Eucharistic Adoration: Eucharistic Adoration is held every Tuesday evening after the 7:00 pm Mass until 9:00 in the chapel. Eucharistic Adoration for Respect Life Intentions is held every Fridays from 8:30 - 9:30 am in the Church.

Sacrament of Baptism: Baptisms are held on the Fourth Sunday of each month at 12:30 pm or during a Sunday Mass. Attendance at a pre-baptismal class is required. Arrangements may be made by contacting the parish office.

Sacrament of the Sick: Arrangements can be made anytime for the administration of the Sacrament of the Sick. Please call the parish office when someone is looking to receive the Sacrament of the Sick.

Marriage Arrangements: Arrangements for marriage must be made at least one year in advance of the wedding. Engaged couples must comply with all marriage preparation programs that are required by NJ Bishops. Please call to make an appointment with the parish priest to begin marriage preparation.

Religious Education Classes: The Religious Education program at St. Cecilia parish is committed to faith formation and formal training of children. The goal is to inspire and motivate children to develop love of the Father, have a personal encounter with Jesus Christ with guidance and knowledge of the Holy Spirit. We will build an understanding of the basic beliefs in the Roman Catholic faith and lay the foundation and encouragement to carry those beliefs to the community.

The preparation for the sacrament of Confirmation is incorporated over a period of three years for grades 6-7-8. Parish service hours are a sacramental requirement.

Sponsors & Godparents: The following are the mandated requirements to be a sponsor/Godparent at St. Cecilia parish:

- ▼ If married, the marriage MUST be valid within the Catholic Church
- ₩ At least 14 years of age
- * Received the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation in the Catholic Church
- ♣ Attend Mass regularly on Sundays (or Saturday evening) and Holy Days of obligation
- ♣ Receive the Sacrament of the Church regularly

Sponsors and Godparents must be an active parishioner and be attending Mass for at least 3 months to be eligible.

Parish Membership

Any new family who has moved into the parish area, and adult children 18 years of age and older, are invited to register as parishioners. The definition of an active parishioner is: One registered, attending Mass weekly and contributing to the support of the church.

Every high priest is taken from among men and made their representative before God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins.


He is able to deal patiently with the ignorant and erring, for he himself is beset by weakness and so, for this reason, must make sin offerings for himself as well as for the people.



This year they are requesting the following items: Stuffing, canned turkey gravy, cereal & oatmeal, canned cranberry sauce/sweet potatoes/yams/white potatoes, boxed mashed potatoes, boxed rice, cornbread muffin mix, boxed Brownies, cake mixes, icing, pie crust, and pie fillings such as pumpkin, apple etc., coffee, peanut butter & jelly, snack foods (low fat, low sugar), Parmalat/boxed milk, prepared noodle and rice mixes, boxed macaroni and cheese, pancake mix and syrup, chicken broth, hearty soups & Frozen turkeys/Ham.

(Please note that the frozen turkeys and hams **MUST** be dropped off directly at the South Brunswick Township Food Pantry as the church does not have the capacity to hold perishables.)

Why do Catholics do that?

Why do Catholics give new names at Baptism? Catholics often give their children new names at Baptism to celebrate the new spiritual life of the one being baptized.

In the Bible, name changes were often associated with significant life-changes, for example, Simon's name was changed to "Peter" when Jesus singled him out to be the first pope (Matthew 16:18). Often a saint's name will be chosen at Baptism, as a way of placing the baptized person under the patronage of the saint as their intercessor and model in holiness.

St Catherine of Siena Patroness of the United States:

St. Catherine of Siena was born during the outbreak of the plague in Siena, Italy on March 25, 1347. She was the 25th child born to her mother, although half of her brothers and sisters did not survive childhood. Catherine herself was a twin, but her sister did not survive infancy.



Catherine once explained that she regarded her father as a representation of Jesus and her mother as Our Lady, and her brothers as the apostles, which helped her to serve them with humility.

Despite Catherine's religious nature, she did not choose to enter a convent and instead she joined the Third Order of St. Dominic, where she learned how to read. Meanwhile, she lived quietly, isolated within her family home.

St. Catherine developed a habit of giving things away, like the family's food and clothing to people in need. She never asked permission to give these things away, and she quietly put up with their criticisms.

When Catherine was 21, she described an experience she referred to as her "mystical marriage to Christ." There are debates over whether or not St. Catherine was given a ring by Jesus. Such mystical experiences change people, and St. Catherine was no exception. In her vision, she was told to reenter public life and to help the poor and sick. She immediately went into public to help people in need.

She often visited the poor and sick in hospitals and homes. Her activities quickly attracted followers who helped her in her mission to serve the poor and sick. St. Catherine was drawn further into the world as she worked, and eventually she began to travel, calling for reform of the Church and for people to confess and to love God totally. She became involved in politics and was key in working to keep city states loyal to the Pope. She was also credited with helping to start a crusade to the Holy Land.

St. Catherine allegedly was given the stigmata, but like her ring, it was visible only to herself. From 1375 onwards, St. Catherine began dictating letters to scribes. She petitioned for peace and was instrumental in persuading the Pope in Avignon to return to Rome.

She is credited with composing over 400 letters. These works are so influential that she would later be declared a Doctor of the Church. She is one of the most influential and popular saints in the Church.

St. Catherine died in 1380 at the age of 33. Her feast day is April 29. She is the patroness against fire, illness, the United States, Italy, miscarriages, people ridiculed for their faith, sexual temptation, and nurses.




