

### From the Pastor

#### FROM GREEN TO GOLD — October 5, 2025

We have now officially entered the month of October, the month of the Holy Rosary and the month dedicated by our bishops to pro-life issues. That is why today is the Life Chain, that annual event, the first Sunday in October, where across the nation people gather in various places along well traveled streets and highways to peacefully pray. As Catholics we typically pray the Rosary, asking for the Blessed Mother's intercession that people's hearts might be moved to respect the dignity and sanctity of every human life, especially that of the most vulnerable of all, the unborn. We meet in Manassas at 2:30 pm today. We also met right here at St. Veronica's at our pro-life memorial near the north entrance of the church where the statue of Our Lady of Guadalupe is to pray the Rosary on Saturday (the 4th). We as well are in the midst of the 40 Days for Life campaign, where daily we have a special intention for life and when we will gather as a parish at the abortion facility in Falls Church on Saturday, October 25th. This is our "Vigil Day," as we need to cover the whole day, but around 11:00 am we will meet as a larger group to pray the Rosary. It is a beautiful testament to our Faith and to the gift of life. It is truly very sad how human life has been so degraded. We saw that yet again at a Mormon church in Michigan last Sunday. We saw that at Annunciation Church in Minneapolis when school children were shot at during Mass. We saw that a few weeks ago when an activist for truth was gunned down with one shot. This has all become much too common. Human life has lost its value for so many. This does make some sense however, for if we cannot respect the life of the unborn, why should the lives of those born mean anything. Today we are led to believe that those unborn lives mean nothing. If a pregnancy is inconvenient, if the unborn child is diagnosed with some deformity, then it can be eliminated. Thankfully, a number of states have placed some serious restrictions on abortion, but not Virginia. As I have written about here previously, as the diocese reminds us, as fliers in this bulletin have explained, some legislators in Virginia are trying to codify abortion as the law of the land. This really is diabolical. It is evil. And yet some seem to be totally on board with this. That can't be us and that is in part what this month is all about. Praying the Rosary daily for this intention (and others) will help. That then is part of the beauty of this special month. So please, keep praying!

On another entirely different note, I want to thank all those who made our annual parish Oktoberfest last Sunday possible. That certainly includes all who attended it. Our numbers were down a bit from previous years. I'm not sure why as it was a nearly perfect day as far as the weather was concerned. The food and beverages were excellent. The games for the kids were wonderful. The live band was outstanding and, from what I could tell, everyone who did attend had a great time. I also thank the Knights and the school's PTO for staffing the event, in particular Paul Wise and Joe Stapleton, who led those efforts, Paul for the Knights and Joe for the PTO. Obviously, there were many other volunteers. I am extremely grateful to everyone. This is always such a festive occasion, a real celebration of fellowship (and all things German, which is pleasing to me with my German heritage, for what that is worth).

As you read this (on Sunday, the 5th), I am preparing to leave for my annual retreat. As I have also mentioned here previously, a priest is required to make a five day retreat each year to further work on his spiritual life. It is an opportunity to deepen one's love for God and neighbor, to strengthen his prayerfulness, and hopefully grow in holiness. It is the hope that the more holy the priest, the more holy the parish, or specifically the people of the parish. I need that; we need that. Please know you are in my prayers this week as I join fifty other priests from our diocese at Loyola Retreat House in Faulkner, Maryland. Please pray for me but also pray for Fr. Njodzela as he shoulders all the duties of the parish this week. I return on Friday.

I want to congratulate two of our parishioners who have recently received Papal Honors. Actually, fifty people from our diocese did. They were presented these honors last Sunday evening at the cathedral by our bishop. I know a number of the recipients from other diocesan connections or from St. Mary's, my previous parish. Two of the other recipients, although not parishioners have a connection to St. Veronica's and have been exceedingly kind to us. The parishioners are Mrs. Mary Hasson and Miss Therese Bermpohl. Mary is a well-respected, faithful speaker and author, who addresses various culture, family, and gender ideology issues, all from Catholic teaching. She has spoken here at St. Veronica's and is a very dedicated wife and mother as well. Therese is the head of the Marriage, Family, and Respect Life Office of the diocese, where she has dutifully served the people of Arlington in these very important areas. She is a truly faith-filled woman. Please join me in thanking, praying for, and honoring them for this well-deserved recognition.

Lastly and briefly, the Packers had another interesting game last Sunday night against the Cowboys in Dallas. The game ended in overtime with a tie, 40-40. Both offenses were rather explosive, but I'm not really sure what happened to the Packers. They shined in their first two games but have been less than stellar in the last two games. They have their bye this weekend. My Brewers are in the playoffs, having had a bye this past week. Not only did they take their division, but they ended the season with the best MLB record. We'll see what happens this week. Both Green Bay and Milwaukee need consistency and discipline, as we all do. God bless.




#### Manassas Life Chain Sunday October 5


