

From the Pastor

FROM GREEN TO GOLD — April 28, 2024

As we continue through this Easter season on this Fifth Sunday of Easter, we celebrate in a glorious way the Lord's resurrection from the dead. As we all know, by His suffering and death on the cross and His rising from the dead, He has redeemed us. We are saved from sin and eternal death. He provides us unbelievable graces which strengthen us and help us to resist sin, avoid temptations, grow in holiness, and prepare for heaven someday. What a gift! We obviously need to now cooperate with those graces. As our Gospel today tells us, we must remain connected to the vine. That vine is Jesus Christ Himself. As we heard last week, He is truly our Good Shepherd. He cares for us, He loves us, He wants nothing but good things for us, ultimately eternal life with Him in the glory of heaven. He does warn us, even demands of us, that we "pick up our crosses." In other words, although He is with us and provides for us, we need to be willing to suffer in this world, again preparing for that next world. It is a bit like physical exercise. If we are to build muscle and manage our weight, there will be some pain. So too with the spiritual life. But as we deal with all of this, He is there with His grace. That then is why we need to remain "connected" to that source of grace. Jesus is the vine, the "true vine," as again He says. Cut off from that vine, that source of grace, we "whither."

Being cut off from the vine means the struggles and challenges of life, that we all encounter, will be much more difficult and perhaps unbearable. This refers to an illness, a financial setback, a family issue, and all the problems of the world. Sadly, there are many such problems. Consider what is currently happening on college campus across the nation, but especially in New York, particularly at Columbia University. For some it seems that to be Jewish is almost a crime. Their very safety is threatened. Thankfully, we are a nation where free speech is a God-given right. People no doubt can voice their concerns about what is happening in the Mideast. On October 7th of last year all kinds of atrocities were released on the Jews near the Gaza Strip. In response Israel attacked the Hamas in Gaza, causing serious disruptions to people's lives. The situation there is a mess, and we have a lot for which to pray. There is also Ukraine. That too is a very complicated issue, as the U.S. helps fund the war there, while doing little, it seems, to control our own borders. There are many political issues at work here. There are moral issues involved here as well and all of this affects us as we try to live lives centered on Christ, in a Christ-like way, so that someday we can get to heaven. Again, this is why we must pray. My last comment on this is that in some ways none of this should surprise us when we can't respect the dignity of an unborn baby. It all starts there. It is so frustrating when we hear of "women's heath issues" or "reproductive rights." We do not have a right to kill a vulnerable, innocent unborn child. Additionally, killing that unborn baby is not a "health issue," it is destroying the health of that baby. Yet again, why we pray!

We are blessed, as I mentioned here last week, to have a parish that does pray. We pray for those babies, and their mothers and fathers and grandparents. We do pray for those suffering across our nation and the world. We do this at the multiple Masses offered at this parish each week. We do this during Adoration of Our Eucharistic Lord, available to us daily, except for the weekends. While we do have some hours that are only lightly covered, it continues to amaze me how often I go into church and see adorers praying before Our Lord exposed on the altar. Just last week one afternoon there were at least fifteen people there. That is tremendously inspiring. This too is such a gift, hopefully one we appreciate and cherish. Hopefully, it is one that inspires us to deepen our own love for God and encourages us to pray more, to grow further in holiness, so that we are prepared for heaven someday.

As I also mentioned here last week, on April 14th Bishop Burbidge was here to celebrate our 25th year as a parish. Two days later on April 16th Bishop Loverde was here to confirm our eighth graders. That was a busy week. Hosting two bishops in the same week, literally two days apart is a stressful task, to be honest with you. But it was a beautiful, faithfilled week. It was inspiring. It truly showed how precious our Catholic Faith is and what a treasure God has given us right here at St. Veronica's. All of this doesn't just happen. As I also mentioned, albeit briefly, here last week, I am grateful to all who made all this possible. That includes the teachers and catechists of our eighth graders, their parents, grandparents, and sponsors. It certainly involves the eighth graders themselves who in many ways are very inspiring. It also includes the administration of our parish school and our parish religious education office. That office has been primary directed over the past few years by Mrs. Andrea Shermer. Sadly, for us, she is stepping aside from that position. After time as an assistant in that office and then as Coordinator of Religious Education, she will be greatly missed. I want to thank her for her time with us. Historically, she and her family have been with us from the beginning twenty-five years ago. She will still be a parishioner and I am sure we will see her around, but I am very grateful for her many years of dedicated service to our young people's religious formation. In closing, I do also want to thank everyone who assisted with the anniversary Mass and Confirmation and the receptions that followed. Besides Mrs. Shermer, I also want to thank by name two other office staff members—Rebecca Byrne and Shannon Branly—who did much for all that happened that week. May God bless them, and us! Divine Mercy Corner


