## Letter from our Pastor

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

*This past Monday, a wondrous event occurred. The lives of our eighth grade students were fundamentally altered for the better. They received the Sacrament of Confirmation.*

*While all of the Sacraments are powerful experiences of God's grace and love, the Sacrament of Confirmation in our modern times is an especially momentous occasion. For you see, Confirmation has become the final Sacrament of Initiation in most cases. This grouping of Sacraments, of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist, stands as the way in which a person comes to be a true Christian and know God in their life. Without having received all of them, the individual is still not enjoying the full depth of their relationship with God.*

*Too often, Confirmation is seen as a kind of graduation. Perhaps this is due to its ties to eighth grade in the current practice, but Confirmation is and needs to be seen as being so much more than moving on from parochial school or religious education program. It is a transformative event.*

*Many of us probably did not feel much different after we received Confirmation. Sure, our foreheads may have smelled like Chrism immediately afterward and we might have felt relief that we had reached an important milestone, but few if any, of us were so moved by the event that it was life-altering. It was most likely a nice ceremony, but not much more.*

*But that perception does a disservice to ourselves and to the power of the Holy Spirit, who is so generously given to us in the Sacrament. The Holy Spirit and his dwelling within us by virtue of our Confirmation is something we should never underestimate. It is the Holy Spirit that enlightened the Prophets to speak the wisdom of God. It is the Holy Spirit that impelled the sniveling and cowardly Apostles out to preach the Good News and to die for the faith. It is the Holy Spirit that is with us to support us in the darkest, most challenging, and hardest moments of our lives.*

*See in the Sacrament of Confirmation the great grace of becoming emboldened and empowered by God Himself. See it as the means by which the Holy Spirit becomes our own personal Advocate who builds us up in holiness.*

*Let us pray for those who have just received Confirmation and for all of us here at St. Charles Borromeo: Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love.*

Our first year in Middle School is flying by! We have just concluded our second trimester, and trimester three promises to be *very* busy.

As we begin the holy season of Lent, we are given the opportunity to practice our monthly virtues, strengthen our prayer lives, and facilitate the Stations of the Cross for our fellow students.

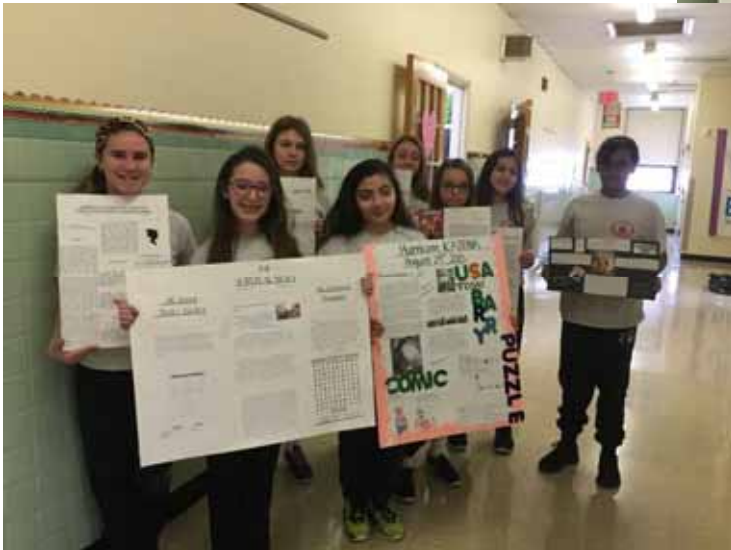
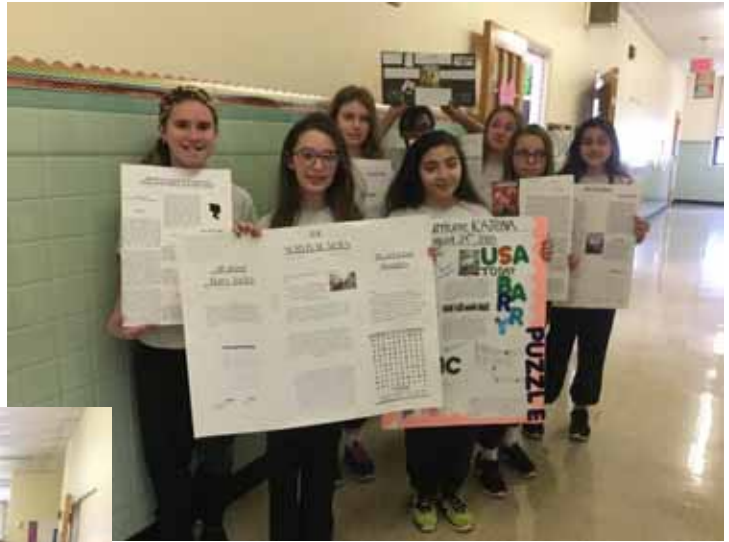
In sixth grade Language Arts, we have enjoyed the novel *From the Mixed-Up Files of Mrs. Basil E. Frankweiler* by E.L. Konigsburg. This Newbury Award story takes place in the New York Metropolitan Museum of Art. As Social Studies students of Ancient Civilizations, we have followed the story line as the protagonists work to uncover the origin of the *Angel* statue. The sister and brother act weave their way around various ancient exhibits, researching and looking for clues. We will conclude this novel with a project in computer class; designing a pamphlet for a museum of our own.

In Social Studies, we have traveled over the Silk Road from Ancient China to the Mediterranean Sea. Several WebQuests have helped us research Ancient China, Greek architecture, and the Egyptian tomb of Perneb. We also celebrated Black History Month with research papers on revered African Americans who have contributed so much to our country.

The seventh grade has also enjoyed several novels this year. Our newest story, *The Boy in the Striped Pajamas* by John Boyne, will bring to light events from the Holocaust. As with our past books, we have enjoyed many interesting moments in class discussing predictions, themes, and symbols. This novel will present the grim historical period from a child's perspective.

Finally, the eighth grade has recently concluded creating a Social Studies PowerPoint on a United States president of their choice. Presentations will begin shortly. This information is relevant as we have spent this year covering the events from the Civil War to WWII, our current topic. We will continue through the remaining decades to present time. We strive to keep current on the issues that face our government today, knowing we are the future voters of tomorrow.

Each student and teacher remains committed to be their "best self" in the service of their class and school. Please keep each of us in your prayers as we learn to "live in Christ."

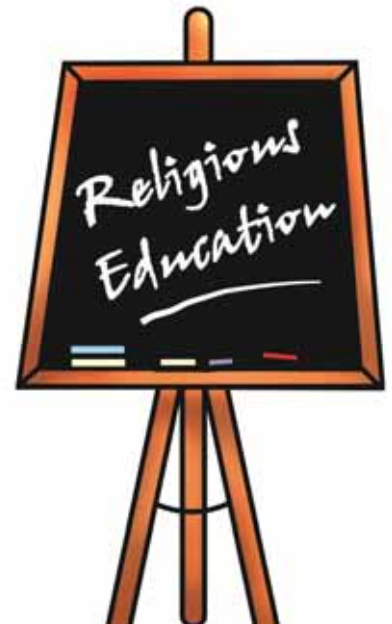

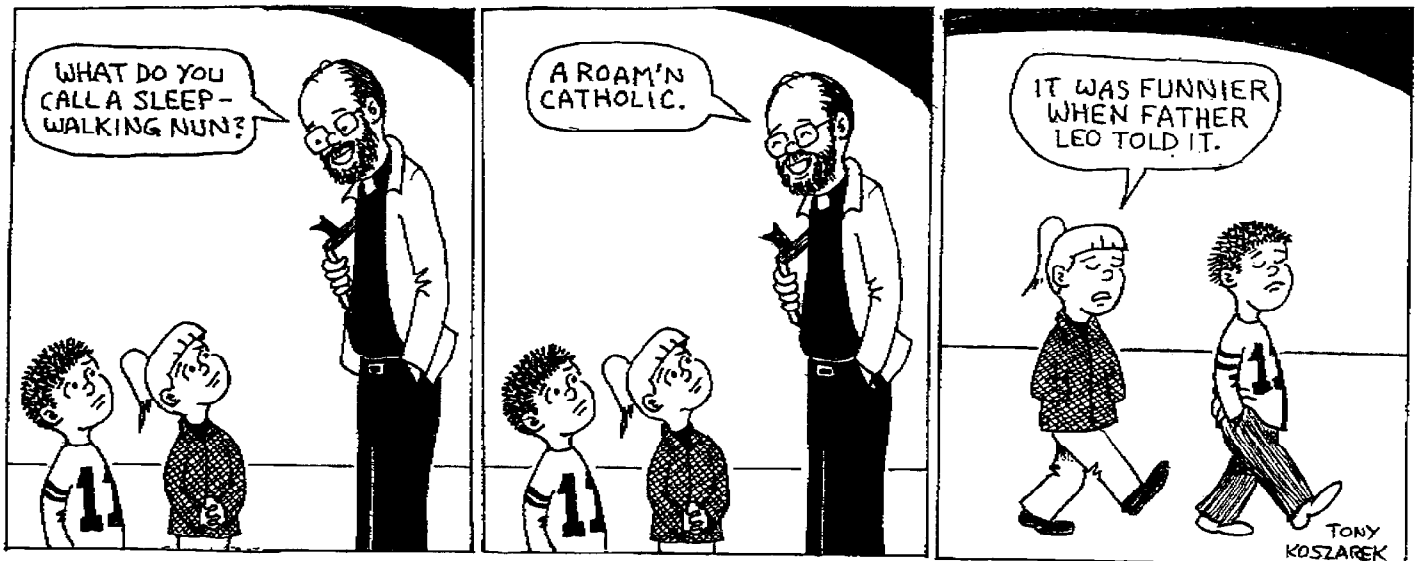
