We are called and sent by Christ to live gratefully the life God has given us and to proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ. In the spirit of faith, service, and community, we strive to bring people closer together and closer to God through his son our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

Anointing of the Sick

For emergencies call: 732-739-7309. This sacrament is given for those facing serious illness or surgery, and for those of advanced years. If you or a family member is planning to enter the hospital, please see one of the priests following Mass if you would like to receive this sacrament.

Baptism

The Church shares the joy of families in the birth of children and with their parents takes seriously the responsibility of bringing them up in the faith. Parents seeking baptism for their children are to attend a baptismal preparation class held the second Monday of every other month at 7 p.m. Baptisms are held the 2nd and 4th Sunday of the month at 12:30 p.m. by appointment. Parents should be registered members of the parish. Godparents, those who represent the Church in the life of the child, must have received all of their sacraments, and if married, marriage must have been in the Catholic Church. Please choose godparents with these criteria in mind.

Marriage

This great sacrament of vocation is a very joyous time, but also a time of very serious spiritual preparation. The bishops of New Jersey have adopted a policy to assist in this preparation. Attendance at Engaged Encounter, Pre-Cana, or another approved marriage preparation program; and individual sessions with a priest or deacon are required of all couples. Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the intended marriage, and before finalizing other details of the wedding.

R.C.I.A.

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is a learning process introducing adults to the Catholic faith resulting in Baptism, Communion, and Confirmation. For more information, contact the Faith Formation Office.



First Reading: 2 Kings 4:42-44

A man brought twenty loaves of bread to Elisha the prophet, who told his servant to distribute it to the people. The servant asked how he could offer twenty loaves to one hundred people. Elisha replied that God had said, "They shall eat and there shall be some left over." After all the people had eaten, there was bread left over as God had said.

Second Reading: Ephesians 4:1-6

Paul implores the Ephesians to live a life worthy of their calling by preserving unity among all of Christ's followers. He reminds them that there is one body, one Spirit, and one God who works through all people.

Gospel: John 6:1-15

Jesus fed a crowd of five thousand people with five loaves of bread and a couple of dried fish. After everyone present had enough to eat, twelve baskets of leftover bread were collected. Jesus then realized the people would want to make him king so he fled alone.

World Day of Prayer for the Elderly, July 28



The World Day for Elderly and Grandparents was instituted by Pope Francis in 2020, amid the COVID-19 pandemic, which disproportionately impacted the elderly and left many isolated from family and lonely as a result of social distancing and lockdown requirements.

This year, on the occasion of the fourth edition of the event, the Vatican's Apostolic Penitentiary has offered plenary indulgences to those who participate "in order to increase the devotion of the faithful and for the salvation of souls," according to a statement from the Penitentiary published July 18.

The indulgence, the statement said, is granted "to grandparents, the elderly and all the faithful who, motivated by a true spirit of penance and charity, will participate...in the various functions that will be held throughout the world, a Plenary Indulgence that may also be applied as a suffrage to the souls in purgatory."

Faithful who wish to obtain an indulgence must fulfill the "usual conditions," which include going to Confession in a spirit of true repentance, receiving the Eucharist and praying for the intentions of the pope.

Indulgences obtained by faithful, rather than being applied to oneself, may also be offered "as a suffrage" for souls in purgatory.

The Penitentiary in its statement said the indulgence is also offered to faithful to devote "adequate time" to visiting, either virtually or in person, elderly persons who are in need or who are experiencing difficulty, such as the sick, disabled, and lonely.

A plenary indulgence may also be obtained by elderly and sick persons themselves, as well as all those who are unable to leave their homes for serious reasons, but who spiritually unite themselves to the events of the World Day for Elderly and Grandparents, "provided that they detach themselves from any sins and intend to fulfill the three usual conditions as soon as possible."

You may also drop it off to our church **FAITH FORMATION** office (rear of church, first door on walkway, large parking lot) see registration times below. **CLOSED FRIDAYS.**

NEW REGISTRANTS

To register NEW STUDENTS in our faith formation program, the following requirements must be met:

- 1. Family <u>MUST</u> first be registered in Holy Family parish, at the rectory.
- **2.** Registration (**in person**) at the Faith Formation office (under the church).
- 3. Copy of baptismal certificate for each child (even if baptized at Holy Family).
- 4. A non-refundable registration fee as stated below for each child.

REGISTRATION FEE: JULY 16 - AUGUST 31, 2024

1 CHILD \$ 280.00 2 CHILDREN \$ 380.00 3 OR MORE CHILDREN \$420.00

- 5. A referral letter (proof of attendance) is required from a former parish for students transferring to our parish.
- 6. Third grade through eighth grade must, also, present proof of other sacraments they have made.
- 7. The normal time to begin faith formation is the year your child begins **first grade**.




