PROMISE TO PROTECT—PLEDGE TO HEAL

The Diocese of Trenton is committed to the norms of the U.S. Bishop's Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People in regard to the reporting and investigation of sexual abuse allegations involving minors. If you have been sexually abused as a minor by anyone representing the Catholic Church, or if you know of someone who was, you can report that abuse through the diocesan Hotline: 1-888-296-2965 or via e-mail at abuseline@dioceseoftrenton.org. Such allegations are reported to the appropriate law enforcement agencies.

OUR SACRAMENTAL LIFE

BAPTISM — Schedule by contacting the office at least four months in advance. Parents are asked to attend a pre-baptism conference; godparents also are welcome to attend.

MATRIMONY — At least a year prior to your anticipated date, contact the office for information on the preparatory process.

RCIA — The Rite of Christian Initiation is offered year round for adults who seek to join the Catholic Church or for those Catholics who wish to complete their sacramental initiation (First Communion and/or Confirmation). Weekly classes begin each September.

MINISTRIES TO THE SICK AND HOMEBOUND — In case of serious illness, contact the office to arrange for the anointing of the sick. Contact the office also to arrange for regular visits to the homebound for the reception of Holy Communion.

SACRAMENTS FOR CHILDREN — The Religious Education Office can arrange the preparation for older children or teens who wish to receive First Eucharist and/or Confirmation.

LOW-GLUTEN HOSTS — We provide low-gluten (0.01%) hosts for those with Celiac Disease. Please inform the priest or deacon of your need prior to the celebration of Mass; at communion time, approach the priest celebrant who will have this sacred host.

DEVOTIONS

EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION — Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will resume on Thursdays following the 9:00 AM Mass at Our Lady of Sorrows. Simple Reposition of the Sacrament will take place at 6:00 PM. The usual COVID-19 protocols are to be observed.

Prayer Groups who come to church on other days during the week are strongly encouraged to come during this extended period of Eucharistic Adoration.

THE ROSARY — Suspended until further notice. Please check the bulletin for updates.

NOVENAE — Same as above.

PRAYERS FOR THE SICK — Names of the sick may be placed on the bulletin's "Prayer List" for a 12-week period unless otherwise arranged. Permission of the sick person is required.

REGISTRATION — We welcome new members. Registration can be made online or in person at the parish office. It enables us verify participation in parish life and to issue contribution statements for tax purposes

MASS INTENTIONS — The usual offering is \$10.

SANCTUARY MEMORIALS — Altar flowers and/or weekly sanctuary lamp dedications in memory of loved ones or a special occasion can be arranged. The lamp offering is \$15. Donation toward the flower arrangement is \$75.

ASKED TO BE A GODPARENT/SPONSOR? — Certificates of eligibility are provided to registered parishioners who meet the qualifications established in Canon Law. A Godparent/Sponsor is a Catholic who has received the Eucharist and Confirmation; lives a life in harmony with the Catholic Faith; (if married) is in a marriage recognized as valid by the Church; and is not the parent of the one to be baptized or confirmed.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners,

During the final weeks of the liturgical year, the Church would have us mediate on the "four last things:" death, judgment, heaven, and hell. They make up what is called "eschatology"—the teachings about the end times and our eternal destiny. These themes will be found in the Sunday and weekday liturgies of these days that bring our year to a close. Cardinal Basil Hume offers a little help on why reflecting on these realities is important:

One day I shall die. Thinking about that is good for me. It helps me to look at the way I am living. It enables me to get a better perspective. I know that I shall not remain forever in this world. I must ask important questions: 'Am I making the best of my life? Am I living in such a way that I try always to follow my conscience? Are my motives in life right? What do I really want? What am I really seeking?' Those are very simple and fundamental questions, and ones that we have to ask ourselves. That is a sobering thought. While such thoughts have their value, it would be quite wrong to leave it like that. The Christian faces death realistically, but also knows that death is a gateway, a new beginning, a fulfillment of human life. We are men and women moving through life like pilgrims heading toward our final destination. It is healthy to look forward to that destination when we shall find total fulfillment. Do not be fearful of death. Welcome it when it comes. It is now a holy thing, made so by Him who died that we might live.



Fr. Michael McGivney Beatified

Saturday, October 31, was a day of great joy for the Knights of Columbus throughout the world as their founder, Fr. Michael McGivney, was proclaimed a "Blessed" by Pope Francis. We offer our felicitations to the Hamilton Council of the Knights on this auspicious occasion and pray that the new "Beatus" will ever intercede for their members and for all their undertakings.



Fr. McGivney was born in Waterbury, CT, the son of Irish immigrants. His zeal for his flock was apparent from the first day of his assignment to St. Mary's Church in New Haven. His dedication to families in challenging times led to his being called the "apostle to the young" and "protector of Christian family life." His desire to see that families, especially widows and children, were provided with financial security moved him in 1882 to found the Knights of Columbus. Today it counts some 1.9 million members worldwide. The four pillars of this Catholic Order of service are charity, unity, fraternity, and patriotism.

Fr. McGivney died in 1890, the victim of a pandemic. To honor the new Beatus and the Knights of Columbus of our Diocese, Bishop O'Connell commissioned a painting of Blessed Michael McGivney to be enshrined at our Co-Cathedral of St. Robert Bellarmine this coming Saturday, November 14. It is the work of Fr. Peter Gray of the Society of St. Sulpice.


