
## Knights of Columbus

Baptism classes are required. Please contact the parish office as soon as possible. Parents are encouraged to attend before the birth of their child.

## Marriage Preparation

Couples are required to make arrangements at least six months in advance of the desired wedding date.

## Sponsor

Letters

To qualify, one must be registered with the church for at least 3 months, have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation, be at least 16 years of age and attend weekly Sunday Mass. Married sponsors must be in a valid Catholic marriage.



## What the Holy Ones Say About Receiving Communion in the Hand...

"Wherever I go in the whole world, the thing that makes me the saddest is watching people receive Communion in the hand."

 Mother Teresa (now St. Teresa of Calcutta) As reported by Fr. George Rutler in his 1989 Good Friday sermon at St. Agnes Church, New York

"The Eucharistic presence of Christ begins at the moment of the consecration and endures as long as the Eucharistic species subsist. Christ is present whole and entire in each of the species and whole and entire in each of their parts, in such a way that the breaking of the bread does not divide Christ"<sup>1</sup> Every particle of the host and every drop of the Precious Blood, no matter how small, is equally Jesus Christ.

A scientific study was performed in which an unconsecrated host was placed into a hand wearing a black glove. When examined under a bright light, particles were observed on the glove in 70% of the observations. Given the findings of this study it can therefore be assumed that a substantial number of particles fall to the floor and are lost as a direct result of the practice of receiving Communion in the hand. Communion received on the tongue does not endanger particles of the host.<sup>2</sup>

"There is an apostolic letter on the existence of a special valid permission for this [Communion in the hand]. But I tell you that I am not in favor of this practice, nor do I recommend it."

- His Holiness Pope John Paul II, (now Pope Saint John Paul II) responding to a reporter from *Stimme des* glaubens magazine, during his visit to Fulda (Germany) in November 1980. "There can be no doubt that Communion in the hand is an expression of the trend towards desacralization in the Church in general and irreverence in approaching the Eucharist in particular.... Why—for God's sake—should Communion in the hand be introduced into our churches when it is evidently detrimental from a pastoral viewpoint, when it certainly does not increase our reverence, and when it exposes the Eucharist to the most terrible diabolical abuses? There are really no serious arguments for Communion in the hand. But there are the most gravely serious kinds of arguments against it."

- Dietrich von Hildebrand (called a "20th century doctor of the Church" by Pope Pius XII), in an article entitled "Communion in the Hand should be Rejected," November 8, 1973.

Holy Communion received on the tongue "signifies the reverence of the faithful for the Eucharist ... provides that Holy Communion will be distributed with due reverence ... is more conducive to faith, reverence and humility.... It [Communion in the hand] carries certain dangers with it which may arise from the new manner of administering holy Communion: the danger of a loss of reverence for the august Sacrament of the Altar, of profanation, of adulterating the true doctrine."

All men are invited! If you have a breviary (Shorter Christian Prayer, Christian Prayer, Liturgy of the Hours), please bring it. Coffee will be provided!


