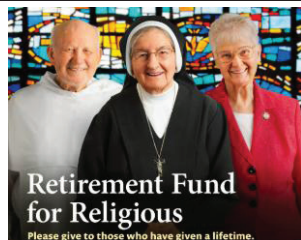

Dear Parishioner,

Bishop Burbidge has been exploring the possibility of a Catholic-based Career & Technical Education (CTE)/ Vocational program in the Diocese of Arlington. A recent survey of the diocese showed that 92% of parishioners enthusiastically support it.

This overwhelming response prompts the effort to advance to the next step: to survey for preferences on the model (or kind) of school and the location of that school. This is a momentous idea, and you are respectfully asked to take the survey out of personal interest or for the good of the diocese. The survey is available in English and Spanish.

Iniciación sacramental en Santa Ana

La Iglesia enseña que se necesitan tres sacramentos para una iniciación completa: el bautismo, la eucaristía y la confirmación. Nos complace colaborar con su familia para prepararlos y celebrarlos a lo largo del año.

El bautismo de los bebés se puede preparar durante el embarazo o el proceso de adopción, ya que la Iglesia pide que se celebre lo antes posible después del nacimiento. Para los adultos y los niños de 7 años o más, el bautismo se celebra anualmente en la Vigilia Pascual.

La Eucaristía para los bautizados en la infancia se recibe en segundo grado, después de al menos dos años de instrucción religiosa formal. Para los adultos y los niños mayores, se recibe con el bautismo; para los bautizados en la infancia pero no catequizados, se recibe en la Vigilia Pascual.

La confirmación para los bautizados en la infancia se recibe en noveno grado, después de al menos dos años de instrucción religiosa formal. Para los adultos y los niños mayores, se recibe con el bautismo; para los bautizados en la infancia que recibieron la Primera Comunión pero no la Confirmación, se recibe en Pentecostés en la Catedral.
