Pastor's Corner

From Bishop Burbidge's letter to me: Dear Father Pokorsky, Thank you for your past leadership in your parish to support the Bishop's Lenten Appeal (BLA) which provides vital funding for the

various offices, programs and ministries that provide spiritual, educational and pastoral assistance throughout our diocese.

The in-pew pledges are a critical component of the BLA, making up approximately 35% of the total BLA amount raised each year. Further, the in-pew effort reaches registered parishioners who do not respond to the initial BLA mailing, as well as people who regularly attend Mass at your parish but are not registered.

Your parish goal for the 2019 Bishop's Lenten Appeal is \$310,000. I am confident that with your enthusiastic promotion of this appeal, your parish will achieve or even exceed this amount. As in past years, the parish BLA goal setting procedure takes into account the parish's participation in the prior year's appeal and whether its goal was achieved. Enclosed is a summary of how the parish goals were assigned. I am grateful to our deans for offering their counsel and guidance on these goals. May we work together in Christ to accomplish even greater things in His name and for those in most need in our diocese.

Father Pokorsky: As a general rule in pastoral topics – Father Pokorsky does not correspond by email. He directed the Parish secretary to delete all incoming pastoral email messages. He requests that you contact him directly on his cell phone: 703.638.8451. He is happy to chat and hopes you are not offended that he doesn't read the emails. He very much prefers the "human touch" of direct conversation rather than email correspondence, correspondence that can be easily misunderstood.

Catholic Persecution Watch -- Petition Launched To Remove Law Professor For Discriminatory" Comments: A petition to remove Emeritus Professor of Law and Legal Philosophy John Finnis from teaching has attracted three hundred and fifty signatures in five days. Finnis has been accused of having "a long record of extremely discriminatory views against many groups of disadvantaged people", including the LGBTQ community. Finnis co-teaches a series of seminars for postgraduate students who choose to take the jurisprudence and political theory course in the BCL or M.Jur degree. Remarks

highlighted by the authors of the petition as particularly discriminatory include a comment from his Collected Essays in which he suggests that homosexual conduct is “never a valid, humanly acceptable choice and form of life” and is “destructive of human character and relationships” because “it treats human sexual capacities in a way which is deeply hostile to the self-understanding of those members who are willing to commit themselves to real marriage”. This essay was published in 2011 but refers to arguments he made in a previous essay from 1994. The essay also argues that “just as a cowardly weakling who would never try to kill anyone, yet deliberately approves of the killings of innocent people in a terrorist massacre, has a will which violates the good of life, so even a person of exclusively and irreversibly homosexual inclination violates the good of marriage by consenting to (and deliberately approving) non-marital sex acts such as solitary masturbation”. The 1994 essay entitled “Law, Morality and Sexual Orientation” claims that “copulation of humans with animals is repudiated because it treats human sexual activity and satisfaction as something appropriately sought in a manner that, like the coupling of animals, is divorced from the expressing of an intelligible common good – and so treats human bodily life, in one of its most intense activities, as merely animal. The deliberate genital coupling of persons of the same sex is repudiated for a very similar reason.”


