

Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

2 Kgs 5:14-17 | 2 Tim 2:8-13 | Lk 17:11-19

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

After his healing in the Jordan river, Naaman returns to Elisha. It's clear from their ensuing conversation that his miraculous healing had led to him recognizing the God of Israel as the one who had healed him. In thanksgiving, he desires to offer sacrifice, and pledges that he "will no longer offer holocaust or sacrifice to any other god except the Lord." In the Gospel, we see the Samaritan returning to Jesus after his healing, falling at the Lord's feet and "glorifying God in a loud voice." It's clear from both Scriptures that when we recognize what God has done for us, our first response is to worship. That's why our central act of worship as a Christian community is called Eucharist - from the Greek word for thanksgiving. When we come to worship God, what is it that we're grateful for? If gratitude is the heart of worship, it's a fruitful practice to intentionally spend some time considering God's providence in our lives over the past week so we come to the liturgy prepared to offer thanks.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Something that has always struck me about today's Gospel is that Jesus heals all ten of the lepers, not only the one who returned to offer thanks. While we, as humans, can be tempted to withhold love when we know it will not be acknowledged or appreciated, Jesus heals all ten. God is good to us, even when we're ungrateful. As Paul says, "If we are unfaithful he remains faithful, for he cannot deny himself." God can do only one thing: love. How powerful would it be if we worked to imitate the kind of gratuitous love we see in today's Gospel? Think about opportunities to practice this kind of love. What a witness this would be to the world if we were to imitate God's way of loving. As the Persian poet Hafiz wrote: "Even after all this time, the sun never says to the earth, 'You owe me.' Look what happens with a love like that. It lights the whole sky."

REFLECT

Take some time before Mass each Sunday to do an examine-style prayer, reflecting on where you've seen God's action in your life during the week. How has God provided for your needs? How has God accompanied you through challenges? How has the Spirit of God brought consolation and strength? Make a list of all the places you've experienced God's presence and grace and prepare to offer thanks to God for these gifts at Mass.

From the Pastor's Desk



Dear Brothers and Sisters

In today's Gospel, Jesus heals ten lepers who cry out to Him for mercy. As they go on their way, they are cleansed-but only one returns to give thanks. And that one, Jesus tells us, is a Samaritan.

"Has none but this foreigner returned to give thanks to God?" (Luke 17:18) This story reveals something profound about the nature of faith and gratitude.

Healing is freely given

Naaman, in the First Reading, obeys the prophet's command to wash in the Jordan River. When he emerges healed, he proclaims, "Now I know that there is no God in all the earth but in Israel."

Like Naaman, the ten lepers receive healing purely as a gift of God's mercy-not because they earned it. Each of us has known this grace in our lives: the quiet ways God restores our peace, heals our relationships, or renews our strength.

Gratitude transforms

Only one of the ten returns to thank Jesus, and that act of gratitude becomes the moment of true salvation. Jesus tells him, "Stand up and go; your faith has saved you."

Gratitude turns a physical healing into a spiritual encounter. It turns a blessing into worship. When we stop to thank God, we are reminded that our lives depend on His goodness, not our accomplishments.

How easy it is to be like the nine-too busy, too distracted, or too accustomed to grace. Yet, when we choose gratitude, everything changes. Our hearts become lighter, our perspective wider, and our faith deeper.

Reflection Questions for the Week

- 1. When have I received a blessing from God and forgotten to say "thank you"?
- 2. Who in my life reminds me to live with gratitude and humility?
- 3. How can I help someone who feels like an "outsider" experience God's mercy this week?
- 4.Do I see gratitude as part of my daily prayer life-or only something I offer occasionally?

Prayer for the Week

Lord Jesus, open my eyes to the blessings around me.

May I never take Your gifts for granted.


Help me to be like the Samaritan who returned—

DEDICATION OF A MASS

The dedication of a Mass is a special way to express support, sympathy, and care for the ill and the deceased. The Catholic Church has a long-standing tradition of commemorating and praying for those who have passed during the liturgy, mentioning their names in the Prayer of the Faithful. Our parish offers a variety of Mass intention schedules.

DIFFERENT TYPES OF MASS INTENTIONS

Singular Mass \$20

If you would like a Mass said for a deceased person, for a special need or occasion, or in thanksgiving, we are honored to pray with you for your intention.

Novena Mass Series \$130

This series includes nine Masses celebrated consecutively. A Novena is an act of religious devotion originating in ancient Christianity, often consisting of private or public prayers repeated for nine successive days, hoping to obtain special intercessory graces.

Gregorian Mass Series \$450

The Gregorian series of Masses are celebrated over 30 consecutive days. **The Masses must be offered ONLY for one deceased person.** As you can appreciate, we need extra time to arrange these Masses.

GREGORIAN MASS SERIES

Gregorian Masses are a series of Holy Masses traditionally offered on 30 consecutive days as soon as possible after a person's death. They are offered for one individual soul. The custom of offering Gregorian Masses for a particular soul recognizes that few people are immediately ready for heaven after death, and that, through the infinite intercessory power of Christ's sacrifice, made present in Holy Mass, a soul can be continually perfected in grace and enabled to enter finally into the union with the Most Holy Trinity – our God, Who is Love Itself.

Gregorian Masses take their name from Saint Gregory the Great, who was sovereign Pontiff from 590 to 604. St. Gregory the Great contributed to the spread of the pious practice of having these Masses celebrated for the deliverance of the souls from purgatory. In his Dialogues, he tells us that he had Masses on thirty consecutive days offered for the repose of the soul of Justus, a monk who had died in the convent of St. Andrew in Rome. At the end of the thirtieth Mass, the deceased appeared to one of his fellow monks and announced that he had been delivered from the flames of Purgatory.

What is Guided Meditation?

Meditation, or contemplation, is a form of prayer that invites us to encounter God through our imagination, while being led with a story.

It engages both the mind and heart, using our thoughts and emotions to deepen our awareness of God's Presence in our lives. We begin with quiet music, deep breathing, and relaxation, stilling our minds so we can be open to the grace to be led by our loying God.

FSAINT PIER GIORGIO FRASSATI: HIS LIFE AND LEGACY

Saint Pier Giorgio Frassati (6 April 1901 – 4 July 1925) is one of the Church's newest models of youthful holiness. He was canonized on 7 September 2025 by Pope Leo XIV, alongside Carlo Acutis, and is now venerated as a saint in the universal Church.

EARLY LIFE

- Pier Giorgio was born in Turin, Italy, into a prominent family: his father, Alfredo Frassati, was a journalist and senator; his mother, Adélaïde Ametis, was an artist.
- Although raised in relative comfort, he was drawn early on to prayer, the sacraments, and concern for the poor. He joined Catholic Action and the Society of Saint Vincent de Paul to channel his energy into helping those in need.
- He was also passionate about outdoor adventure: hiking, mountaineering, skiing — a love that symbolized his spiritual motto, Verso l'alto ("To the heights").

CHARACTER & VIRTUES

Saint Pier Giorgio exemplified many virtues:

- Charity: He regularly distributed his own money, clothing, and resources to those in need.
- Humility & simplicity: He preferred to live modestly, often hiding his works of charity and seeking to serve without seeking honor.
- Zeal for God: He maintained a deep love for the Eucharist and frequent prayer, combining his active life with spiritual discipline.
- Courage & consistency: Even amid social pressures, he stood firm in his convictions and lived his faith boldly among friends and peers.

Death, Miracles & Canonization

- Pier Giorgio died in 1925 at just 24 years old, suffering from polio, which some sources suggest he contracted while serving the sick.
- Over the decades, devotion to him grew. In 1990, Pope John Paul II beatified him, calling him "the man of the eight beatitudes."

- In the cause toward sainthood, two miracles were recognized: one earlier (already tied to his beatification) and one more recently, which paved the way for his canonization.
- Finally, on 7 September 2025, Saint Pier Giorgio Frassati was formally canonized at St. Peter's Square, joining the ranks of saints as a layman and a youth figure for the modern world.
- His liturgical memorial is observed on 4 July, the date of his death

Saint Pier Giorgio now holds patronage over youth, mountaineers, students, and young adults, making him an especially fitting intercessor and example for those in the age group 21-35.

A NEW BEGINNING: THE INSPIRATION BEHIND "THE HEIGHTS YOUNG ADULTS"

As your pastor, I have long been moved by the vibrant witness of Saint Pier Giorgio Frassati. He wasn't a priest or consecrated religious, but a layperson who infused everyday life with holiness. He shows us that young adults can be fervent disciples, serving Christ and neighbor with joy and authenticity.

His canonization makes this example even more potent and timely. At this moment, our parish is responding to that call by launching a young adult group for ages 21–35, which we will name The Heights Young Adults — echoing Frassati's own Verso l'alto. Our aim is to journey upward together in faith and friendship, with:

Prayer, Formation, Service, and Fellowship.

This group is a way to live out the legacy of Saint Pier Giorgio: intentional, bold, relational, and rooted in Christ.

We plan to begin gatherings in mid-October. More details will be shared during the second part of October, so please watch the bulletin, website, and notices after Masses. I invite all young adults in our parish to pray about joining this new community. Together, we

can climb higher in faith, support one another, and make a difference verso l'alto!
