

From the Pastor

FROM GREEN TO GOLD — January 28, 2024

I open this column this week with additional comments about the March for Life, which was held in Washington on Friday, January 19th, although the actual anniversary, the 51st, of Roe v. Wade is January 22nd, this past Monday. That Friday was a "snow day," meaning schools were closed as was the parish office. The March went forward. The parish had a full bus of participants (58)—single people, families with little children, even a baby, older people, etc. It snowed the entire time we were in D.C. It was cold and damp, but we survived. It really wasn't that bad, perhaps by Wisconsin standards, but by general ones as well, I would say. Toni Smart, our parish pro-life coordinator, headed up the whole effort, and Kevin Zrenda, who was the bus captain and coordinator for the time in Washington, both were wonderful, and I greatly appreciate all they did to make that day possible for us. As in years past, the Knights of Columbus members provided a nice dinner after the March. I am also very grateful to them.

As we know that U.S. Supreme Court decision from 1973 has been overturned, thankfully. But this simply moved the decision to the state level. Some states have placed serious restrictions on this killing of the most vulnerable, innocent, defenseless of all, the unborn. Abortion truly is such an evil, an absolute atrocity, and yet several other states continue to allow or even promote this horrific taking of human life. My home state of Wisconsin is an example of one of those states where there are restrictions. That however continues to be challenged. For many months there were no abortions there, but that changed recently and Planned Parenthood, the largest abortion provider in our nation, has now begun aborting babies in at least two locations. Our U.S. Vice President was in Wisconsin this past Monday on the actual anniversary promoting the "right" to abortion. She was also in Virginia the next day, this past Tuesday, with the President of the U.S., a Catholic who certainly should know better, promoting this evil here. This is all to say we still have much to do and much for which to pray. There will be two opportunities, among others, to do just that in February. The first begins on Ash Wednesday, February 14th, with another Forty Days for Life. The second, a week later, is on February 21st in Richmond. This is Virginia Pro-Life Day and the chance to meet with state Assembly and Senate representatives as well as a rally and march. There has been further information about this in the parish bulletin.

In keeping with the title of this column, you just knew I had to say something about the Packer-49er game from last Saturday night. San Francisco was favored by ten points. I was hoping for an upset like the last game, the Wild Card playoff game against Dallas the Sunday before, but it wasn't meant to be. Green Bay was in it the entire game, in fact it really looked like they were headed to another upset. But they had a few missed opportunities and in the final minutes the 49ers scored a touchdown, while the Packers missed a field goal and were intercepted with one minute remaining, ending any chance of a win. So, their season is over. It ended up being a better year than anyone expected. I am thrilled about that. They could have won that game last Saturday, but just didn't get it done and there is the spiritual lesson this week. Whether it is our faith in general or something like the pro-life issue, we can never give up. We must persevere and with God's grace we can. We should never lose hope, for with God there is always hope, despite how bleak things may seem. Jesus Christ is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. He is our hope for He has suffered, died, and risen for us. He is our Redeemer and Savior. We need to look to Him, for with Him we find that hope, we have the courage and perseverance to overcome all that this fallen world throws at us. With Him we find the strength to deal with our own personal weaknesses and sinfulness and get to Heaven someday. I pray we never lose sight of that.

Before closing this week, I have two last items to bring to your attention. First, we open Catholic Schools Week today. We are very blessed here at St. Veronica's to have a thriving school with an enrollment just over 400 students. Our school, while not perfect, but we strive for that, is a place where our young people find the presence of Christ and have the daily opportunity of receiving His grace. Our faculty and staff are dedicated to this effort. They truly do sacrifice to be here. Please pray for them, but please also and more importantly pray for our students that they will grow in their faith, in holiness, in an ever-greater awareness of Christ's presence in their lives. Additionally, this weekend opens the annual fundraising effort of the diocese, the Bishop's Lenten Appeal. You will hear Paul Chadowski, who again has agreed to be the parish coordinator for this for which I am grateful, speak at all Masses about this. Our goal this year is \$250,000. Please be as generous as you can and thank you for your attention to this effort. May God bless all of us, our parish, our diocese, and our nation.
