SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Baptisms are usually celebrated on the first and third Sunday of each month following the 11:00 AM Mass. **Registered parishioners** wishing to have their child baptized should call the Parish Office 908-454-0444, and, at that time, basic information will be taken.

QUALIFICATIONS FOR GODPARENTS AND CONFIRMATION SPONSORS

Godparents and Confirmation Sponsors must be at least 14 years of age, have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation, must attend Mass regularly and, if married, their marriage **must** be recognized by the Catholic Church. These requirements are the universal law of the Church, and are not determined by the individual parish. If the person you choose as godparent or sponsor fulfills these requirements, they are asked to furnish a statement from their Parish that they are indeed eligible to be a sponsor. **PLEASE ALSO PROVIDE VERIFICATION OF CONFIRMATION WITH THE REQUEST.** A father or mother may not act as sponsor for their own child.

All requests for Sponsor Eligibility Letters are to be made well in advance of the reception of the Sacrament and will be by appointment in the Parish Office. **PLEASE PROVIDE VERIFICATION OF CONFIRMATION WITH YOUR REQUEST.** Thank you.

Welcome Our New Parishioners

Every family moving into the parish should register by obtaining a census form from either the priest or deacon **after any weekend Mass (in Church).**

Registration is required for all parish services and sponsor eligibility forms. Sunday worship on a regular basis is the sign of a practicing Catholic.

Any young adult 21 years of age or older living at home should register in the parish separately. Any young adult over the age of 21 NOT registered on their own will not be eligible to be a sponsor.



EASTER SUNDAY OF THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD

First Reading: Acts 10:34a, 37-43

In this passage, Peter testifies that he and his followers saw the miracles performed by Christ, witnessed His death, and believe in His resurrection. Now they will proclaim to all that Christ is the Son of God.

Second Reading: Colossians 3:1-4

Paul tells the Colossians that they will appear with Christ in glory. They should be mindful of things above rather than things on earth.

Gospel: John 20:1-9

In vivid detail, John tells us that when Mary Magdalene visited Christ's tomb, the tomb was empty. She told the apostles, who ran to the tomb, and saw the "wrappings" on the ground. The disciple who entered first "saw and believed."


