Background on Mass Intentions

Whenever a priest celebrates Mass, he has at least two specific intentions. The first intention is to celebrate the Mass according to what the rubrics that the Church was provided for how to say the Mass. The second is to apply the grace of that Mass toward a specific need or intention. As to the first intention, a priest may find it helpful to pray a traditional prayer while he is vesting, stating his intention to pray the Mass well. As to the second intention, commonly called “the intention of the Mass,” that intention is often announced in the parish bulletin at least one week before, and then it is sometimes also announced at Mass.

These special intentions are offered to God as prayers of intercession and thanksgiving. In and through the Eucharist, we pray for the deceased, for those who are ill, for those who face various difficulties or challenges. Often, people request a Mass in thanksgiving for God’s grace helping them through a particularly challenging time of life. It is important to note that, while the graces of the Mass being infinite, many intentions can be offered up at a single Mass. While a priest may only accept one intention at a single Mass, he may have many other intentions not attached to an offering.

In addition, the faithful may bring their own intentions to the Mass, which they each carry privately and place upon the altar spiritually in prayer.

PASTOR'S PIECE

III Sunday of Easter – April 19, 2026

The Lord is risen! Alleluia!

He is risen, indeed! Alleluia! Alleluia!

The cultural norms of our time equate familiarity with casualness. We think that the more familiar we are with somebody the more we can let our hair down. Our manner of dress reflects this. This can be a big relief amid the many social expectations that we have.

Admittedly it is a pleasant experience when Bishop Burbidge invites us priest to gather a few times a year in this same spirit. Clerical garb is put aside for a more laid-back fraternal gathering.

It seems only natural then to apply this same comportment to the Lord. If we have taken to heart the admonition to accept Jesus in our heart as a personal Lord and Savior, then who could be more intimate than He? Being familiar with the Lord and on intimate terms with Him should be our goal as disciples. Yet, does our cultural norm of having a casual style with our familiars apply to our relationship with Him?

Many faithful and sincere Christians do think that. Judging by what I see on YouTube, it seems that the more Evangelical Pastors are opting for tee shirts and jeans when leading prayer. It might just reflect contemporary norms, but I'm sure that the sincerely believe that this is a more effective way of leading souls to have a more personal and intimate relationship with the Lord. But is this the manner of dress of those who were known intimates of the Lord?

"So the disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It is the Lord." When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he tucked in his garment, for he was lightly clad, and jumped into the sea."
(Jn 21:7)

This is wonderful passage of the resurrected Lord encountering the disciples amid their bewilderment. In the time after the Resurrection, the Lord is sporadically and mysteriously appearing to them. As is

understandable that St. Peter returns to what he knows and leads a group back to the sea to go fishing. It is there that once more the Lord mysteriously appears to them. He calls out to them from the seashore to cast their nets to the other side of the boat for a catch of fish. At the miraculous catch, they realize the man on the shore barking out helpful suggestions is the Lord.

Peter acts quickly, *he tucked in his garment, for he was **lightly clad**, and jumped into the sea.* In the Latin we read that he was naked. He had probably stripped down to his briefs to haul in the wet fishing nets. He is one hundred yards offshore and is eager to get to the Lord as fast as he can. It stands to reason that jumping in the water with his shorts on, to swim a hundred yards in the early morning sea, in order to meet up with a close friend would be a fine excuse to arrive casually. Yet, that is not what he does.

Counterintuitively for our contemporary American practices, he dresses up. He puts on clothing tantamount to a robe to jump into the water for a hundred-yard swim in the dark, where he intended to meet up on the shore with a man Who knows him better than anybody. Peter, without thinking, opted to put his life at risk, or at least slow his swim down, to then sit in a wet robe on the seashore in the early morning hours, rather than be comfortable and quicker.

If our objective is the Lord, His friends reveal a different practice than our contemporary style. We make ourselves presentable for Mass because we realize Who we are coming to encounter. Leave the flipflops and sweatpants at home, you have an audience with the King of Kings.

El Mensaje del Párroco

III domingo de Pascua - 19 de abril, 2026

¡El Señor ha resucitado! ¡Aleluya!
¡Él ha resucitado! ¡Aleluya! ¡Aleluya!

Las normas culturales de nuestra época equiparan la familiaridad con la informalidad. Creemos que cuanto más familiarizados estamos con alguien, más podemos relajarnos. Nuestra forma de vestir refleja esto. Esto puede ser un gran alivio en medio de las numerosas expectativas sociales que tenemos. Sin duda, es una experiencia agradable cuando el obispo Monseñor Burbidge nos invita a los sacerdotes a reunirnos varias veces al año con este mismo espíritu. Dejamos de lado la vestimenta clerical para una reunión fraternal más relajada.

Parece natural, entonces, aplicar este mismo comportamiento al Señor. Si hemos tomado en serio la exhortación de aceptar a Jesús en nuestro corazón como nuestro Señor y Salvador personal, ¿quién podría ser más íntimo que Él? Familiarizarnos con el Señor y tener una relación íntima con Él debería ser nuestra meta como discípulos. Sin embargo, ¿se aplica nuestra norma cultural de tener un estilo informal con nuestros conocidos a nuestra relación con Él?

Muchos cristianos fieles y sinceros piensan así. A juzgar por lo que veo en YouTube, parece que los pastores evangélicos optan por camisetas y vaqueros al dirigir la oración. Puede que simplemente refleje las normas contemporáneas, pero estoy seguro de que muchos creen sinceramente que esta es una forma más eficaz de guiar a las personas a tener una relación más personal e íntima con el Señor. En cualquier caso, ¿era esta la forma de vestir de quienes eran conocidos como personas íntimas del Señor?

“El discípulo al que Jesús amaba dio a Pedro: «¡Es el Señor!». Cuando Simón Pedro oyó que era el Señor, se ciñó la túnica, que era lo único que llevaba puesto, y se tiró al agua”. (Jn 21:7)

Este es un pasaje maravilloso donde el Señor resucitado se encuentra con los discípulos en medio de su desconcierto. Después de la Resurrección, el Señor se les aparece de forma esporádica y misteriosa. Es comprensible que San Pedro regrese a lo que mejor sabe hacer y guíe a un grupo de vuelta al mar para pescar. Allí, una vez más, el Señor se les aparece misteriosamente. Los llama

desde la orilla para que echen las redes al otro lado de la barca y pesquen. Al presenciar la pesca milagrosa, se dan cuenta de que el hombre en la orilla que les gritaba consejos útiles es el Señor.

Pedro actúa con rapidez, *se ciñó la túnica, que era lo único que llevaba puesto, y se tiró al agua*. En latín leemos que estaba desnudo. Probablemente se había quitado la ropa hasta quedarse en calzoncillos para recoger las redes de pesca mojadas. Se encuentra a cien metros de la costa y ansía llegar al Señor lo más rápido posible. Es lógico pensar que saltar al agua en calzoncillos, nadar cien metros en el mar al amanecer para encontrarse con un amigo cercano, sería una buena excusa para llegar con naturalidad. Sin embargo, no es eso lo que hace.

Contrariamente a nuestras costumbres estadounidenses contemporáneas, él se viste mejor. Se pone una prenda casi como una túnica para lanzarse al agua y nadar cien metros en la oscuridad, donde pretendía encontrarse en la orilla con un hombre que lo conoce mejor que nadie. Pedro, sin pensarlo, optó por arriesgar su vida, o al menos ralentizar su nado, para luego sentarse en la orilla del mar con una túnica mojada en las primeras horas de la mañana, en lugar de estar cómodo y nadar más rápido.

Si nuestro objetivo es el Señor, sus amigos revelan una práctica distinta a la de nuestro estilo contemporáneo. Nos arreglamos para la Misa porque entendemos a quién vamos a encontrarnos. Tenemos una audiencia con el Rey de Reyes. Las chanclas y los pantalones deportivos deben quedarse en casa.

Este miércoles, el Padre Guilloux dirigirá un grupo a Richmond para abogar por los más vulnerables. Como saben, los defensores del aborto han trasladado sus esfuerzos a las capitales estatales. Debemos responder a sus esfuerzos con nuestras oraciones y votos. Además, podemos mostrar nuestro apoyo a nuestros representantes, quienes deben saber que los respaldamos cuando intentan defender legalmente la vida humana en el útero. 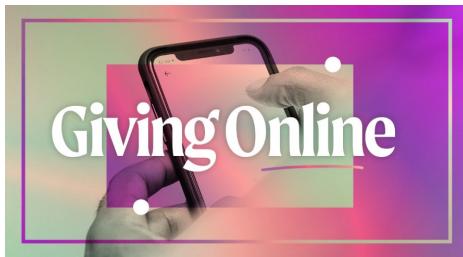
