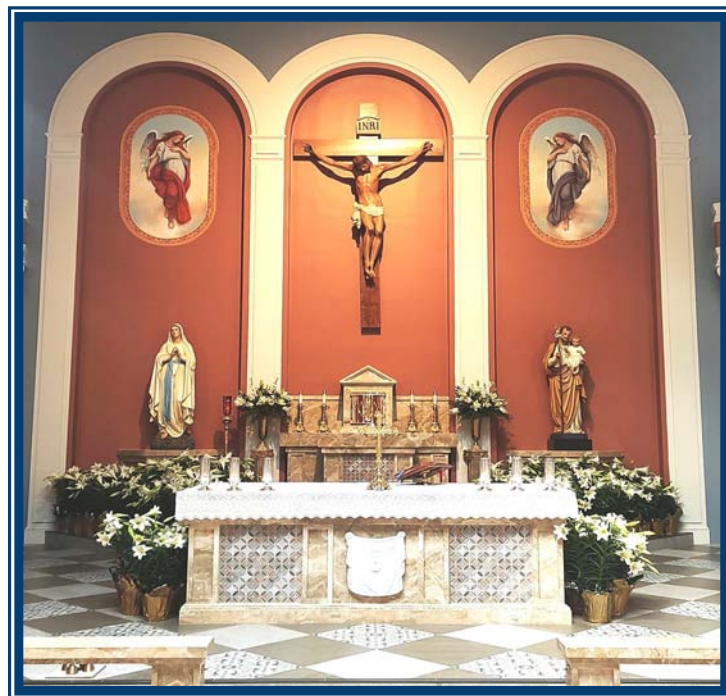

From the Pastor

FROM GREEN TO GOLD — January 25, 2026

I will open with some observations concerning the march to the Super Bowl, which is scheduled for February 8th. The NFC/AFC conference championship games are this Sunday. The AFC teams play this afternoon, and the NFC teams meet this evening. Last weekend gave us some exciting games. The Broncos outlasted the Bills in overtime, and the Seahawks destroyed the 49ers on Saturday. On Sunday the Patriots pretty much dominated the Texans, whose quarterback had four interceptions, not a way to win a game. The LA Rams outlasted the Chicago Bears, also in overtime. The Bears quarterback, Caleb Williams, has been a standout of his team this year. Typically, the Bears have been the joke of their division. The Packers have had their number for years. But this season has been different, Williams has been a comeback sensation. That is how he helped Chicago take two games from the Packers, one regular season game and a playoff game. It looked like he was going to do that again last Sunday. With just less than two minutes remaining, Williams threw an amazing pass for a touchdown, tying the game and taking it into overtime. However, an interception, his third of the game, allowed the Rams to drive down the field and score a field goal to win the game and advance to the conference championship today. As I mentioned last week, I was disappointed the Packers lost to the Bears, obviously of whom I am no fan. They did the job, while Green Bay collapsed in the second half last Saturday evening. I will give credit where it is due, and I realize Chicago was exuberant about beating the Packers. But I really didn't appreciate their crass response to that win. For that reason, primarily, and again not being a fan, I was pleased to see them defeated. I really don't care now who advances to the game of games. I am no fan of New England or Denver nor am I of LA or Seattle. I guess I just hope for three exciting games, the two today and the Super Bowl in two weeks. While all of this can be fun, and interesting, more important definitely is our Faith!

When it comes to our Faith, there are two key events beginning this weekend. One is the Bishop's Lenten Appeal. Our goal this year is \$275,000. Last year it was \$262,000. We met and surpassed it, so now we have a new challenge this year. The diocese wants us to meet our goal, but also, even more so, hopes for greater participation. As you will hear the BLA supports and funds many diocesan activities and offices, especially the training and education of our future priests. With our reasonably high number of seminarians, this is a huge cost, but one well worth it. As I do each year, I ask you to consider donating to the BLA. I also want you to be generous to the parish and to other worthy charities. Many of you are, for which I am extremely grateful.

The other event that begins this weekend and only lasts through this Saturday (the 31st) is Catholic Schools Week. Each year we celebrate our school the last week of January. We are very blessed to have a parish school. It gives us a wonderful opportunity to educate and hand on our Catholic Faith to our young people. Post-Covid, we saw our enrollment grow considerably. Thankfully, Catholic schools were actually willing to open when public schools were not. This year, sadly, saw our enrollment decrease. Part of the issue was some of our students returned to the public schools, while others left for other reasons. We need to provide a sound education in a Christ-centered environment. More importantly, we are here to present the truths of our Faith to our students in a way that they can learn it and really incorporate it into their lives. Additionally, it needs to be done in a manner that will not be fleeting but will be part of their lives for whatever amount of time God gives them. Our Faith is such a treasure, such a gift, and is the way to heaven someday. My hope and prayer are that we do exactly that by the grace of God with the assistance of our dedicated teachers and staff and the cooperation of our parents and students. I also hope, if you have school-age children, that you will take a look at our school, perhaps this week, even today during the school's open house (Sunday, the 25th, 12 to 2pm).

For the last item, this week I could talk about pro-life and other issues and our new state administration, but I'll save that for next week's bulletin. Instead, this week I want to report on the Town Hall meeting conducted by the diocese here on the evening of the 15th. Attendance was very decent, at least 75 people. Ward Jones and a volunteer were the presenters. They explained that this senior living facility is at this stage only a proposal and that the bishop is very interested in what parishioners think about it. They provided some background on why this is being considered by the diocese. They strongly emphasized that this is all being explored to see if the parish is open to it. They said the meeting would be limited to an hour, but they would stay after it for any further questions. They had about thirty minutes for questions. That part of the night got a bit heated, or as one person commented after the meeting, "it was intense." Many had some concerns about the survey taken in July, the exact location, security issues, timing, and how a gym and rectory would fit into the plan. Ward left just after 10pm, so many further questions were addressed after the meeting ended. Most in attendance seemed to be opposed to the idea, and a few seemed very excited about the possibility of it being here at St. Veronica's. Now we basically wait to see where the diocese will go on this issue and so we pray. *In Christ, Fr. Kleinmann*

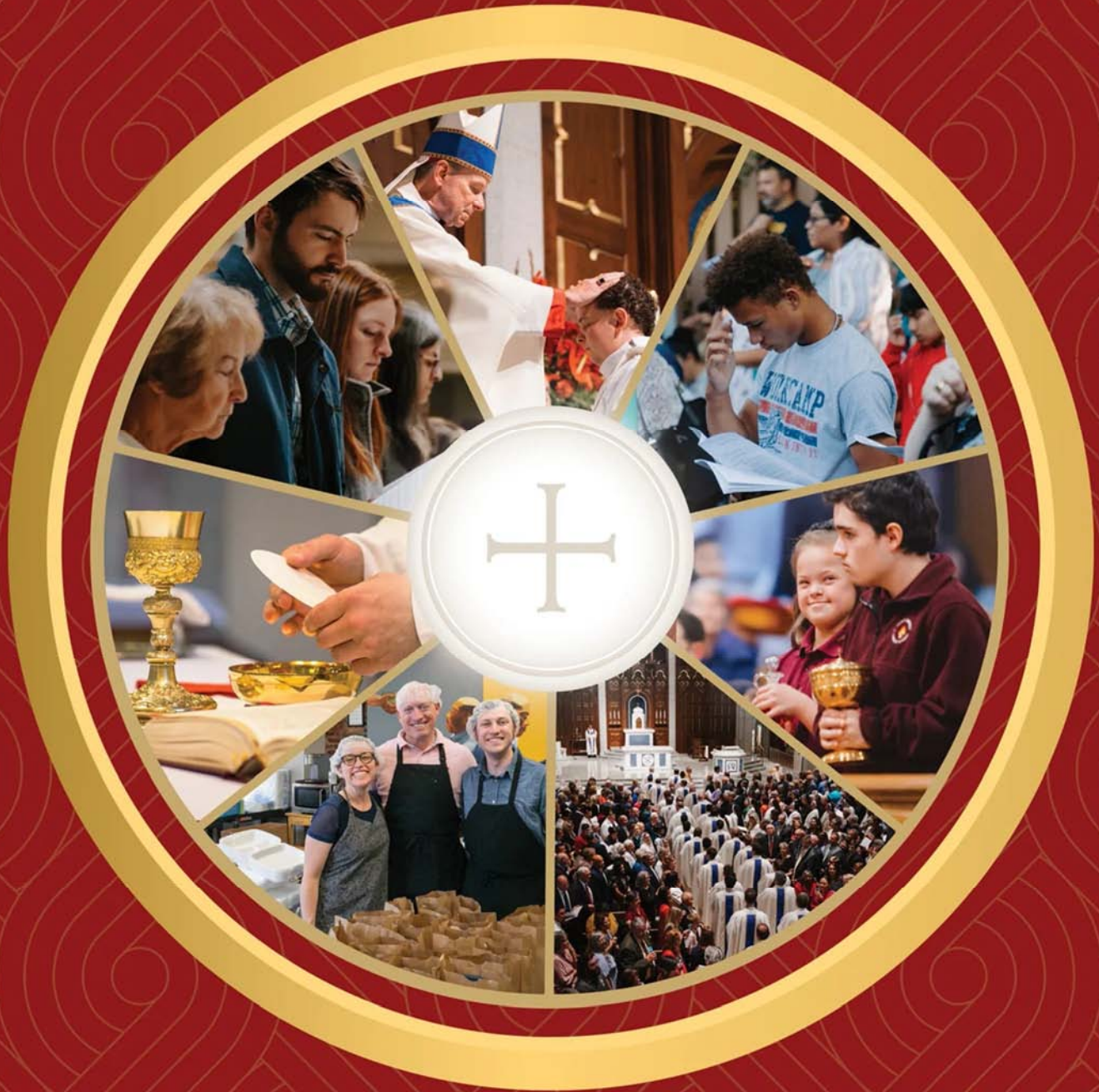
