
Preparation for the sacraments of First Reconciliation/First Eucharist and Confirmation is a two-year process. Children in 1st, 2nd, 7th, and 8th grades are required to attend in person. If the child has not completed the 1st or 7th grade, they will be placed in that class this year and advance the following year.

Our preference is for children to attend class in person. However, we do offer the option of home schooling for grades 3, 4, 5, and 6.

The photo above is the first international Shrine in the Philippines, and the first Marian Shrine in Asia and sixth in the world. According to a study, hundreds of thousands of people visit Our Lady of Peace and Good Voyage in Antipolo City (north east of Manila) to attend Mass, pray for their family and loved ones, and request their vehicles to be blessed. I loved to go to this Shrine because it is within 2 ¹/₂ to 3 miles from our seminary (*Alagad ni Maria* – Disciples of Mary). In my seminary days, I used to stop by and pray and just sit quietly meditating on Jesus Christ. This Shrine is also special to me because I was ordained as a deacon at this beautiful location.

THE NATIONAL SHRINE OF OUR MOTHER OF PERPETUAL HELP IN THE PHILIPPINES

Another church that I loved to visit was the **National Shrine of Our Mother of Perpetual Help**, also known as the **Redemptorist Church** and colloquially as **Baclaran**



Church. The photo above was taken during the one of the many Masses and liturgical services this Shrine. The church enshrines the powerful icon of Our Mother of

Perpetual Help, and is one of the largest Marian churches in the Philippines. Filipinos loved our Blessed Mother Mary, and the devotion to Our Mother of Perpetual Help is very popular amongst us, Filipino Catholics, who flood the church on Wednesdays to attend Mass and pray the Novena of Our Mother of Perpetual Help.

BAPTISM INFORMATION

Are you planning to have your child baptized? Have you been asked to be a godparent for baptism? Here are some things you need to know.

Baptisms are held on the **2nd and 3rd Sundays** of the month at **1:30pm**.

To begin the process, parents of children to be baptized must call the office to register for a Baptism class held on the 3rd Monday of each month at 7pm in the Parish Life Center. The next class is September 19th. Please call the office to register.

After completing the class, parents must submit the Baptism class certificate, a completed Baptism Request Form (given out at class or printed from the website), a copy of the child's birth certificate, a letter of eligibility for each godparent (see below), and \$75 (checks payable to St. Simon Stock) to Patti at the Parish Office.

Godparent Letter of Eligibility must be obtained from the Catholic parish where they are now registered.

Letter of Eligibility

(to be a godparent or confirmation sponsor)

If you have been asked to be a godparent or sponsor for someone receiving the sacrament of Confirmation and you are a registered parishioner of St. Simon Stock, you:

must be at least 16 years of age;

must be a registered parishioner and a practicing Catholic;

must have received Baptism, First Communion, and Confirmation; and

if married, must have been married in a Catholic church ceremony.

At least two weeks before the letter of eligibility is needed, introduce yourself to the priest after Mass and tell them that you need a letter of eligibility. Father will tell you to call the office to schedule an appointment with him to discuss your Catholic responsibilities as godparent or sponsor, and to sign the Letter.

The current Pastor of Saint John the Evangelist, **John Patrick Connors**, formerly a priest of the Diocese of Camden, was dismissed from the clerical state and is currently under censure of excommunication for the crime of schism (c. 1364 §1 of Code of Canon Law) due to his affiliation with a community not in full communion with the Catholic Church, functioning as a priest for the Old Catholic Church, as declared by the Holy Father on September 21, 2018.
