From the Pastor

FROM GREEN TO GOLD — July 5, 2026

On this day after Independence Day when as a nation we celebrated our 250th birthday, I am going to start with the mundane and progress to more serious matters. I still don't have much to say about the Green Bay Packers. They are preparing for training camp, as all NFL teams are. There has been some news, but mostly speculation of how the season will shake out, so I'll reserve comments about that until I actually know more. I will mention one NBA item. As many know I'm not a huge basketball fan. My team is the Milwaukee Bucks, but they are third on my list after the Packers and Brewers. The big news concerning the Bucks is from a couple of weeks ago when they traded away their star player, Giannis Antetokounmpo. He was drafted by the Bucks in 2013. He's from Greece; his parents are Nigerian. He had a great first season but needed improvement, which certainly came. He developed into a phenomenal player and added tremendous excitement to the Milwaukee team, which desperately needed that. It culminated in the Bucks winning the NBA championship against the Phoenix Suns in Game 6 on July 20th in 2021, their first in 50 years. Giannis was the star and received the Finals MVP award. He was known as the "Greek Freak" because of his size, speed, and strength. Unfortunately, the Bucks couldn't duplicate that winning formula and now five years later, Giannis is gone, traded to the Miami Heat team, and another era is over. On the other hand, the Brewers keep plodding ahead. They had a wonderful week but a mixed weekend when they lost the series to their chief rival, the Chicago Cubs. The Brewers had won five straight and had beaten the Cubs six times this season but lost both Saturday and Sunday last weekend. Their starting pitching was superb, but the bullpen kind of fell apart. Hopefully, this past week was better again and therein is the spiritual lesson. Like the Bucks, we can never rest on our laurels spiritually. Like the Brewers we need to "start" well, but more importantly, "finish" well. We should never take our eternal salvation for granted. It is something we must work on every day until we die. Christ demands this of us, and if we can do that with His grace heaven indeed will be ours someday!

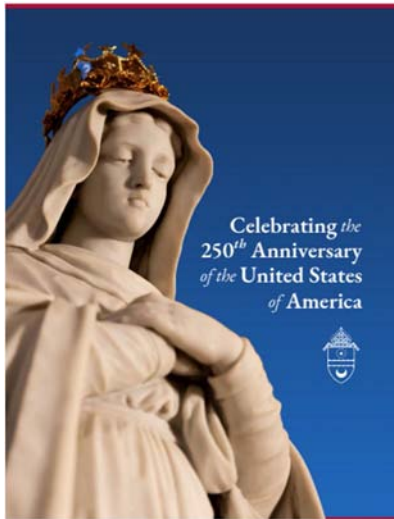
Helping us live holy lives are the sacraments along with a solid prayer life and our works of mercy or charity. Last weekend involved the July 4th holiday. It fell on a Saturday this year meaning the federal holiday was Friday. As that was First Friday and not the Fourth, we decided to not follow our usual federal holiday schedule. Instead, we followed our usual First Friday schedule. My hope was that this wasn't too confusing. Consistency is good, but we wanted to provide the sacraments which again help our pursuit of holiness and the glory of heaven someday. So, we had the 8:30 am, 12:15 pm, and 7:30 pm Masses on July 3rd along with the 9 am, 11:30 am, and 6:30 pm confessions. On Saturday, the 4th, being First Saturday, we also had our usual schedule with the First Saturday reflection, presented by our seminarian, Andrew Lee, and the typical Saturday Mass and confession schedule. I do hope you found that helpful. Next Sunday is our parish's patronal feast day. July 12th is the feast of St. Veronica and therefore takes precedence over the Fifteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time for us. We will have our usual Forty Hours devotion leading up to the feast. That starts this Friday evening (the 10th) with a Mass at 7:30 pm. Adoration follows and continues through Sunday morning, ending with Benediction at 7:15 am that morning. Following the 10:45 am Mass there will be a parish celebration of our feast coupled with the annual Pro-Life Apostolate's Celebrate Life Picnic. That makes for a very busy weekend but allows us to celebrate our treasured Faith and honor our parish patroness, St. Veronica.

Before closing and as promised last week here, I wanted to mention the significance of July 4th. Obviously, this day is important to our nation, politically and otherwise, but it is also quite important to our Faith. Sadly, America has had her moments that have not been stellar morally. Abortion is still present and pro-life restrictions on this tragedy are often challenged, including right here in Virginia. Same sex marriage and the gender issues also continue to be a black mark on our American society. Historically, there have been decisions that were far from where God would have wanted us to go. Yet our Founding Fathers provided us with a framework which provides great freedoms, many of which are not present in many other countries. Our freedoms here do not come from the government but from God Himself and the government then has a duty to protect these freedoms for us and to allow us to exercise them. These freedoms include the right to practice our Faith, the right to express our opinions without censorship, the right to assemble peacefully in a church or to protest something that isn't morally right. It also includes the freedom of the press, which is the right to publish our opinions, the right to keep and bear arms, the right to due process and to a speedy trial, and the right to vote. It is interesting that the very first amendment to the U.S. Constitution ensures us this religious liberty. That helps the Catholic Church have a strong presence and hopefully an influential one here in America. We are blessed, but we don't want to take these freedoms for granted. There have been challenges in the past and there will be in the future. We need to pray for our country and its leadership that it always protects and upholds these rights and respects all that is good and holy. May Our Lord continue to bless America and all of us.

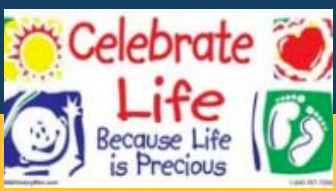
