Pastor’s Corner

What is an Indulgence? -- A plenary indulgence means that by the merits of Jesus Christ, the Blessed Virgin Mary and all the saints, the full remission of the temporal punishment due to

sacramentally forgiven sins is obtained. The person becomes as if just baptized and would fly immediately to heaven if he died in that instant. A partial indulgence means that a portion of the temporal punishment due to forgiven sin is remitted. Partial indulgences are received either by doing some act to which a partial indulgence is attached (e.g. praying a partially indulgenced prayer), or by the incomplete fulfillment of the conditions attached to a plenary indulgence.

Eternal and Temporal Punishment or Guilt --

There are two kinds of punishment attached to sin, eternal and temporal. If the sin is mortal (serious, grave) sin [like enabling a pro-abortion Presidential candidate, Ed.], the person loses the friendship of God and with it the life of divine grace within. This punishment is eternal. If the person is not restored to grace before death he will be punished forever in hell, since serious sin is an infinite insult to an All-Holy God and thus deserves a like punishment. It was to repair for such sin that Jesus became man and was crucified. As God His sacrifice was infinitely meritorious, as Man He was able to represent us. He thus could expiate for our mortal sins, which are not just beyond our power of expiation but infinitely beyond it.

Mortal sin, and also venial sin --

(which has no eternal punishment attached to it), both disturb the right order within us and in the order of justice in general. We all experience these temporal (or in-time, in-this-world) consequences of sin, both both personally and socially. Sin changes us (or rather we sin because we are not what we are supposed to be), and like a pebble in a pond these changes have effects beyond us. Not only must we be sorry for our sins, but we must be more thoroughly converted to the Lord, and demonstrate that conversion (Acts 26:20) by our actions. So, while sacramental absolution forgives the eternal guilt of sin, which requires the infinite merits of Christ, it does not necessarily remove all the temporal punishment, since they are somewhat within our power to repair (and somewhat unknown

to us). Depending on our degree of sorrow, absolution may result in the expiation of all the temporal guilt of sin. However, for that which it does not repair, we must offer further expiation through prayer, penance, carrying the Cross etc., or after death be purified in purgatory (Rev 21:27).

What an Indulgence does -- is to take an occasion of such expiation (a certain prayer, penance, charity or other designated work) and add to its intrinsic merit before God an additional value based on the treasury of merits of Jesus Christ, and those perfectly united to Him in heaven (the saints). This can either partially, or under certain conditions, totally remit the temporal punishment due to sin. This depends, naturally, on our openness to God's grace. A mechanical performance of an indulgenced work would not have effect. Performing an indulgenced work should have the consequence of fixing our will away from our sins and entirely on God.

This is why among the most important -- of the conditions for receiving a plenary indulgence, and the hardest to satisfy, is the complete detachment or detestation of our sins. By detesting our sins we orient our will away from creatures (to the degree we love them inordinately), towards God. In this way we open our will to the action of His mercy flowing into our souls, which alone is able to effect the complete remission of the temporal punishment to our sins. In his 1979 book, Catholicism & Modernity – Confrontation or Capitulation, Jim Hitchcock made these critiques, chapter after chapter. From the concluding paragraph: "A modern faith, one lived in the midst of modern culture, will not be a faith which simply allows itself to be shaped by that culture. To the degree that it insists on its independence, on its right to judge the culture in which it dwells, the Church will be condemned as a ghetto. ...To be in the world but not of it will, in the year 2000 no less than

in the year 200, be a command which requires no end of humility and courage".

"If I Were The Devil" was an essay -- popularized by syndicated columnist Paul Harvey. The oldest known version of his essay dates back to 1964: "If I were the devil, I wouldn't be happy until I had seized the ripest apple on the tree—Thee.

So I'd set about however necessary to take over the United States. I'd subvert the churches first—I would begin with a campaign of whispers. With the wisdom of a serpent, I would whisper to you as I whispered to Eve: 'Do as you please.' "To the young, I would whisper, 'The Bible is a myth.' I would convince them that man created God instead of the other way around. I would confide that what is bad is good, and what is good is 'square.' And the old, I would teach to pray after me, 'Our Father, which art in Washington.' "And then I'd get organized. I'd educate authors on how to make lurid literature exciting, so that anything else would appear dull and uninteresting. I'd threaten TV with dirtier movies and vice versa. I'd pedal narcotics to whom I could. I'd sell alcohol to ladies and gentlemen of distinction. I'd tranquilize the rest with pills. "If I were the devil I'd soon have families at war with themselves, churches at war with themselves and nations at war with themselves; until each in its turn was consumed. And with promises of higher ratings I'd have mesmerizing media fanning the flames. If I were the devil I would encourage schools to refine young intellects, but neglect to discipline emotions—just let those run wild, until before you knew it, you'd have to have drug sniffing dogs and metal detectors at every schoolhouse door.

"Within a decade I'd have prisons overflowing, I'd have judges promoting pornography—soon I could evict God from the courthouse, then from the schoolhouse, and then from the houses of Congress. And in His own churches I would substitute psychology for religion, and deify science. I would lure priests and pastors into misusing boys and girls, and church money. If I were the devil I'd make the symbol of Easter an egg and the symbol of Christmas a bottle.

"If I were the devil I'd take from those who have, and give to those wanted until I had killed the incentive of the ambitious. What do you bet I could get whole states to promote gambling as the way to get rich? I would caution against extremes and hard work, and patriotism, and moral conduct. I would convince the young that marriage is old-fashioned, that swinging is more fun, that what you see on TV is the way to be. And thus I could undress you in public, and I could lure you into bed with diseases for which there is no cure.

"In other words, if I were the devil I'd just keep right on doing what he's doing. Paul Harvey, good day."

The End Times -- The Catechism provides us with a general order of events at the End [CCC 673-677]. Chronologically they are, 1. the full number of the Gentiles come into the Church; 2. the "full inclusion of the Jews in the Messiah's salvation, in the wake of the full number of the Gentiles" (#2 will follow quickly on, in the wake of, #1); 3. a final trial of the Church "in the form of a religious deception offering men an apparent solution to their problems at the price of apostasy from the truth." The supreme deception is that of the Antichrist. 4. Christ's victory over this final unleashing of evil through a cosmic upheaval of this passing world and the Last Judgment. As [then] Cardinal Ratzinger recently pointed out (in the context of the message of Fátima), we are not at the end of the world. In fact, the Second Coming (understood as the physical return of Christ) cannot occur until the full number of the Gentiles are converted, followed by "all Israel." Approved Catholic mystics (Venerables, Blessed and Saints, approved apparitions) throw considerable light on this order, by prophesying a minor apostasy and tribulation toward the end of the world, after which will occur the reunion of Christians. Only later will the entire world fall away from Christ (the great apostasy) and the personal Antichrist arise and the Tribulation of the End occur. Although this is not Catholic doctrine, arising as it does from private revelation, it conforms to what is occurring in our time, especially in light of Our Lady of Fátima's

promise of an "Era of Peace." This "Triumph of the Immaculate Heart" (other saints have spoken of a social reign of Jesus Christ when Jesus will reign in the hearts of men) would seem to occur prior to the rise of the Antichrist. The optimism of the Pope for the "New Evangelization" and a "Civilization of Love" in the Third Millennium of Christianity fits here, as well. This would place us, therefore, in the period just before the events spoken of in the Catechism, that is, on the verge of the evangelization of the entire world. Other interpretations are possible, but none seem to fit the facts as well, especially when approved mystics are studied, instead of merely alleged ones.

PARENTS ARE REMINDED to please honor the drop-off and pick-up procedures put in place for the children's safety. Parents may drop off their child in front of the church at the beginning of class; however, if more than 10 minutes late (and classes have been dismissed from prayer in the church), parents are asked to walk their children to class. At pickup, all parents are required to park and meet your children in the narthex of the church.

SAINT REPORTS: CONFIRMATION PREPARATION YEAR II STUDENTS (usually 8th grade year) who attend religion class on Monday afternoons/evenings have been assigned the Saint report. Please make sure to honor the due dates that were given to you by your catechists.

HIGH SCHOOL CCD CLASSES STARTED on October 22. The Apologetics Class is held from 5:00 to 6:15, and our 6:30 class this year began with a 10-session program called "You: Life, Love and the Theology of the Body", based on Saint John Paul II's teachings. The third session will be held on November 12. The course addresses many of the issues teens are already exposed to via entertainment media, societal pressures, and their own interactions with each other. Classes will be conducted in a single sex environment with male and female catechists for each. Please call the Office of Religious Education for more information.

Formation in Christian Chastity (FCC) Lessons will be taught to children in Grades 1, 5, 6, 7 and 8 on November 26. This class was discussed at the "Back-to-CCD Parent Meeting" on September 10 and all parents were recently sent an email with details about this mandated class, **along with an opt-out form for parents who would like to cover the material with their children at home.** If you choose to cover the material with your child, please make sure to send in the Opt-out form to the Office of Religious Education as soon as possible.

Regular class sessions will be held for children in Grades 1 through 4 on that evening, but only FCC lessons will be taught during class time for the upper Grades 5 through 8. Please plan accordingly with carpools, etc.
