### **PASTOR'S MESSAGE**


### Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,





### January: Dedicated to the Holy Name of Jesus

The Catholic Church has dedicated each month of the year to a particular devotion. For January, it is the Holy Name of Jesus. The choice of January for this devotion is linked to the Feast of the Circumcision of Christ, which used to be celebrated on January 1st, eight days after Christmas, in keeping with Jewish custom. This was when Jesus was officially given His name, which in Hebrew means "God Saves." The Feast of the Holy Name of Jesus celebrated on January 3<sup>rd</sup>, further confirms this dedication. This feast was initially granted to the Franciscans in 1530 and has since spread throughout the Church. It serves as an opportunity for the faithful to express love and reverence for the Holy Name, and also as a reminder of the power and sanctity of Jesus' name, which should always be spoken and heard with profound love, respect, and reverence.

Strive to live a life that reflects the virtues of the name of Jesus, recalling the meaning of His name as Savior and His invitation to participate in the saving work of His Passion. 
