




With Thanksgiving approaching, Social Concerns will once again be providing the family it serves with all the trimmings for a Thanksgiving dinner.


This Is Our Faith

All Hallow's Eve

Ghosts and witches and jack o'lanterns glowing in the October dark night! It must be Halloween. The word Halloween comes from the English word "hallowed" or holy. A couple of centuries ago, the word evening was frequently shortened to "e'en." And that's how we get the word Halloween—the evening before the day we celebrate the Holy Ones – All Saints Day, November 1. Then on November 2, we celebrate All Souls Day, remembering all those who have died even if they weren't known to us as being particularly holy. Taken together, these three days (Oct. 31 thru Nov. 2) were known as Allhallowtide.

These days are connected to the Christian belief in the Communion of Saints, the union of all the faithful on earth (the Church Militant), the saints in Heaven (the Church Triumphant) and the Poor Souls in Purgatory (the Church Suffering). These different aspects are bound together supernaturally. For centuries it was believed that at this time of the year the separation between the living and the dead thinned, making the supernatural closer than ever to us. In part this was because it looked as though plants were dying even as the days grew shorter and darker.

Though we may try with all manner of fun, Halloween is at its heart grimly associated with the reality of death. For example, today we decorate pumpkins, but originally, in Ireland, the custom was to carve turnips to look like skulls or even, some say, the souls of the dead come back to





Traditions vary widely from culture to culture, but the idea of Halloween goes back as far as the ninth century. It was believed that All Hallows' Eve provides one last chance for the dead to interact with the living. In order to avoid being recognized by any

soul bent on revenge, people would wear masks or costumes to trick the dead. Another tradition says that on Halloween the dead in the cemeteries come forth for one wild night of partying, known as the Danse Macabre, frequently illustrated during the Middle Ages.

While our culture overlooks All Saints Day and All Souls Day in favor of Halloween, these three days are interconnected in profound ways. We are never completely separate from the Saints in heaven, nor they from us. And we would do well never to ignore the next phase that awaits us all.


