully in Jerusalem.

After Jesus' preaching, an even more astonishing thing happens. A man possessed with an unclean spirit calls out to Jesus. As we see in this example and throughout Mark's Gospel, the spirits and demons seem to know Jesus and are often fearful of him. In fact, they seem to understand Jesus' identity better than his disciples. As we will read again and again in Mark's Gospel, Jesus orders the spirit to be quiet and drives the unclean spirit out of the man. Jesus' ability to heal those possessed by demons is an indication of his power over evil.

In the prescientific age of Jesus' time, all illnesses were understood to be manifestations of evil and sinfulness. Our modern understanding of illness is very different. Possession by unclean spirits may have been a way to describe what we might call mental illness today. It may have even been a way of describing certain kinds of physical conditions. There is evidence that there were many kinds of exorcists and healers in first-century Palestine. Jesus appears to be like these healers, but he heals with unique authority and connects his healing activities with the words of his preaching.

We are missing the point that Mark is trying to make in this Gospel, however, if we try to explain away the healing work of Jesus. The crowds see in Jesus' cure of the possessed man further affirmation of his authority. Jesus' power to heal gives greater credence to his teaching. Jesus impresses the crowds through his words, which are manifested with power in his deeds. Mark's Gospel tells us that because of the authority with which he healed; Jesus' fame spread throughout all of Galilee.
