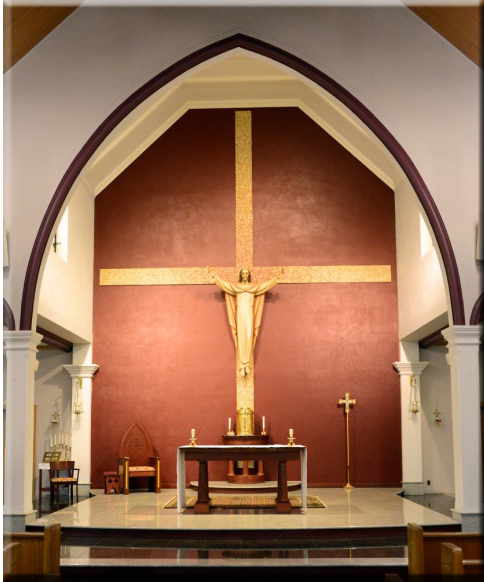

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners:



Today's second reading—two verses from the letter of St. Paul to the Romans—is the shortest in our lectionary. Yet it has a powerful message about prayer. Without prayer we cannot become holy, we

can never become what we are called to be—saints! Still, prayer can be struggle. Saint Paul admits that “we do not know how to pray as we ought.” It is the Holy Spirit who motivates us and inspires us to pray. As Peter Kreeft says, “When we pray we are not alone but the Holy Spirit is there, touching our spirit, helping us, inspiring us, breathing into us.”

St. Paul tells us that the Spirit intercedes with “inexpressible groanings” What does he mean? Consider our experience of prayer—so often our mind races, we can be unfocused, our thoughts are scattered and jumble. St. Paul is reminding us that at such moments, the Holy Spirit comes to our aid. He understands not just the words we try to say but the deepest yearnings of our hearts, the unspoken burdens, and the unformed hopes. The Holy Spirit takes our chaotic prayer and makes it coherent and pleasing to God.

Isn't that a “game changer” in prayer? Rather than getting frustrated, let us remember the presence and action of the Holy Spirit, and simply say, “Holy Spirit, you know my heart and what I want to say, intercede for me with these “groanings.”

SAINT OF THE WEEK: JULY 22

ST MARY MAGDALENE

Mary Magdalene was a disciple of the Lord who plays a lead role in the Gospels,. Saint Luke lists her among the women who followed Jesus after being healed of evil spirits and

infirmities (Lk 8: 2). Magdalene would be present beneath the cross with the Mother of Jesus and other women. In the early morning on the first day after the Sabbath, she was to be the one to discover the empty tomb, beside which she stood weeping until the Risen Jesus appeared to her (Jn 20: 11). She did not recognize the Lord until he called her by name. Then she was asked to the messenger of the Good News--being the first to announce the Resurrection of the Lord. For this reasons, Mary is often called the "apostle to the apostles." It is unfortunate that for so long in history, she was identified as the sinful woman, a reformed harlot who anoints Our Lord in Lk 7: 36-50. It was a misinterpretation of Pope St. Gregory the Great. In order to highlight the importance of Mary Magdalene, Pope Francis raised her Memorial to the rank of a Feast.

OUR COLLECTION FOR RETIRED, ELDERLY AND INFIRM PRIESTS SET FOR JULY 25-26

As we observe on July 26 the World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, established by Pope Francis in 2021, our Diocese will take up a special collection for our Retired, Elderly, and Infirm Priests Fund.

This annual diocesan-wide collection coincides with the Feast of Saints Joachim and Anne, parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary and grandparents of Jesus. Begun in 2022 by Bishop O'Connell, the fund supports more than 80 diocesan priests in their retirement housing and healthcare needs.

Kevin Cimei, diocesan chief financial officer, reported that \$339K was collected last year—a 6% increase over the prior years.

Our Church has a great treasure in the elder members of its community – not only among family members, but priests as well whom the Bishop has called “our spiritual grandparents.” They continue to pray for us and many generously continue to minister in parishes in retirement.

CHURCH COURTESIES

In our effort to cultivate a climate conducive to reverent and active participation at Mass we ask everyone to be attentive to the following:

❖ **Arrival / Dismissal**

A late arrival can be distracting once Mass begins. Arriving early affords us time to recollect our thoughts before Mass. We should not leave Mass before it ends. Bolting for the door just after receiving the Eucharist is a bad witness.

❖ **Handicap parking spaces**

Handicap parking spaces are reserved for those who really need them. Do not park in these reserved spaces unless you have a special plate or sign.

❖ **Welcome Visitors**

A great parish is a welcoming parish. Our smile and helping hand to visitors can go a long way.

❖ **Silence your Cellphones**

Cell phones are a blessing but can also be a distraction. Their use at Mass for calls or texting is disrespectful.

❖ **Reverential Quiet**

Loud talking before and after Mass is most often a distraction. Let's be respectful to those who wish to pray before and after Mass.

❖ **Parents with Infants**

It is always a joy to have infants and young children at Mass. Welcome and encourage their parents. For their part, parents should take care that if their child cries loudly or becomes unruly, they should feel free to walk with them in the side aisle or take them to the vestibule. This will allow the assembly to worship without much distraction.

❖ **Hymnal Holders**

Do not use the hymnal holders for anything other than the books. This keeps our church neat and clean.

CARDINAL BASIL HUME'S TEN GOLDEN RULES FOR PRAYER

1. Plan to pray; don't leave it to chance. Select a time and place
2. Decide how long you will spend in prayer
3. Decide what you are going to do when you pray—e.g. which prayer to say slowly and lovingly or which passage from the Bible to read prayerfully. Sometimes use your own words; sometimes just be still and silent. Follow your inclination.
4. Always start by asking the Holy Spirit for help in your prayers. Pray: "Come Holy Spirit, teach me to pray; help me to do it."
5. Remember you are trying to get in touch with a Person, and that Person is God. He is wanting to get in touch with you.
6. Don't be a slave to one way of praying. Choose what you find easiest and try some other method when the one you are using becomes a burden or doesn't help.
7. Don't look for results.
8. If you have distractions, then turn your distractions into prayer.
9. If you feel dry and uninterested, then read a spiritual book or pamphlet. Spiritual reading is important.
10. Trying to pray *is* praying. Never give up trying.
