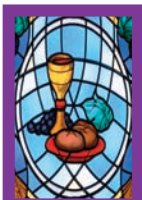

First Reading: Acts 9:26-31

Paul the Apostle came to Jerusalem, where the other disciples were afraid of him. Then they learned that the Lord had spoken to Paul, and he had preached openly in Damascus. When they learned that someone wanted to kill him, they protected him because they fully believed he had converted.

Second Reading: 1 John 3:18-24

John clearly states that we must love one another. All people who believe in Jesus Christ can show their faith only through their actions. If people believe in Jesus and love one another as he commanded us, they prove that they are true believers in Christ.

Gospel: John 15:1-8

Jesus compares himself to a vine and compares his father to the vine-grower. He explains how God prunes the barren branches so that the rest might yield more fruit. He reminds them that apart from himself, his followers could not bear fruit.

A Message from Msgr. Richard

Dear Parishioners,

As some of you may have noticed, the severe wind and rain storm we had several weeks ago significantly damaged the main church Mass times sign at the corner of Mt. Vernon & Euclid and loosened a number of roof tiles on the west side of the church. Our Director of Physical Plant, Richie LaTour, has been carefully working on repairing the sign, and I’ve approved a contract to have the roof tiles secured or replaced. Together the cost is almost \$10,000.00, which coincidentally happens to be the same amount as the insurance deductible, so it is an expense which the parish will have to bear on its own. Your faithful and consistent generosity will help us meet this unforeseen expense.

Today’s Gospel about the vine and the branches reminds us how intimately connected we should be with Jesus and at the same time with one another. The love that flows to us from Jesus is meant to be shared with all and among all. When we fail to exercise a loving concern for someone else, we are effectively removing ourselves from His life-giving grace. For whatever we do or fail to do to others, we do or not do for Christ!

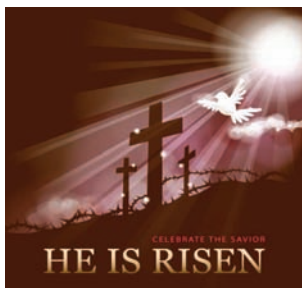
APRIL IS AUTISM ACCEPTANCE MONTH

Mensaje de Mons. Richard

Queridos feligreses,

Como algunos de ustedes habrán notado, el fuerte viento y la tormenta de lluvia que tuvimos hace varias semanas dañaron significativamente el cartel principal de la iglesia en la esquina del Monte Vernon y Euclid, y aflojaron una serie de tejas en el lado oeste de la iglesia. Nuestro Director de la Planta Física, Richie LaTour, ha estado trabajando cuidadosamente en la reparación del letrero, y he aprobado un contrato para asegurar o reemplazar las tejas del techo. En conjunto, el costo es de casi 10.000,00 dólares, que casualmente es la misma cantidad que el deducible del seguro, por lo que es un gasto que la parroquia tendrá que asumir por su cuenta. Su fiel y constante generosidad nos ayudará a hacer frente a este gasto imprevisto.

El Evangelio de hoy sobre la vid y las ramas nos recuerda lo íntimamente conectados que debemos estar con Jesús y al mismo tiempo los unos con los otros. El amor que fluye hacia nosotros desde Jesús está destinado a ser compartido con todos y entre todos. Cuando no ejercemos una preocupación amorosa por otra persona, nos estamos alejando efectivamente de Su gracia que da vida. ¡Por lo que sea que hagamos o no hagamos a los demás, lo hacemos o no por Cristo!

Domingo 28 de Abril del 2024

SAN JUAN 15,1-8

En aquel tiempo dijo Jesús a sus discípulos: "Yo soy la vid verdadera, y mi Padre el viñador. Si alguna de mis ramas no produce fruto, él la corta; y limpia toda rama que produce fruto, para que dé más. Ustedes ya están limpios. La palabra que les he dirigido los ha purificado. Permanezcan en mí y yo permaneceré en ustedes.



Como la rama no puede producir fruto por sí misma si no permanece en la planta, así tampoco pueden ustedes producir frutos si no permanecen en mí. Si alguien permanece en mí y yo en él, produce mucho fruto, pero sin mí no puede hacer nada. El que no se quede en mí, será arrojado afuera y se secará como ramas muertas: hay que recogerlas y echarlas al fuego, donde arden. Si se quedan en mí, y mis palabras permanecen en ustedes, todo lo que desean lo pedirán y se les concederá. Mi Padre encuentra su gloria en esto: en que ustedes produzcan mucho fruto, llegando a ser con esto mis auténticos discípulos".

REFLEXION DEL EVANGELIO

Para describir la unión íntima con sus discípulos, Jesús usa una comparación del Antiguo Testamento que describe a Israel como la vid de Yahvéh (**Salmo 80:9-20**). Los viñadores eran responsables de ocuparse de que los viñedos crecieran saludables. Cuando las ramas no daban fruto las cortaban y las dejaban secar en las paredes para usarlas más tarde en el fuego. Jesús pone fin a esta etapa de la historia, en que el Reino de Dios se identificaba con el pueblo judío. Cristo es el tronco del que salen las ramas, es decir, todos nosotros que vivimos por él. Pero también él es la planta entera, tronco y ramas juntos: los cristianos somos realmente el Cuerpo de Cristo. Jesús no dice: La comunidad cristiana es la vid y ustedes son las ramas, sino: Yo soy la vid. Lo importante, pues, es que cada uno de nosotros esté vinculado con él por la fe, la oración y el culto de su palabra. Cada uno debe producir frutos. Esto demuestra la intimidad entre Jesús y sus discípulos: sin él no podrán hacer nada. Al prepararlos para la misión, les recuerda que él es la vid verdadera. Las ramas que producen frutos son aquellos que han aceptado la palabra viva de Jesús y permanecen en él.

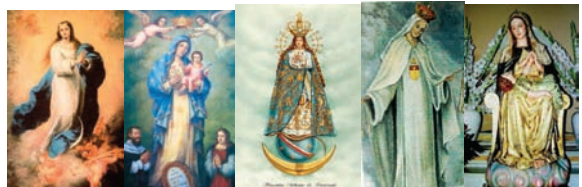
