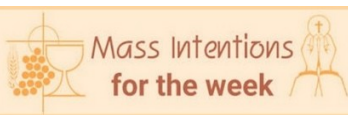

This Election Season is Different

August 2026

In Virginia, every year is an election year. However, the contents on the ballot this fall are anything but ordinary. In the upcoming election (Sept. 18 – Nov. 3), the decisions we make will shape the future of our Commonwealth in unprecedented ways. In addition to a U.S. Senate race and local Congressional races, Virginia voters will decide three proposed constitutional amendments with far-reaching consequences.

Two of the proposed changes to Virginia's constitution – Ballot Question 1 (abortion) and Ballot Question 2 (marriage) – concern fundamental matters of right and wrong.

Ballot Question 1 would cement a so-called “fundamental right” to abortion into our state constitution – all the way up to birth and for “every individual,” even children. It would endanger women's health and safety and even push parents out of life-changing and irreversible decisions for their minor daughters. It would shield “any individual” who assists in an abortion from legal consequences. When debating the language of the proposed constitutional amendment, legislators even rejected a proposal to require that any baby born alive after an attempted abortion would receive the same level of care and treatment as any other infant. Ballot Question 1 is extreme, dangerous, radical and horrific.

Ballot Question 2 would remove the definition of marriage as the “union between one man and one woman” from our constitution, and would replace it with “any lawful marriage between two adult persons.” We affirm the dignity of every person. We also proclaim the truth that marriage – created by God – is and will always be the union of a man and a woman. God's design for marriage – woven into the fabric of our being – was established before any nation, religion or law. We are called to honor and preserve it. The marital union – between a man and a woman who give themselves completely to each other – is a unique and irreplaceable bond that is the basis of the family and society.

God is the author of life and marriage. We must protect and preserve these extraordinary gifts from our Creator. As Catholics, we have a sacred duty to form our consciences prayerfully and correctly, and to vote NO on Ballot Question 1 and Ballot Question 2.

Ballot Question 3 would restore voting rights to individuals who have completed their time of incarceration. This issue is a matter of prudential judgment upon which people of goodwill can disagree. Through the work of the Virginia Catholic Conference, we have consistently supported this measure and continue to do so. In your own assessment of this proposal, we invite you to consider the Church's teaching on participation in the common good, rehabilitation, restoration, mercy and second chances – as well as times when you have witnessed God's redemptive work in your own life and the lives around you.

More information on the three ballot measures can be found on the websites of the Virginia Catholic Conference and our two dioceses. Early voting begins September 18. Election Day is November 3.

As the *Catechism* reminds us, “It is necessary that all participate ... in promoting the common good. ... As far as possible, citizens should take an active part in *public life*” (nos. 1913-1915). Through conscience formation, prayer and fasting, may we as Virginia voters all prepare to cast votes that will honor the gift of life and Jesus who is “the way and the truth and the life” (John 14:6).

Esta temporada electoral es diferente

Agosto de 2026

En Virginia, cada año es un año electoral. Sin embargo, el contenido de la boleta del otoño de este año es muy poco común. En la próxima elección (del 18 de septiembre al 3 de noviembre), las decisiones que tomemos determinarán el futuro de nuestro Estado de una forma sin precedentes. Además de las elecciones para el Senado de los Estados Unidos y el Congreso local, los votantes de Virginia decidirán sobre tres enmiendas constitucionales propuestas con consecuencias trascendentales.

Dos de los cambios propuestos a la Constitución de Virginia, a saber, la 1ª Pregunta de la boleta electoral (el aborto) y la 2ª Pregunta de la boleta electoral (el matrimonio) se refieren a conceptos fundamentales sobre lo correcto y lo incorrecto.

La 1ª Pregunta de la boleta electoral establecería el llamado “derecho fundamental” al aborto en nuestra Constitución estatal hasta el nacimiento y para “cada persona”, aun para los menores de edad. Esta enmienda pondría en peligro la salud y la seguridad de las mujeres y excluiría a los padres de las decisiones irreversibles y que cambian la vida de sus hijas menores. Protegería de consecuencias legales a “cualquier persona” que preste asistencia en un aborto. Al debatir la redacción de la enmienda constitucional propuesta, los legisladores rechazaron una propuesta para exigir que cualquier bebé nacido vivo después de un intento de aborto recibiera el mismo cuidado y tratamiento que cualquier otro bebé. La 1ª Pregunta de la boleta electoral es extrema, peligrosa, radical y horrorosa.

La 2ª Pregunta de la boleta electoral eliminaría de nuestra Constitución la definición de matrimonio como la “unión entre un hombre y una mujer” y la reemplazaría con “cualquier matrimonio legal entre dos personas adultas”. Afirmamos la dignidad de cada persona. También proclamamos la verdad de que el matrimonio, creado por Dios, es y siempre será la unión de un hombre y una mujer. El designio de Dios para el matrimonio, integrado en la esencia de nuestro ser, se estableció antes que cualquier nación, religión o ley. Somos llamados a honrarlo y a preservarlo. La unión conyugal entre un hombre y una mujer que se entregan por completo el uno al otro, es un vínculo único e irremplazable que es la base de la familia y la sociedad.

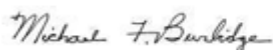
Dios es el autor de la vida y del matrimonio. Debemos proteger y preservar estos dones extraordinarios de Nuestro Creador. Como católicos, tenemos el deber sagrado de formar nuestra conciencia correctamente y en espíritu de oración y de votar NO por la 1ª Pregunta y la 2ª Pregunta de la boleta electoral.

La 3ª Pregunta de la boleta electoral restauraría los derechos de voto de las personas que han finalizado su período de encarcelamiento. Este asunto es cuestión de juicio prudente sobre el cual las personas de buena voluntad pueden estar en desacuerdo. Por medio del trabajo de la Conferencia Católica de Virginia, hemos apoyado constantemente y seguimos apoyando esta medida. En su propia evaluación de esta propuesta, los invitamos a considerar la enseñanza de la Iglesia sobre la participación en el bien común, la rehabilitación, la restauración, la misericordia y las segundas oportunidades, así como las veces que han presenciado el trabajo redentor de Dios en su vida y en la vida de quienes los rodean.

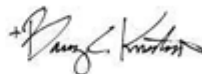

Como nos recuerda el *Catecismo*, “Es necesario que todos participen ... en promover el bien común. ... Los ciudadanos deben cuanto sea posible tomar parte activa en la *vida pública* (Nos. 1913-1915). Por medio de la formación de la conciencia, la oración y el ayuno, que todos nosotros como votantes de Virginia nos preparemos para emitir votos que honren el don de la vida y a Jesús que es “el camino, la verdad y la vida” (San Juan 14:6).

Middleburg FISH (For Instant and Sympathetic Help) is an all-volunteer, non-profit organization. We were founded in 1970 to provide short-term financial assistance to our less fortunate neighbors in Middleburg and surrounding areas.

Small but mighty, Middleburg FISH is dedicated to helping people meet emergencies and immediate needs. From Monday to Friday, we respond rapidly to requests for help with rent, utilities – gas, electric, water – as well as medical items and other problems that need to be addressed right now. Our goal is to prevent a neighbor's eviction, keep their utilities from being turned off, help them pay for their life-saving prescriptions.

The people who answer the phone at FISH – our operators – are the backbone and the core of the organization. We have a solid group of operators, but we do need to have some more.

You can be a FISH operator from your cellphone. The FISH phone number will be forwarded to you as the operator for the day. When a person calls, you record the details of what they need and then work with the FISH treasurer to get the person the necessary assistance.
