

PRAYERS FOR THE SICK —Names of the sick may be placed on the bulletin's "Prayer List." Please obtain the person's permission.

CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

BAPTISM—Parents are encouraged to baptize their child within the first few weeks after birth. Contact the office a few months in advance. A pre-baptism instruction is required for first time parents.

MATRIMONY—Contact the office prior to reserving the reception venue. Marriage preparation should begin at least a year prior to the wedding date.

THE RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS (RCIA) is offered year-round for those seeking to be received into the Church and those Catholics who wish to complete their sacramental initiation (First Communion and/or Confirmation).

MINISTRY TO THE SICK AND HOMEBOUND—The Anointing of the Sick should be arranged for the seriously ill. Regular visits for Holy Communion may also be arranged.

LOW-GLUTEN HOSTS (0.01%)—These are provided for those with Celiac Disease. Please inform the priest or deacon of your need prior to Mass. At Communion time, approach the priest celebrant, who will have this Host.

AT YOUR SERVICE

REGISTRATION—New parishioners are welcome. Registration can be made online or in person at the office. This enables the parish to verify your contributions and provide letters of recommendation.

EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL

In the final weeks of the revival, we are providing descriptions of the various parts of the Holy Mass.

THE COMMUNION RITE

Invited by the priest, all recite or sing the Lord's Prayer, an excellent transition to the Communion Rite. It's mention of our "daily bread" turns our minds and hearts to the Eucharist. The priest extends the final petition of the prayer: "Deliver us Lord from every evil..." The people respond with the doxology, "For the kingdom, the power..." The plea for forgiveness in the Lord's Prayer, leads to the prayer from peace and an invitation to exchange a sign of peace (strictly optional) It is a reminder that we should be one with each other before approaching the altar for Holy Communion.

After the exchange of peace, the people say or sing the Agnus Dei (Lamb of God) This triple invocation became part of the Roman Liturgy in the 7th century. It evokes the title given to Jesus by St. John the Baptist; a title found in the Scripture over 30 times. Jesus is the lamb sacrificed for our sins. During the Agnus Dei, the priest breaks the host and silently places a particle in the precious blood. It is an ancient custom that was meant to signify the unity with the Pope and the local bishop. In the early Church, the Pope at his Mass, broke off several particles of the host and sent them to several churches. The priests in these places would drop them into their own chalices. It was a gesture of unity.

ANNUAL CATHOLIC APPEAL

The World Day of Prayer for Grandparents and the Elderly



The IV World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly will be celebrated on Sunday, 28 July 2024. The theme chosen by the Holy Father – "Do not cast me off in my old age" (cf. *Psalm* 71:9) – is meant to call attention to the fact that, sadly, loneliness is the bitter lot in life of many elderly persons, so often the victims of the throw-away culture. In this year of preparation for the Jubilee, which the Holy Father wishes to be devoted to prayer, the theme of the World Day is taken from Psalm 71, the plea of an elderly person who reflects on the story of his friendship with God.

By cherishing the charisms of grandparents and the elderly, and the contribution they make to the life of the Church, the World Day seeks to support the efforts of every ecclesial community to forge bonds between the generations and to combat loneliness, in the awareness that – as Scripture states – "It is not good for man to be alone" (*Gen* 2:18).
