From the Pastor

FROM GREEN TO GOLD — May 31, 2026

As we conclude the month of May, the month the Church dedicates to Our Lady, we have also concluded the Easter season and now find ourselves again in Ordinary Time. Additionally, this past Monday was Memorial Day, a national holiday, a day off for many, certainly for our school and parish staff, and hopefully for all of you. I didn't comment on that day here last week. This day seems to be the unofficial beginning of summer. The actual summer season doesn't begin until June 21st, which is a Sunday and Father's Day. But typically, Memorial Day is seen as the point when school is soon ending, many parish programs are wrapping up, and the days are a bit more relaxed. Here at St. Veronica's CCD and OCIA have definitely ended for the year and our parish school's last day is June 10th, a week and a half from now. Many of the other parish groups take the summer off as well. Generally speaking, summer is a time for family vacations and an opportunity to enjoy life perhaps more without all the commitments of the rest of the year. On Monday, as it was a holiday, we had only the 8:30 am Mass, no confessions, no noon Mass, no Adoration, and the parish office was closed. There were a sizable number of people at the morning Mass, which was a pleasure to see.

Memorial Day is when we as a nation honor all of those who have served our country and have died defending the rights and freedoms of America. This goes back to my discussion here in this column last week when I was commenting on the prayer rally in D.C. on May 17th, which was part of the celebration of the 250th birthday of our nation, which is this July 4th. We should love our nation, which is why patriotism is a Christian virtue, one we all should practice. As Deacon Ochenkowski said during his homily this past Monday, on Memorial Day we honor courage, another Christian virtue. Obviously, we need to courageously defend our Church and her teachings, as well as our country. As I also said last week here, no doubt our nation is not perfect and there are many things for which we need to pray. We do need to be humble and faithful to the dignity of human life, especially to that of the unborn, and to the dignity of marriage between a man and a woman, as God has deigned. These are sadly two areas on which America has not always, or even currently, stood strong. Even more sadly, as has been discussed here previously and will be again in the near future, Virginia is a battleground for these topics right now and so there is much to be done to correct these atrocities. We cannot be last or complacent, we need to act, spiritually and politically, as these are huge moral issues.

On the lighter side of things, mindful of the upcoming summer months, we will have a seminarian with us again starting June 8th through August 9th. The seminarian from our parish, Thomas Patchen, was with us last weekend and through this past week. He is assigned to St. Charles Borromeo Parish in Arlington for the summer. He recently concluded his first year in the seminary. He was part of the reasonably new yearlong Propaedeutic program. This is nine months of rather intense prayer, as the seminarian tries to detach from the world and focus more on deepening his relationship to and love for Christ. This will help him once he is a priest to be truly a man of prayer, who is truly dedicated to Christ and the mission that the Church mandates to him, being celibate and sacrificial, all in service to Christ, His Church, and His people. Andrew Lee also just finished that program, and he is the seminarian who will be with us for the summer. Please pray for both Thomas and Andrew.

Also, a few other items, as a reminder, today is the feast of the Holy Trinity and next Sunday is the feast of Corpus Christi. That is the day of our Eucharistic Procession as well. On Saturday, June 6th, seven men will be ordained priests for our diocese at St. Thomas More Cathedral in Arlington. The diocesan festival is on June 13th in Berryville. The next Parish Council meeting is on Thursday, June 11th, at 7:30 pm. On Monday, June 22nd, we will have another Seniors' breakfast at IHOP after the 8:30 am Mass. We are still searching for a new music director, facilities manager, and school principal, although that process by the grace of God hopefully should be completed soon. I do ask for your prayers for all three of these positions. We have been very blessed, but that said, we also continue to face some serious financial concerns and so these three are all part of that wider picture. We want to continue to have a truly sacred and outstanding music program.

We need another facilities person who can manage all the issues we have had with our building and control the costs associated with that. We further want a principal who has the ability to help our school be a powerhouse when it comes to our Faith, to academics, and really a place where Christ is present in all we do. These are some tall orders, but necessary as well, so please pray for all of this. And finally, I didn't mention sports at all here last week, and this week I will only say that my Brewers had been doing great, but last weekend dropped two of three games to the "mighty" Dodgers. They were playing St. Louis this past Monday through Wednesday. Milwaukee was first in their division with the Cardinals right behind them. As always, with football, baseball, and our faith, we can never give up, need to remain hopeful, persevere, and trust completely in Our Lord. God bless us all and may the Blessed Mother and St. Veronica intercede for us.

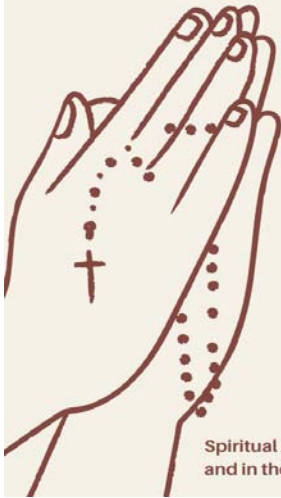
