SPONSOR LETTERS - Canon (Church) Law states that a Godparent for Baptism and a Sponsor for Confirmation **be an active, fully-initiated Catholic** (Confirmed). An **active** Catholic is a parishioner who is registered, attends Mass weekly, contributes to the support of the Church, publicly leads a genuine Christian lifestyle and is in a valid Catholic marriage (an individual married civilly by a judge or mayor, or divorced and remarried without an annulment is not eligible to act as a sponsor). Please note that we can only write *Letters of Eligibility* for parishioners who meet these criteria.

BAPTISM/SPONSORSHIP CLASS - Parents and godparents are required to attend one session before their child's Baptism date can be confirmed. Sessions are held on **the FIRST Tuesday of every month at 7:00PM.** *Registration is required.* Please contact Sr. Nadine 908-756-0633 x118 to register for the class or with any questions.

This week on August 15, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Assumption, a Holy Day of Obligation. It's a good time to reflect on the Blessed Virgin Mary's role in our salvation and to answer some common questions.

If we have Jesus, what do we need Mary for?

To become man, Jesus, the Son of God and Second Person of the Holy Trinity, had to be born. The Blessed Virgin Mary fulfilled this unique role in the story of salvation when, using her free will, she agreed to become the Mother of God.

Was she really always a virgin?

Yes. Mary's situation is unique. Not just any human woman can give birth to the Savior of the world. Through the grace of God, Mary was spared original sin, becoming an appropriate vessel for the Incarnation of Jesus Christ, the second Person of the Holy Trinity. God gave Mary the grace of redemption, ahead of time, one might say. Recall that God is outside of time and not bound by it, or anything else. But why did she remain a virgin? Think of Mary's conversation with the archangel Gabriel. Mary says to him, "How is this to be when I know not man?" The Catholic scholar Brant Pitre explains Mary's perpetual virginity this way: "Just as someone who says, 'I do not smoke' means 'I do not smoke (presently), nor do I have any intentions of smoking (in the future),' so also Mary's words mean 'I do not have sexual relations (presently), nor do I intend to have relations (in the future)." Having contained divinity, Mary's body would not be available for anything else.

What's the holyday of the Assumption about?

All human beings die because of original sin. The first people, Adam and Eve, rejected God and disobeyed Him. As a result, we die and our bodies decay away. By the grace of God, Mary did not have original sin. So at the end of her earthly life she was spared death and the corruption of the flesh. As the Mother of God, it is fitting that she would be delivered from death and that God would



bring her body and soul to heaven, glorified and enjoying eternal life with Him before any of the rest of us. This is why we say that Mary was "assumed" into heaven – as in, God took her to heaven. She did not go to eternal life under her own power. Our Lady is a human being, after all. On the feast of the Assumption, we celebrate that Mary was taken – assumed – into heaven body and soul by the power of God. This holyday is so important that it is one of a handful of holy days on which Catholics are obligated to go to Mass to worship God.

How does venerating Mary connect to worshipping God?

There's a difference between veneration, which is similar to profound respect, and worship, which is adoration. We adore and worship God. We respect Mary and look to her for help and support. The Blessed Virgin Mary always leads us to her Son, Jesus, and so to our own redemption. When we think of heaven, most of us miss the point that our eternal life is not being a disembodied soul forever. Mary, in her bodily assumption, experiences immediately what we hope to experience eventually: that our redemption is to be physical as well as spiritual. Mary shows us what is possible when a human being chooses of their own free will to cooperate with God's grace and abandon their own plans in order to follow His will for them. Look to the Virgin Mary if you want to pursue the path of holiness.—Louise Timko, *Director of Religious Education & Faith Formation*


