





## The Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

New Testament: Luke 17:5-10

Luke's Gospel relates what Christ told the Apostles when they had asked Him to increase their faith. Christ resorted to telling them the parable of the mustard seed. Christ told them that having faith the size of a mustard seed theoretically would be powerful enough to tell a mulberry tree to be uprooted and replanted. In other words, it is not the size of one's faith but the perseverance in living out and finishing the job which could be expected of one.

Hence, we do not need excessive faith to do what God needs us to do. Doing that for which we are capable is all we need, *e.g.*, loving God and our neighbor as He has asked us to do. We should just do our job as asked of us, and even if we have just a little faith, it should be all we need. We don't need to crave more and more or achieve accolades. It seem as though Christ is telling us that less might be better. It's not the amount of faith we have, we are just asked to serve and use the faith we have and to serve in the way we believe God asks, or needs us, to serve.

Lord, help us to take even a "mustard seed" size faith and serve You.

## Evangelization Corner

#### **Become Evangelizers**

Jesus wants each one of us to help bring others into His Church so they can learn everything He taught us and have the best shot at going to Heaven.

We need to learn what HE taught accurately, so we can tell others. We can do that by reading the Bible, (get a good Catholic Study bible), going to one of our Bible Studies, paying more attention to the Mass (take a quick look at the booklet in the Pews, Mass for Children, (I just did that and found good info on the what and why of Mass actions), reading books and pamphlets like those in our racks, listening to Catholic CDs, watching Catholic videos, listening to Catholic radio, watching Catholic TV- like EWTN, and going to real Catholic websites. And, watch for our next Basic Apologetics course and join it.

Another way that is overlooked is to join our OCIA program as a refresher course of what the Catechism really teaches. Over the years of my life I did accept some 'truths' that were in fact misunderstandings, so I have been checking things out and correcting those things. There are also some very good websites and blogs – but be sure they are correct, if you see something that doesn't seem accurate, dig in to accurate sites and make sure of what is 'true Jesus teaching'.

In addition to the real teachings of the Church, we also need to look at those horror stories that we all grew up with about terrible Church doings. Some of them are anti-Catholic lies shouted out to crush Catholic teachings. Two obvious examples are the Crusades and Inquisitions, but there are many others too. A real research into History shows we are being buried under fake news by these versions.




#### GOLD and SILVER WEDDING ANNIVERSARY MASS
