

Fifth Sunday of Lent

First Reading: Jeremiah 31:31-34

The Lord comforted his people, who were exiled to Babylon, by telling them of the new covenant he planned to make with them. The Lord declared he would write his law upon their hearts, and that he would forgive their evil and forget the sins they had committed in the past.

Second Reading: Hebrews 5:7-9

Though God could have heeded his Son's prayers and spared him suffering, Jesus accepted his Fathers will. Through his suffering, he learned obedience and became the source of eternal salvation for all people.

Gospel: John 12:20-33

Jesus was afraid of the suffering he knew he must face. Yet he explained just as a grain of wheat must die to be harvested, he had to face his hour of suffering to glorify his Father's name. Jesus explained that once he was lifted from earth, he could draw all people to himself, lifting them to eternal life.

2024 Lenten Regulations

The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The Other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence. On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted. Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast. On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence. The obligation to observe the laws of fast and abstinence "substantially", or as a whole, is a serious obligation. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.

The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the First Sunday of Lent February 18th to the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, May 26th, 2024.

The Code of Canon Law (can 1294) allows the Pastor to grant in individual cases and for a just cause a dispensation from the Specified obligations.

SAN JUAN 12,20-33

En aquel tiempo había allí, en medio de la gente, varios griegos que habían subido a Jerusalén para adorar a Dios en esta fiesta. Se acercaron a Felipe, que era de Betsaida, en Galilea, para pedirle un favor: “Señor, queremos ver a Jesús”. Felipe habló con Andrés, y los dos fueron donde Jesús para decirselo. Por toda respuesta Jesús declaró: “Ha llegado la hora en que el Hijo del Hombre va a entrar a su gloria. En verdad os digo **si el grano de trigo no cae en tierra y no muere, queda solo; pero si muere, da mucho fruto.**”

El que ama su vida la destruye, y el que desprecia su vida en este mundo la conserva para la vida eterna. **El que quiere servirme, que me siga, y donde yo esté, allí estará el que me sirve.** Si alguien me sirve, mi Padre le dará honor. Padre, ¡da gloria a tu nombre!” Entonces se oyó una voz que venía del cielo: “Yo lo he glorificado y lo volveré a glorificar”. Y cuando Yo haya sido levantado de la tierra, atraeré a todos a mí”. Jesús daba a entender así de qué modo iba a morir.
