Second Sunday of Advent

Is 11:1-10 | Rom 15:4-9 | Mt 3:1-12

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Today's Gospel is a challenging one, inviting us to consider how much spiritual fruit we are bearing in our lives. St. John the Baptist tells us, "Produce good fruit as evidence of your repentance," reminding us that the depth of our conversion will be measured by our fruit. Speaking to the Pharisees and Sadducees, John says it is not enough to say that "We have Abraham as our father." If he were speaking today, John might put it this way: it's not enough to say "I'm Catholic!" or "I belong to X Parish." Our lives must show outward evidence of the inward conversion we have undergone. The good news for us today is that we can pause and take stock of how well we are bearing spiritual fruit. Pay attention to what areas might need pruning or fertilizing to ensure that when we come to the Lord's threshing floor at the end of our lives. there is a bountiful harvest he can gather into his barn.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Our first reading gives us a glimpse of God's kingdom: The Son of David will rule with wisdom, understanding, counsel, and knowledge, judging "the poor with justice" and striking "the ruthless with the rod of his mouth." In his kingdom "the wolf shall be a guest of the lamb" and yet "there shall be no harm or ruin." What a poetic way of describing the harmony and wholeness that God longs for in society! As disciples, this is our mission. We're called to work so that God's kingdom vision can become reality. As we work for peace and justice, we're doing our part in the Church's work of evangelization. As the U.S. bishops reminded us in their letter *Communities of Salt and Light*, "social justice is an integral part of evangelization, a constitutive dimension of preaching the Gospel, and an essential part of the Church's mission."

REFLECT

In the Gospel, John the Baptist says of Jesus, "He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and with fire." Our ability to bear spiritual fruit comes from the power of the Holy Spirit within us. Take a moment to reflect on where you see the gifts (see the first reading from Isaiah!) and fruits of the Holy Spirit in your life. How might the Spirit of God be working to increase your spiritual fruitfulness this Advent?

YEAR-END CHARITABLE GIVING AND TAX BENEFITS



As we approach the end of the calendar year, many parishioners consider ways to express gratitude for God's blessings through charitable giving.

Supporting Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish before December 31 not only strengthens our mission but may also provide valuable tax benefits.

1. Timing Matters

To qualify for a 2025 tax deduction, all charitable contributions must be made by December 31, 2025.

- Online donations must be completed by 11:59 p.m. on December 31.
- Checks must be dated and postmarked no later than December 31.
- Cash gifts must be received in the parish office or offertory collection before year-end.

2. Documentation

For tax purposes, the IRS requires proper documentation:

- Keep your bank or credit card record, or parish contribution statement as proof of donation.
- For single donations of \$250 or more, the parish will issue a written acknowledgment.
- You will receive a year-end summary statement from the parish in January for your records.

3. Other Types of Gifts

In addition to cash or online donations, you may wish to consider:

- Gifts of Stock or Securities:
 Donating appreciated investments may allow you to avoid capital gains tax and claim a charitable deduction.
- Qualified Charitable
 Distributions (QCDs):
 Individuals age 70½ or older
 can donate directly from an
 IRA to the parish, satisfying
 part or all of the required
 minimum distribution (RMD)
- Employer Matching Gifts:
 Many employers will match charitable contributions to registered nonprofits. Check with your HR department for details.

(Please consult your financial or tax advisor to determine what's best for your situation.)

Giving deepens our trust in God. When we give freely, we acknowledge that all we have is a gift from God. Scripture reminds us:

"For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be." – Matthew 6:21

From the Pastor's Desk Second Sunday of Advent

The Second Sunday of Advent places before us one of the most beloved figures of the season: John the Baptist. In today's Gospel (Mark 1:1–8), John appears in the wilderness with a simple but urgent message: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths." His voice echoes the promise from Isaiah in our first reading—words spoken to a weary people longing for renewal: "Comfort, give comfort to my people." Advent asks us to hold these two themes together—comfort and preparation. God draws near with tenderness, like a shepherd gathering lambs, yet He also invites us to examine what in our lives needs to be made straight, cleared, or surrendered so His grace may enter more freely.

St. Peter, in today's second reading, reminds us that the Lord is patient, desiring that none be lost. That divine patience is not permission to become stagnant: rather, it is an invitation to live each day with purpose, striving to be found "without spot or blemish" when the Lord comes. Advent is not merely about waiting, but about preparing with integrity, humility, and expectation.

This week also holds a moment of national remembrance. December 7 marks the anniversary of the attack on Pearl Harbor—a day that continues to call us to prayer for peace, healing, and a world shaped by justice. As we listen to John the Baptist call for hearts made ready, we also remember that the work of preparing the way of the Lord includes our commitment to peace in our families, communities, and nation. Daily life often feels crowded—full of tasks, worries, and noise. Advent gently inserts a pause. In that pause, we hear the Baptist's cry. What paths need straightening? What valleys of discouragement need to be lifted? What rough edges—impatience, unkindness, resentment—need smoothing so Christ may walk freely into our hearts?

As we light the second candle on the Advent wreath, may it be a sign of deepening readiness: a growing light that guides us toward the One who desires to bring comfort, forgiveness, and renewal to every corner of our lives.



Reflection Questions for the Week

- · Where do I most need God's comfort in my life right now?
- · What "rough ways" or habits might I smooth out to welcome Christ more fully?
- How can I be a voice of peace and reconciliation in my family, workplace, or community?
- What practical step can I take each day this week to prepare interiorly for Christmas?

Prayer for the Week

Lord God, as You send John the Baptist to prepare Your way, open my heart to the comfort and challenge of Your Word. Smooth what is rough, lift what is low, and straighten what has become crooked in my life. Help me walk in holiness and peace, ready to welcome Your Son with renewed joy. Amen.

SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT WRAP YOUR GIFTS IN PRAYER

Unwrap the gift of God in Prayer. In the midst of Advent and Christmas busyness, we offer you a way to pray and to discover our God who is with us. Each season the preparation for Christmas can be a source of stress. This year can be different. Our Christmas practice of gift giving, card sending, and social media greetings are intended to be a visible symbol of love and Christian service in action. Why not use our gift-giving and greetings as a form of prayer? Wrapping your gift in prayer can add a spiritual dimension to ordinary tasks.

As you choose your gift or craft the words for your communication, ask for God's guidance and bring a prayerful awareness to the exchange. When you wrap your gift or compose your greeting, pray for the recipient. Ask God to fill them with light, faith, hope, love, and the peace of Christmas.



YOUR GIFT IS WRAPPED IN PRAYER - PRAYER PRACTICES

Choose from the prayer guide below, or pray in your own way.

Imagine - visualize the person for whom you pray. Picture the Lord blessing them.

Speak - pray aloud, "Lord surround (name) with your light, fill (name) with your peace."

Speak - pray aloud, "Lord surround (name) with your light, fill (name) with your peace." Sing - a Christmas carol.

Gesture - dedicate the use of your hand motions in wrapping as your prayer.

Hear - simply repeat the person's name knowing that the Lord hears our every prayer.


