The Baptism of the Lord – January 11, 2026

The Feast of Our Lord's Baptism is an appropriate time to reflect on our own practice of Baptism. It has been asked of us Catholics, why we persist in the practice of Infant Baptism? The concern is that we seem to be forcing religion on someone who hasn't asked for it. Our response might well be, why do you feed, clothe, house or educate your children? After all, they didn't ask for these things.

As parents give good things to their children, Baptism is the ultimate good. It is the entrance into God's family or initiation into God's saving grace. Our Lord makes clear in John's gospel that nobody enters heaven without Baptism (Jn 3:5). Also, He is very strict with the Apostles that they are to let the children come to Him (Mt 19:14). Nowhere in the pages of Sacred Scripture do we read of children being turned away from the faith, but rather, the opposite seems to occur. In Acts 16 we read that by St. Paul's preaching Lydia was converted and that she and her household were baptized. And later, in the same chapter, we read that the Philippian jailer whom Paul and Silas converted was baptized with "all his family." Then, in the first letter to the Corinthians, Paul recalls that he baptized the household of Stephanas (1 Cor 1:16). Unlike our modern experience, most households and families of the world include children. Why else would **all** the churches established by Apostles (e.g., Coptic, Greek, Melkite, Syriac, Armenian, Maronite ...) practice this custom, if in fact, waiting for a child to reach the age of reason was so important to receive the sacrament?

This unbroken apostolic tradition of baptizing infants finds its roots in imitating Apostles and in the practice of charity. It expresses the desire to have every child grow up with the benefits of God's grace as soon as possible. There are even stories from the lives of the saints where this was such a concern that we read of mothers who were not even at the Baptism of their child because they were still home recuperating from the birth. Outside of an emergency we wouldn't plan things like this today, but then again, we don't face the infant mortality rates that many of our ancestors did.

Although through our participation in the Baptism we are granted the power of sanctifying grace to separate us from Original Sin, combat concupiscence, and exercise powerful virtues like faith, it isn't magic. I can't run down the sidewalks of Middleburg with a squirt gun filled with Holy Water and declare Christian all those that I shoot. This random act of benediction would lack faith or desire. Nevertheless, God meets us where we are. Since, an infant doesn't have the faith or even the capacity to ask for it, the parents, who have the right to speak for the child in all other matters, provide it. The Church is counting on the parents to evangelize their children.

The Church doesn't leave them alone on this task. There are years of catechism class that the parish provides and the requirement that they get some help, that is, godparents. Godparents shouldn't just be friends or family members, but rather, persons actively involved in living the Catholic faith. Would a baseball team hire a first base coach who didn't like baseball, or worse, wouldn't even play ball?

We all need examples, advocates and inspirations. Human beings, unlike animals, don't have strong instincts to help us survive, rather we have human community to help us along. The same is true for eternal life and the practice of the faith. Please, contact me with any questions that you have about baptizing your children.

Speaking of ongoing formation. Our parish has paid for us to plug into FORMED. It is a subscription based online platform filled with over 4,000 Catholic studies, movies, audio dramas, talks, e-books, and even cartoons.

Much of FORMED's content is available in both English and Spanish. And you can enjoy FORMED on your computer or on your television with a Roku device or Apple TV. You can even listen on your phone as you commute to work or do chores. I just took some time to get it running on my Apple TV and phone. It was relatively simple. I'm sure that your regular household teenager could take care of it for you in a snap. Watching more media is a New Year's resolution that we ought to be able to achieve.

El Mensaje del Párroco

El Bautismo del Señor - 11 de enero, 2026

La Fiesta del Bautismo de Nuestro Señor es un momento apropiado para reflexionar sobre nuestra propia práctica del Bautismo. Se nos ha preguntado a los católicos, ¿por qué tenemos la costumbre del Bautismo Infantil? La preocupación es que parece que estamos forzando la religión a alguien que no la ha pedido. Nuestra respuesta bien podría ser, ¿por qué alimentas, vistes, albergas o educas a tus hijos? Después de todo, ellos no pidieron estas cosas.

Así como los padres dan cosas buenas a sus hijos, el Bautismo es el bien supremo. Es la entrada en la familia de Dios o la iniciación en la gracia salvadora de Dios. Nuestro Señor deja claro en el evangelio de Juan que nadie entra en el cielo sin el bautismo (Jn 3,5). Además, es muy estricto con los Apóstoles para que dejen que los niños se acerquen a Él (Mt 19,14). En ninguna parte de las páginas de la Sagrada Escritura leemos que los niños sean apartados de la fe, sino que parece ocurrir lo contrario. En los Hechos de los Apóstoles 16 leemos que por la predicación de San Pablo Lidia se convirtió y que ella y su casa fueron bautizados. Y más adelante, en el mismo capítulo, leemos que el carcelero de Filipos, a quien Pablo y Silas convirtieron, fue bautizado con “toda su familia”. Luego, en la primera carta a los Corintios, Pablo recuerda que bautizó a la casa de Estéfanas (1 Cor 1,16). A diferencia de nuestra experiencia moderna, la mayoría de los hogares y familias del mundo incluyen niños. ¿Por qué otra razón todas las iglesias establecidas por los Apóstoles (p. ej., copta, griega, melquita, siríaca, armenia, maronita...) practicarían esta costumbre, si, de hecho, esperar a que un niño alcanzara la edad de la razón era tan importante para recibir el sacramento?

Esta tradición apostólica ininterrumpida de bautizar a los niños tiene sus raíces en la imitación de los Apóstoles y en la práctica de la caridad. Expresa el deseo de que todo niño crezca en los primeros momentos con los beneficios de la gracia de Dios. Incluso hay historias de la vida de los santos donde esto era tan preocupante que leemos de madres que ni siquiera asistieron al bautismo de su hijo porque aún estaban en casa recuperándose del parto. Salvo en una emergencia, hoy en día no planificaríamos cosas así, pero claro, no nos enfrentamos a las tasas de mortalidad infantil que muchos de nuestros antepasados sufrieron.

Aunque mediante nuestra participación en el Bautismo se nos concede el poder de la gracia santificante para separarnos del Pecado Original, combatir la concupiscencia y ejercitar virtudes poderosas como la fe, no es magia. No puedo correr por las aceras de Middleburg con una pistola de agua llena de agua bendita y declarar cristianos a todos aquellos a quienes dispare. Este acto aleatorio de bendición carecería de fe o deseo. Sin embargo, Dios nos encuentra donde estamos. Dado que un bebé no tiene la fe ni siquiera la capacidad de pedirla, los padres, quienes tienen el derecho de hablar por el niño en todos los demás asuntos, se la proporcionan. La Iglesia cuenta con los padres para evangelizar a sus hijos.

La Iglesia no los deja solos en esta tarea. Hay años de clase de catequesis que da la parroquia y el requisito de que consigan alguna ayuda, es decir, padrinos. Los padrinos no deben ser solo amigos o familiares, sino personas activamente involucradas en vivir la fe católica. ¿Contrataría un equipo de béisbol a un entrenador de primera base al que no le gustara el béisbol o, peor aún, que ni siquiera jugaría a la pelota?

Todos necesitamos ejemplos, defensores e inspiraciones. Los seres humanos, a diferencia de los animales, no tenemos instintos fuertes para ayudarnos a sobrevivir, sino que tenemos una comunidad humana para ayudarnos. Lo mismo es cierto para la vida eterna y la práctica de la fe. Por favor, contácteme con cualquier pregunta que tenga sobre el bautismo de sus hijos.
