## Getter from our Pastor

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,
The $4^{\text {th }}$ Sunday of Easter is also known as Good Shepherd Sunday as the Gospel proclaimed each year speaks on that theme. It's a powerful message and reminder, both to the flock and to those who share in the shepherding as priests. There's a tremendous love and humility with Christ identifying Himself with the role of shepherd and how deeply He cares; to the point that He lays down His life for the flock.
