HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly

Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time February 4, 2024

"Rising very early before dawn, he left and went off to a deserted place, where he prayed. Simon, and those who were with him pursued him and on finding him said, 'Everyone is looking for you'. He told them, 'let us go on to the nearby villages that I may preach there also. For this purpose have I come.'"



Following His visit to a synagogue, healing Peter's family member and many others, Jesus leaves to be alone in prayer. Did you ever think of the content of that prayer, perhaps gratitude for the healing, for those who responded to His teaching, for the needs which would confront Him in the future in the next village?

In a few brief verses we meet Jesus, as teacher, healer, prayer and with us today companion for others. Simon's statement, 'everyone is looking for you', is repeated for us today, although many do not know the Jesus we know and follow. Our task is to help them end their search and bring Jesus to them.

First Reading: Leviticus 13:1-2, 44-46

The Lord tells Moses and Aaron that anyone bearing the sore of leprosy must first be seen by Aaron or one of the other priests, and that as long as the sore is upon him, "He shall dwell apart, making his abode outside the camp."

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 10:31—11:1
Paul instructs the Corinthians to do everything for the glory of God, to avoid offending others, and to be imitators of Christ.

Gospel: Mark 1:40-45

Jesus takes pity on a leper and cures him of his disease with a warning not to say but to show himself to the priest and make an offering. Instead of remaining silent, the leper greatly publicized the healing, making it impossible for Jesus to enter the town openly.

SCAPULARS

The Gifts from Our Lord and Our Lady



BROWN SCAPULAR

Our Lady appeared to Saint Simon Stock on July 16, 1251 and entrusted him with the Brown Scapular. Originally, the Scapular was only for Carmelites but was later opened as a privilege to the laity as well. The wearers of the Scapular are promised to not suffer eternal flames if worn for life and the promises are kept by the wearer. The time of the wearer's soul in Purgatory will be shortened by 500 days each time the Scapular is kissed. The true reason for the Scapular is to wear as a devotion to Mary and to show your love for Her.



SCAPULAR OF BENEDICTION AND PROTECTION The Scapular of Benediction and Protection (aka The Purple Scapular) was given to approved French mystic Marie Julie Jahenny by Jesus and Mary on August 23, 1878. This Scapular was modeled on Mary's heart and was given as a devotion focusing on Jesus being given to His Mother from the cross, the wounds on His feet, and the tears shed by Mary. If hung in a house, it protects the home from conflagrations (fires). If worn around the neck, it protects the individual from sudden death, thunder, and accidents.



GREEN SCAPULAR OF THE IMMACULATE HEART Our Lady appeared and gave the Green Scapular of the Immaculate Heart to Sister Justine Bisqueyburu on September 8, 1840. The wearer or those in possession of the Green Scapular will receive many graces, miracles, and blessings from Our Lady; especially those who are ill.


