From the Pastor

FROM GREEN TO GOLD — November 30, 2025

Happy New Year! As I mentioned here last week when we celebrated the feast of Christ the King, that was the last Sunday of the past year. The Church does not follow the "regular" calendar, rather a new liturgical year begins on the First Sunday of Advent, which is today. Advent does indeed open a new year, thus my greeting. We know Christmas Day is December 25th. To determine the beginning of a new liturgical year and the first Sunday of Advent, one needs to count four Sundays back from the 25th. Advent therefore is not necessarily four weeks long as many think. It is four Sundays and may be anywhere from three to four weeks. This year it is just over three and a half weeks long. The four Sundays represent the 4000 year-wait for the coming of Jesus Christ, our Savior and Redeemer. The Jews anticipated the arrival of the Messiah. As we know however, they are still waiting, for they in general do not believe Jesus is the long-awaited Messiah. We as Christians obviously believe otherwise. Advent then is meant to be a time of preparation. It is also to be penitential, perhaps not as solemn as Lent, but the typical Advent color of violet is the sign of penitence. Sadly, Advent doesn't always seem to be so sacrificial.

I have lamented in past years that the Advent season is often a rushed, hectic, secular-focused, party-driven time of the year. In some ways it appears to have lost almost a sense of increased prayer and self-denial. The season has instead become days of consumerism with the emphasis on shopping and celebrating. I don't mean to be too critical. I am criticizing the loss of Advent being centered on making a prayerful, sacrificial preparation for the celebration of the birth of Our Savior. The Son of God became incarnate, humbled Himself and took on human flesh, and was born into this world about 2000 years ago in a remote town, on a chilly winter night, where there was "no room for Him in the inn." The first witnesses of his birth were lowly shepherds and yet this is the King of kings that we are talking about. It would seem that He deserved better, but a manger, a feeding trough, in a stable, maybe a cave, was a very fitting birthplace for this King. He is the King of the Universe, again as we celebrated last Sunday, but He chose to come into this world in utter simplicity and profound humility. His mother was a young, devout, modest Jewish teenager. His foster father was an ordinary, undistinguished carpenter. He, like his wife, was a faithful Jew. He never says a word in the Scriptures and seems to just fade away after the birth, flight to Egypt, and Jesus' being lost in the Temple. We hear nothing of how he died, although we can presume it was a happy death, realizing that Jesus and Mary were almost assuredly at his side. Advent really should be a reasonably quiet time, following the example of St. Joseph, truly a time of prayer and of penance, as we get ready for the celebration of Jesus' birth and that time when we will meet Him as our judge. We should do our best to celebrate this season properly. Some festivity is fine, for this is all about the King of kings. That festivity needs to be moderated with the prayerful, penitential nature of Advent. May our focus be true. May this Advent be twenty-six days of growth in holiness, as we deepen our love for our Lord, strive to be more charitable to those in need, and reflect on the hope, the joy, and the peace that are also a part of Advent. Going to confession, attending more Masses, spending additional time with Our Eucharistic Lord in Adoration all can help to make this season more spiritual, focusing us on its true nature, rather than the more secular understanding. Advent should be Advent; Christmas should be Christmas. Decorating the house, baking cookies, attending a party or two, listening to "seasonal" music will not destroy the true meaning of Advent, if we moderate those activities and seriously attempt to make this time year what it is meant to be liturgically. Doing all this is good for our souls. It can assist us on our path towards heaven. This all will help us prepare for the remembrance of the birth of Jesus and how this affects our salvation. Advent should not be a hectic burden, but rather a beautiful time of the year, and it will be that for us this year if we strive to make it that. I pray we all have a very blessed, holy, joy-filled Advent.

A few closing notes, first I have no football news. Because of Thanksgiving this column had to be written early, so the Packers had not yet played the Vikings in Minnesota. Additionally, as you read this Green Bay will have also made a visit to Detroit to play the Lions on Thanksgiving Day. No doubt, I hope these were two victories for my team. More importantly, I hope this Advent is a "victory" for each of us, an opportunity to become more holy. Please be aware, as is or has been listed in the bulletin, that there are some Advent things happening here at St. Veronica's. This coming Saturday, December 6th, the actual feast day of St. Nicholas, the parish for the second year in a row will host a family movie night. Last year it was well attended and we hope it is again this year. It is a wonderful evening of faith, family, and fun. Then a week later, on Saturday, December 13th, the school PTO is hosting a St. Nick Night. They have done this for a few years. It is open to the whole parish and is another wonderful evening of faith, family, and fun. Please watch the bulletin for other additions, such as confessions the Monday and Tuesday before Christmas. *In Christ, Fr. Kleinmann*

Who Is Saint Nicholas?

Saint Nicholas was the bishop of Myra in Turkey in the 4th century. He was a martyr and must have been a loving man—which is why we still know his name and why he is always remembered at Christmastime. Many stories about his life were told and retold, how he was so kind and generous to the poor, to children and to those unjustly imprisoned. The legends tell us that he gave anonymously, did not seek praise, but wanted good things to be done and the hearts of children to be delighted. While Nicholas remains a very popular saint in eastern Europe, particularly in Russia, he became known in a different way further West, in places such as Holland—as "Sinterklaas," the secret bringer of gifts to children on the eve of his feast day, **December 6th**. It is easy to see how the Sinterklaas of Amsterdam became the Santa Claus of New Amsterdam, now New York.


