From the Pastor

FROM GREEN TO GOLD — May 24, 2026

Today we celebrate Pentecost Sunday! Pentecost is the official end of the Easter season and is recognized as the date of the birth of the Church Christ established here on earth to continue His work. That “work” is providing the graces we need to grow in holiness, resist temptation, and avoid sin. That “work” is spreading the good news of salvation to the ends of the world. This is the very mandate Christ gave the Apostles, as we heard last Sunday as we celebrated the Ascension of Our Lord into heaven. Pentecost was the first Confirmation. It is that event when the Apostles, gathered in that Upper Room out of fear after Jesus’ ascension, prayed for nine days (the first novena), and then on the tenth day and fifty days after His resurrection on that first Easter Sunday (Pentecost means fiftieth), had the Holy Spirit come upon them, as Jesus promised He would do. They received the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit, forever changing their lives. Their fears were dispelled, their courage was unbelievable, they were phenomenal missionaries, witnesses, for Christ. They were able and willing to endure considerable suffering for Our Lord. They acted with authority and confidence. They preached the Truth of Christ and wanted everyone they encountered to know and live the Christian/Catholic faith. This is one of the three great feasts of the Church, along with Christmas and Easter. What a joy to celebrate this day and happy birthday to the Church!

This day, this feast of Pentecost, is another one of the real treasures of our Faith and is a tremendous gift to us. It is worthy of celebration. We are so blessed to have Christ as our Savior, to have His Church to dispense His graces to us, and to have the Holy Spirit guide us. It is in the Church that we find a place of refuge and comfort from the difficulties and burdens of life. It is through the Church that we receive the Eucharist. It was only two weeks ago that our second graders received their First Holy Communion. As I reported last week here many joined us on Mother’s Day to receive their second Holy Communion and to honor our Heavenly Mother. Then on the following Friday, May 15th, those enrolled in our school attended Mass and received their third Holy Communion. They wore their First Communion dresses (girls) and coats and ties (boys). I am very pleased to report that all those First Communicants who received Our Eucharistic Lord from me, about half the class, received kneeling and on the tongue. That brought great joy to my heart, but sadly, very few wore their First Communion clothes on the following Sunday (last Sunday, the 17th). There may have been more, but I only noticed two or three that did. On a more joyous note, again, but with some great sadness as well, this past Monday, the 18th, there was a funeral Mass at St. Timothy’s for two-year-old Sean Wise. As some of you heard, this little one is the grandson of two of our long-time, very involved parishioners. Their son and his wife and six children are members at St. Timothy’s. Sean was killed two weeks ago, having been run over by a car. Obviously, this is an extremely difficult situation. Thankfully however, at that age and having been baptized, Sean went straight to heaven. That Mass of Christian Burial then was really more for his family. It was a beautiful Mass with ten priests concelebrating, 35 altar boys present, and nearly a full church. The Mass was a great moment of grace and, I dare say, joy, coupled with sadness of course. Such is our Faith, again what a gift! Please pray for the Wise family, while invoking the intercession of Sean. We really are so blessed to be Catholic, and that is what we celebrate on this Pentecost Sunday. Just a reminder as well that now with the end of the Easter season, we return to Ordinary Time. Next Sunday, however, is a significant feast, the solemnity of the Holy Trinity and the following Sunday, June 7th, is the solemnity of Corpus Christi, when we focus on that gift of the Eucharist and will have our annual Eucharistic procession. Please plan to join us and pray for good weather, if that is God’s will.

One last item this week, last Sunday with anticipation of the 250th anniversary of our founding as a nation, a day long prayer rally was held on the National Mall in D.C. It was rather patriotic and highly evangelical. There was a strong Protestant flair to the speeches, prayers, and worship music. An Orthodox rabbi spoke, as did Cardinal Dolan and Bishop Barron, adding both a Jewish and Catholic element to the day. The event caused some controversy with claims it was too political and that the more progressive voices weren’t among the official participants. There may be some truth to that, but sadly these other voices often seem to be less patriotic and very critical of our nation. There’s no doubt the United States has over its 250 years at times been far from a perfect nation. But that said, we are a country that believes in religious liberty and works to protect the God given freedoms to which every human person is entitled. That in itself caused a bit of a stir and some backlash when House Speaker Mike Johnson in his prayer said, “our rights do not derive from the government, they come from You, our Creator and Heavenly Father.” This was seen as “heresy” by those who lack faith in God and saw this as an affront to their beliefs. They are certainly entitled to their opinion, that is what freedom of speech is all about, but our Declaration of Independence, one of the three founding documents of our nation, specifically says, “We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain inalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty, and the pursuit of Happiness.” Additionally, Speaker Johnson was taken to task for saying we are in a spiritual battle, but sadly, we are, and to think otherwise is to our own detriment. So, we need to pray, as the Speaker also said we should. *In Christ, Fr. Kleinmann*

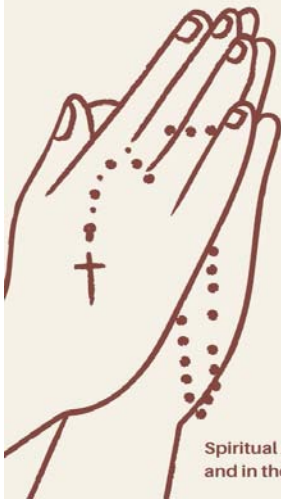
