

From the Pastor

FROM GREEN TO GOLD — June 30, 2024

As I often comment here, it is hard to believe now that June is all but in the rearview mirror and that we enter the month of July tomorrow. That typically means that we are one third through summer, even though officially summer only began on June 20th. This week Thursday is the Fourth of July, which for some is the halfway mark of summer. The point being summer is flying by and my hope is you are finding time to relax and deepen your relationship with Our Lord. All too often, as I have also mentioned in recent years here, my summers have not been that relaxing and so far, that does apply to this year as well. I never lose hope that things will be different, so I'm still waiting for life to slow down. I do go home to Wisconsin at the end of July, actually in about three weeks. That truly is a more relaxing time for me, but I still hope that the weeks here in July and August just might be a bit more conducive to that slower way of life. We truly need that. That is the purpose of a retreat as well. My annual retreat will be in November. As I write this Fr. Moschetto is away, and my hope is that he is getting some real down time as well. I am very grateful to him for all he does here. Last week he passed his one-year anniversary with us. Thankfully, he is a fine priest—prayerful, ever striving for greater holiness, willing to work hard and serve the people of this parish. I appreciate all that Deacon Ochenkowski does for us as well. He is such a blessing, as he quite humbly, but very ably does his work here. I will also offer a word of thanks to our seminarian for the summer, Luke Lenhard. He too has been a great addition to the parish. He also is willing to do all he can to help. Please pray for us and know that we pray for all of you.

We also need to pray for our nation. Again, this Thursday we celebrate Independence Day. This is a great reminder of how blessed America is and yet there are many challenges. Daily we face the crime and violence in our city streets, on our border, and in many other places as well. Daily we are confronted with a near total lack of respect for the unborn, sadly right here in Virginia, where despite the overturning of Roe v. Wade, abortion is still legal. There is an election ahead of us and this past Thursday (after this column was written) there was a presidential debate. I have no idea how that went, but there is much at stake. We have two rather flawed main candidates. One is Catholic but hardly lives his faith. He may go to Mass weekly, but he is consistent about rejecting many of the teachings of our Faith. The other is not Catholic, but he has a very interesting past. We really need the guidance of the Holy Spirit here. It does sadden me how political and divided so many things have become. The Republican National Convention is in Milwaukee this year two weeks from now and just before I head home. I get to avoid all the hassles this may create and the potential violence some are concerned about. That itself is sad. The Democratic National Convention is in Chicago a month later and there they are expecting even more violence and unrest. I have no problem with peaceful protests, which is what this Thursday is all about, but we need to respect the freedoms we have here, and truly cherish them. Unfortunately, at times our religious liberty is also challenged. We saw that with some of the abortion protests somewhat recently. We also see that when the federal, state, or city governments try to force Catholic religious orders or schools to follow the immoral regulations they enact. This is an ongoing battle. Often the courts have ruled in the Church's favor, sometimes not. So. that is why it is very important that we keep praying. How we vote and for whom we vote does indeed make a difference. But the underlying need is to pray or as St. Paul tells us in his first letter to the Thessalonians, "pray without ceasing." We have one Mass on Thursday, the 4th, at 8:30 am. Please try to attend if you are not away. The power of the Mass and the graces we receive there are absolutely tremendous and truly life changing. It is the greatest prayer we have. I do hope everyone has a wonderful, relaxing, holy Fourth and may God bless America!

One last thing this week, as Thursday is a national holiday, the decision has been made that on these national and federal holidays, Adoration in the church will be suspended. We have had some real difficulty getting all the hours covered, as is necessary when Our Eucharistic Lord is exposed on the altar. This is a great gift to our parish, but recently it has been a struggle to find adorers. I do hope and pray this is not a sign of our future, as not only is this a gift, but we need this. We need to be before Our Lord. We need to be praying and adoring Him, giving praise to Him, thanking Him, asking for His forgiveness, and petitioning Him with our needs. He knows what we need, but He also kind of expects us to ask, at least at times. I hope more people we sign up for Adoration hours and more simply will take advantage of this treasure in our midst. Due to these difficulties, Adoration will end on Thursday morning (the 4th) before the 8:30 am Mass as usual but will be suspended that day and Friday (the 5th). It will resume after the 12:15 pm Mass on Monday, the 8th. Again, Happy Fourth of July and may God bless all of us.

Brown Scapular Investiture Ceremony

Honor Our Lady of Mount Carmel on her feast day, **on Tuesday, July 16**th by being invested the Brown Scapular after the 8:30 am and 12:15 pm Masses.

On July 16, 1251 at Aylesford in Kent, England, according to tradition, Our Lady appeared to Saint Simon Stock, a Carmelite monk, promising that whoever wore her "habit" devoutly would be assured of eternal salvation. Her "habit" is the Brown Scapular, two pieces of cloth joined by strings and worn over the shoulders, a miniature element of the Carmelite habit. According to the Catholic Encyclopedia, "Whoever, therefore, even though he now be a sinner, wears the badge [scapular] of the Mother of God throughout life as her faithful servant, not presumptuously relying on the scapular as on a miraculous amulet, but trustfully confiding in the power and goodness of Mary, may securely hope that Mary will through her powerful and motherly intercession procure for him [her] all the necessary graces for true conversion and for perseverance in good."

Novena to the Holy Face

In honor of St. Veronica's parish feast day, we will be praying the Novena to the Holy Face beginning this Thursday, July 4^{th} for the nine days leading up to and ending on July 12^{th} . We will pray the Novena at all Masses during that time period. Novena cards will be available in the pews. If you are unable to attend one of the Masses, we invite you to pray along with us at home. Because this devotion is based on the image of Our Lord's face that appeared on Veronica's veil it is especially fitting that our parish participates in this ancient and powerful Novena.

O my Jesus! Cast upon us a look of mercy. Turn Thy Face toward each of us, as Thou didst to Veronica. Not that we may see It with our bodily eyes, for this we do not deserve, but turn It toward our hearts, so that remembering Thee, we may ever draw from this fountain of strength, the vigor necessary to sustain the combats of life. 




