PASTOR'S PIECE

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity – May 31, 2026

We are on the cusp of June, a month traditionally dedicated to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. We celebrate the Solemn Feast of the Sacred Heart June 12 this year. It is a movable feast always celebrated the third Friday after Pentecost. This year the feast is especially significant for our nation. In commemoration of our nation's 250th anniversary the United States Bishops have agreed to consecrate the nation to the Sacred Heart. What does that mean?

Part of devotion to the Sacred Heart is the act of consecrating persons, places (especially homes) and even nations to Jesus. Consecrating expresses the desire to be joined to the Lord and collaborate with His will. It also places one under the Lord's protection and patronage. The consecratory prayer usually includes displaying an image of the Lord's Sacred Heart where the consecration exists. Many of you may remember how Bishop Loverde consecrated our diocese in 2011. For our homes, He had images of the Sacred Heart printed and made available.

The image is so significant because it concisely conveys what no other religion has ever said. "Your obedience, devotion, and sacrifices are secondary to the loving friendship that I extend to you." God reveals His burning heart, ardently desiring us. The Heart is crowned with thorns and pierced showing the sacrifice He underwent to have this relationship. It is from this Heart that flows the water and blood, the means for us to join Him through the life of the Church in the Sacraments.

In 17th century France, the Lord appeared to Sister Margaret Mary Alacoque. He expressed a desire for this image to be shared because it pained Him to see so many turn from Him for fear or lack of appreciation. He had a list of promises for those who would participate in devotion to His Sacred Heart.

- (1) "I will give them all the graces necessary in their state of life.
- (2) I will establish peace in their homes.
- (3) I will comfort them in all their afflictions.
- (4) I will be their secure refuge during life, and above all, in death.
- (5) I will bestow abundant blessings upon all their undertakings.
- (6) Sinners will find in my Heart the source and infinite ocean of mercy.
- (7) Lukewarm souls shall become fervent.
- (8) Fervent souls shall quickly mount to high perfection.
- (9) I will bless every place in which an image of my Heart is exposed and honored.
- (10) I will give to priests the gift of touching the most hardened hearts.
- (11) Those who shall promote this devotion shall have their names written in my Heart.
- (12) I promise you in the excessive mercy of my Heart that my all-powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy Communion on the First Fridays in nine consecutive months the grace of final perseverance; they shall not die in my disgrace, nor without receiving their sacraments. My divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment."

How do we benefit from these promises? Receive Holy Communion on nine consecutive First Fridays. Go to Confession prior to these communions to ensure you are in a state of grace (if needed).

In addition, Jesus promised St. Margaret Mary Alacoque that He *"will bless the home in which the image of my Sacred Heart shall be exposed and honored."* You are encouraged to learn, pray, and prepare your hearts for the Enthronement of the Sacred Heart in your home. Our Legion of Mary can assist you with this too.

Why consecrate a nation? Maybe it is as basic as name giving. Anthropologists say that traditionally women agree that their children take the father's name because it is incentive for the father to offer support and protection for those he knows as his. God exercised a similar interest with key figures in Sacred Scripture: Abram – Abraham, Jacob – Israel, Saul – Paul, Simon – Peter, et al. The consecration, then, is a means to direct God's favor and protection on a people.

The history of this devotion comes with a cautionary tale. Through the visions given St. Margaret Mary in Paray-le-Monial, France, 1689. The Lord requested that King Louis XIV consecrate the nation to His Sacred Heart and place it on the royal coat of arms. Sadly, the king and his successors (Louis XV) ignored the request. Exactly 100 years to the day after the initial request (June 17, 1789), the French Revolution began. It is said that King Louis XVI consecrated the nation to the Sacred Heart from his jail cell. The uprising that took his life was characterized by bloodshed especially that towards religion.

In contrast our American Revolution enshrined religious freedom. Accordingly, in a wish to preserve and promote the faith, our American bishops invite us to join with them in a consecratory prayer that they will offer on our behalf June 11. In addition, you may find on their webpage (<https://www.usccb.org/sites/default/files/2026-02/Novena%20to%20the%20Sacred%20Heart%20Full.pdf>) a novena beginning June 3. We'll recite the prayer of consecration at both of our parochial Masses on Thursday, June 11.

El Mensaje del Párroco

Solemnidad de la Santísima Trinidad , 31 de mayo, 2026

Estamos a las puertas de junio, mes tradicionalmente dedicado al Sagrado Corazón de Jesús. Este año celebramos la Solemne Fiesta del Sagrado Corazón el 12 de junio. Es una fiesta móvil que siempre se celebra el tercer viernes después de Pentecostés. Este año, la fiesta tiene un significado especial para nuestra nación. En conmemoración del 250 aniversario de nuestra nación, los obispos de Estados Unidos han acordado consagrar la nación al Sagrado Corazón. ¿Qué significa esto?

Parte de la devoción al Sagrado Corazón es el acto de consagrar personas, lugares (especialmente hogares) e incluso naciones a Jesús. La consagración expresa el deseo de unirse al Señor y colaborar con su voluntad. También nos coloca bajo su protección y amparo. La oración consagratória suele incluir la exhibición de una imagen del Sagrado Corazón en el lugar consagrado. Muchos recordarán cómo el obispo Loverde consagró nuestra diócesis en 2011. Mandó imprimir imágenes del Sagrado Corazón para nuestros hogares y las puso a nuestra disposición.

La imagen es tan significativa porque transmite concisamente lo que ninguna otra religión ha dicho jamás: «Tu obediencia, devoción y sacrificios son secundarios a la amorosa amistad que los extiende». Dios revela su corazón ardiente, deseándonos con fervor. El Corazón está coronado de espinas y traspasado, mostrando el sacrificio que hizo para tener esta relación. Es de este Corazón de donde fluyen el agua y la sangre, los medios para unirnos a Él a través de la vida de la Iglesia en los Sacramentos.

En la Francia del siglo XVII, el Señor se apareció a sor Margarita María Alacoque. Expresó su deseo de que esta imagen fuera compartida, pues le dolía ver a tantos alejarse de Él por miedo o falta de aprecio. Tenía una lista de promesas para quienes participaran en la devoción a su Sagrado Corazón.

- (1) Les concederé todas las gracias necesarias en su estado de vida.
- (2) Estableceré la paz en sus hogares.
- (3) Los consolaré en todas sus aflicciones.
- (4) Seré su refugio seguro durante la vida y, sobre todo, en la muerte.
- (5) Bendeciré abundantemente todas sus empresas.
- (6) Los pecadores encontrarán en mi Corazón la fuente y el océano infinito de misericordia.
- (7) Las almas tibias se volverán fervientes.
- (8) Las almas fervientes alcanzarán rápidamente la perfección.
- (9) Bendeciré todo lugar donde se exponga y se honre una imagen de mi Corazón.
- (10) Daré a los sacerdotes el don de conmovier los corazones más endurecidos.
- (11) Quienes promuevan esta devoción tendrán sus nombres escritos en mi Corazón.
- (12) Les prometo, en la infinita misericordia de mi Corazón, que mi amor todopoderoso concederá a todos los que reciban la Sagrada Comunión los primeros viernes de nueve meses consecutivos la gracia de la salvación eterna. perseverancia; no morirán en mi desgracia, ni sin recibir sus sacramentos. Mi divino Corazón será su refugio seguro en este último momento.

¿Cómo nos beneficiamos de estas promesas? Reciba la Sagrada Comunión durante nueve Primeros Viernes consecutivos. Confiéese antes de estas comuniones para asegurarse de estar en estado de gracia (si es necesario).

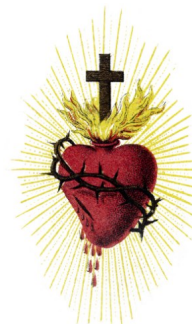
Además, Jesús le prometió a Santa Margarita María Alacoque que «bendeciría el hogar en el que se exponga y honre la imagen de mi Sagrado Corazón». Le animamos a informarse, orar y preparar su corazón para la Entronización del Sagrado Corazón en su hogar. Nuestra Legión de María también puede ayudarle con esto.

¿Por qué consagrar una nación? Quizás sea tan sencillo como dar un nombre. Los antropólogos afirman que, tradicionalmente, las mujeres acuerdan que sus hijos lleven el apellido del padre porque esto incentiva al padre a brindar apoyo y protección a quienes considera suyos. Dios mostró un interés similar con figuras clave de las Sagradas Escrituras: Abram (Abraham), Jacob (Israel), Saulo (Pablo), Simón (Pedro), entre otros. La consagración, entonces, es un medio para dirigir el favor y la protección de Dios hacia un pueblo.

La historia de esta devoción incluye una advertencia. A través de las visiones que recibió Santa Margarita María en Paray-le-Monial, Francia, en 1689, el Señor le pidió al rey Luis XIV que consagrara la nación a su Sagrado Corazón y lo colocara en el escudo real. Lamentablemente, el rey y sus sucesores (Luis XV) ignoraron la petición. Exactamente cien años después de la petición inicial (17 de junio de 1789), estalló la Revolución Francesa. Se dice que el rey Luis XVI consagró la nación al Sagrado Corazón desde su celda. El levantamiento que le costó la vida se caracterizó por el derramamiento de sangre, especialmente en lo que respecta a la religión.

En contraste, nuestra Revolución Americana consagró la libertad religiosa. Por consiguiente, con el deseo de preservar y promover la fe, nuestros obispos estadounidenses nos invitan a unirnos a ellos en una oración de consagración que ofrecerán por nosotros el 11 de junio. Además, en su página web (<https://www.usccb.org/sites/default/files/2026-02/Novena%20to%20the%20Sacred%20Heart%20Full.pdf>) encontrarán una novena que comienza el 3 de junio. Recitaremos la oración de consagración en nuestras dos misas parroquiales el jueves 11 de junio.

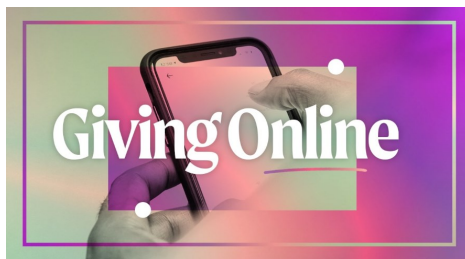
