Bishop Michael F. Burbidge's Statement on Human Dignity and the Threat of a Virginia Constitutional Amendment to the Human Right to Life

First Thursday of Ordinary Time
January 15, 2026

As the Church in America marks "A Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children" on Thursday, January 22, it is fitting to consider the importance of our commitment to the protection of every human life from conception to natural death.

Sacred Scripture reminds us that every human life is known, loved, and willed by God. "Before I formed you in the womb, I knew you" (Jeremiah 1:5). This truth stands at the heart of the Gospel of Life and compels us to defend those who cannot defend themselves, to accompany those who suffer, and to witness to a culture rooted in love, mercy, and hope.

On the Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children, we remember with solemn hearts the countless lives lost to abortion since the U.S. Supreme Court's disastrous *Roe v. Wade* decision and entrust them to God's infinite love and mercy. We will continue to pray and to work for the day when the scourge of abortion has been eradicated in American life and when all human persons are protected in law and welcomed in love.

Pope Leo XIV recently underscored the "priceless gift" of human life, noting that the Church will always "categorically reject any practice that denies or exploits the origin of life and its development." The Holy Father called upon nations and their leaders to recognize that their "primary objective must remain the protection of every unborn child and the effective and concrete support of every woman so that she is able to welcome life".

This year, because of the looming threat of an extreme abortion amendment to our state constitution, the Gospel of Life and our call to witness are particularly imperative. The Virginia General Assembly convenes from January 14 through March 15. During this session, we face serious legislative proposals that threaten the dignity of human life at its most vulnerable stages. Among these is the resolution to amend the state constitution in a way that will enshrine abortion up to the very moment of birth, along with the potential removal of parental involvement in minors' decisions regarding abortion and gender-rejecting medical interventions. Additionally, there is the possibility of legislation that would legalize and effectively promote suicide by a physician, placing at risk the elderly, the

disabled, and those who suffer from serious illness or despair.

These threats to the Commonwealth of Virginia are serious and would represent a serious moral and social regression. These threats would contribute to a cultural mentality that views human life as disposable when others are dependent, experiencing treatable forms of suffering, or are simply seen as inconvenient. Our response as Catholics—and as citizens committed to justice—must be rooted in faith, truth, and love.

For this reason, I once again invite the faithful of the Catholic Diocese of Arlington to pray, fast, and advocate for the cause of life. Prayer opens our hearts to God's wisdom and strengthens us to act with courage and charity. Fasting makes reparation for sin and reminds us that true freedom is found not in self-indulgence, but in self-gift. Advocacy allows us to bring our convictions into the public square with respect, clarity, and perseverance.

At the same time, it is essential to reaffirm a truth that lies at the very center of the Church's pro-life mission: the Church is a loving mother. To any man or woman who carries the pain, regret, or sorrow of participation in abortion, know this clearly— you are not alone, and God awaits you with love and mercy. The Church desires to walk with you on a journey of healing and hope. Through confidential, non-judgmental ministries such as Project Rachel After Abortion Care and other pastoral resources, we seek to offer compassion, understanding, and the reassurance that God's mercy is greater than any of our failings.

Our commitment to the sanctity of human life extends far beyond opposition to abortion or assisted suicide. It includes support for expectant mothers in need, accompaniment of families, the education of children, care for the sick and elderly, defense of the disabled, and the creation of communities where every person is welcomed, protected, and cherished. When we embrace human life in all its stages, we reflect the heart of Christ, who came that all might have life and have it abundantly.

As we begin this new year, I ask you to join me in renewing our commitment to the Gospel of Life. May we together pray fervently, act courageously, and serve generously. May our witness help build a culture in Virginia—and beyond—that recognizes every human life as sacred, every person as beloved, and every moment as an opportunity to choose life.

El Mensaje del Párroco

III domingo del tiempo ordinario – 25 de enero, 2026

Declaración del obispo Michael F. Burbidge sobre la dignidad humana y la amenaza de una enmienda constitucional de Virginia al derecho humano a la vida

Primer jueves del tiempo ordinario
16 de enero de 2026

Mientras la Iglesia en Estados Unidos conmemora el “Día de oración por la protección legal de los niños no nacidos” el jueves 22 de enero, es apropiado considerar la importancia de nuestro compromiso con la protección de toda vida humana desde la concepción hasta la muerte natural.

La Sagrada Escritura nos recuerda que toda vida humana es conocida, amada y querida por Dios. «Antes de formarte en el vientre materno, te conocía» (Jeremías 1:5). Esta verdad está en el corazón del Evangelio de la Vida y nos impulsa a defender a quienes no pueden defenderse, a acompañar a quienes sufren y a dar testimonio de una cultura arraigada en el amor, la misericordia y la esperanza.

En el Día de Oración por la Protección Legal de los Niños No Nacidos, recordamos con solemnidad las innumerables vidas perdidas a causa del aborto desde la desastrosa decisión de la Corte Suprema de Estados Unidos en el caso *Roe v. Wade*, y las encomendamos al infinito amor y misericordia de Dios. Seguiremos orando y trabajando por el día en que la lacra del aborto sea erradicada de la vida estadounidense y todas las personas sean protegidas por la ley y acogidas con amor.

El Papa León XIV subrayó recientemente el don inestimable de la vida humana, señalando que la Iglesia siempre rechazará categóricamente cualquier práctica que niegue o explote el origen de la vida y su desarrollo. El Santo Padre instó a las naciones y a sus líderes a reconocer que su objetivo primordial debe seguir siendo la protección de todo feto y el apoyo efectivo y concreto a cada mujer para que pueda acoger la vida.

Este año, ante la inminente amenaza de una enmienda radical a la constitución estatal que prohíba el aborto, el Evangelio de la Vida y nuestro llamado a dar testimonio son particularmente imperativos. La Asamblea General de Virginia se reúne del 14 de enero al 15 de marzo. Durante esta sesión, nos enfrentamos a serias propuestas legislativas que amenazan la dignidad de la vida humana en sus etapas más vulnerables. Entre ellas se encuentra la resolución para enmendar la constitución estatal de forma que consagre el aborto hasta el momento del nacimiento, junto con la posible eliminación de la participación de los padres en las decisiones de los menores sobre el aborto y las intervenciones médicas que rechazan el género. Además, existe la posibilidad de una legislación que legalice y promueva eficazmente el suicidio por parte de un médico, poniendo en riesgo a las personas mayores, las personas con discapacidad y quienes padecen enfermedades graves o están desesperadas.

Estas amenazas a la Mancomunidad de Virginia son graves y representarían una grave regresión moral y social. Estas amenazas contribuirían a una mentalidad cultural que considera la vida humana como algo desechable mientras que otros son dependientes, sufren formas tratables de sufrimiento o simplemente se consideran inconvenientes. Nuestra respuesta como católicos —y como ciudadanos comprometidos con la justicia— debe basarse en la fe, la verdad y el amor.

Por esta razón, invito una vez más a los fieles de la Diócesis Católica de Arlington a orar, ayunar y defender la causa de la vida. La oración abre nuestros corazones a la sabiduría de Dios y nos fortalece para actuar con valentía y caridad. El ayuno repara el pecado y nos recuerda que la verdadera libertad no reside en la autocomplacencia, sino en la entrega. Defender la causa nos permite llevar nuestras convicciones a la esfera pública con respeto, claridad y perseverancia.

Al mismo tiempo, es esencial reafirmar una verdad que yace en el centro mismo de la misión provida de la Iglesia: la Iglesia es una madre amorosa. A cualquier hombre o mujer que cargue con el dolor, el arrepentimiento o la tristeza de haber participado en un aborto, tenga esto claro: no está solo, y Dios lo espera con amor y misericordia. La Iglesia desea acompañarlo en un camino de sanación y esperanza. A través de ministerios confidenciales y sin prejuicios, como el Proyecto Raquel, Atención Postaborto y otros recursos pastorales, buscamos ofrecer compasión, comprensión y la seguridad de que la misericordia de Dios es mayor que cualquiera de nuestras fallas.

Nuestro compromiso con la santidad de la vida humana va mucho más allá de la oposición al aborto o al suicidio asistido. Incluye el apoyo a las mujeres embarazadas necesitadas, el acompañamiento a las familias, la educación de los niños, el cuidado de los enfermos y los ancianos, la defensa de las personas con discapacidad y la creación de comunidades donde cada persona sea acogida, protegida y apreciada. Al acoger la vida humana en todas sus etapas, reflejamos el corazón de Cristo, quien vino para que todos tengan vida y la tengan en abundancia.

Al comenzar este nuevo año, les pido que se unan a mí para renovar nuestro compromiso con el Evangelio de la Vida. Que juntos oremos con fervor, actuemos con valentía y sirvamos con generosidad. Que nuestro testimonio ayude a construir una cultura en Virginia —y más allá— que reconozca cada vida humana como sagrada, cada persona como amada y cada momento como una oportunidad para elegir la vida.

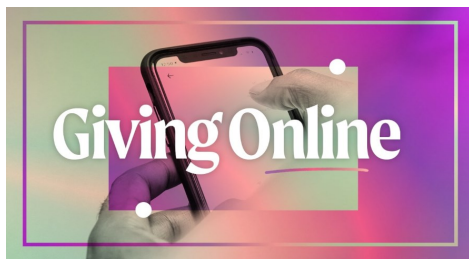
