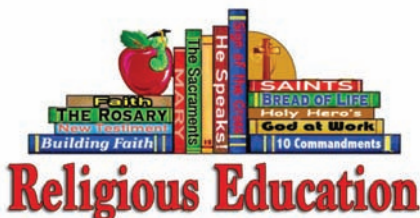

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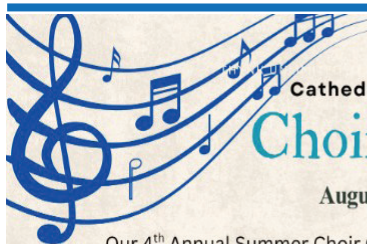

This Is Our Faith

How We Worship (Part 2)

Bringing a gift to God has been a necessary religious act for centuries. While many of these offerings in ancient times were animal sacrifices – everything from small birds to lambs and oxen – there were also grain offerings and sacrifices of bread and wine.

For an animal sacrifice, there were specific steps: 1) kill the animal by slitting its throat and collect the blood, 2) the Temple priest would offer the animal to God by casting its blood against the altar (and sometimes sprinkling the people who brought the sacrifice), and 3) assume the offering was accepted by God. Part of the sacrificed animal was set aside. The rest was given back to person offering the sacrifice and he shared it with his family and guests.

In other words, the one religious act of offering an animal to God had two parts: the sacrifice and the meal at which the sacrifice was eaten.

In sacrificing of an animal, blood was a key component. Blood was what gave life to an animal. Sacrifices were done for many reasons: to appease God, or to seal agreements and covenants between humans and between God and human beings. Offering blood sacrifices could also heal, bring prosperity, gain forgiveness, and express thanksgiving.

The Last Supper, the basis of our Mass, was a Passover Meal. Passover was the celebration of God rescuing the People from slavery in Egypt at the time of Moses. At the time of Jesus, the Jewish people were awaiting the fulfillment of the prophecies that there would be another, new Exodus in which God would rescue His People again.

Passover required both sacrificing an animal – an unblemished lamb – and eating a meal. Passover practices are described in detail in the Book of Exodus in the Bible. While the Gospels speak about the bread and wine at the Passover meal Jesus shared with His apostles, the Gospels do not mention the lamb that would have also been eaten, having been slain at the Temple, earlier the same day. (The ancient writer Josephus describes witnessing thousands of lambs being slain in the Temple for Passover.) According to the Gospels, at the Last Supper Jesus shifts the attention to Himself, identifying Himself as the Lamb which is offered to God: “This is my Body... This is my Blood.” St. Justin Martyr would later point out the similarity between the way Passover lambs were roasted—with one spit through the body and one across the shoulders (like a cross) and how Jesus would be the final sacrifice for our redemption on an actual cross, offering up His own blood (life).

There's one more aspect of Jewish religious practice in Jesus's day that's worth pointing out. In the Temple was a specially built golden table on which bread was kept. This bread – the Bread of the Presence – also translated as the Bread of the Face – somehow was understood to be a visible sign of the Face of God. Next to the bread, were pitchers of wine and bowls for pouring out libations of wine to God. The bread and wine in the Jewish Temple in the time of Jesus attested to the Jewish belief that the Temple held the real physical presence of God.

Everything Jesus is doing at the Last Supper is connected to a new Exodus and His followers expressed this through what we now call the Mass. —Louise Timko, PhD, Director of Faith Formation



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
