



Hello everyone,

It may still happen this year, but I almost cancelled the 7:00 Tuesday Mass this past week forever.

Here is what happened—a week in the life of a pastor with no assistant priest! First of all, retired Rev. Vincent Euk is leaving us at the end of the month for health reasons. We will miss him terribly. If he ever gets well enough again, he is more than welcome back. Father not only covered weekend masses for us but also covered my Thursday day off which includes both the 8:30 Mass and the emergency line, calls that we receive at all hours of the day or night of someone dying and who needs the Sacrament of the Sick/the last rites. Father Euk would cover this very inconvenient and unpredictable emergency line because he lived right here in Holiday City.

My two other retired weekend helpers, Fr. Ed Furrevig and Fr. Peter Filipkowski, both live in other towns. I could not ask Fr. Ed to cover because it is too much driving for him, too much back and forth. Fr. Peter is willing but I did not want him coming to this area two, three times a day which he, too, possibly would have had to do if he had to cover both the mass and the emergency line. That line is more immediately important.

So, Fr. Peter said he would cover the emergency line on my day off which includes the eve before. That left no one for the 8:30 mass. Now, to cancel the 8:30 mass would have effected a far bigger congregation than if I cut the 7:00 on Tuesday, so I was going to switch my day off to Tuesday and cancel the 7.

Now, without Fr. Euk, I was also going to change the Sunday schedule from 4 masses to 3 and the times would have been 8, 10, and 12 noon. I was very upset by all this obviously.

However, then, after making some desperate, stab-in-the-dark phone calls I got in touch with Fr. Ed Reading who, although living in another town and who works, has agreed to commit himself here for weekend masses in place of Fr. Euk, thanks be to God!! So Sunday masses remain the same but did come o so close to being reduced! Then, Fr. Bob Laferrera agreed to take the 8:30 mass on Thursday every week! Again, thanks be to God!-----But, he is away 3 Thursdays in February!! So that had to be dealt with and thankfully both Fr. Ed Reading and Fr. Peter stepped up to cover those 3 Thursday masses. Good men! Amen!

Overall, the prayers you make for our parish and for me continue to bear fruit! I am very thankful to these priests who are willing to serve here and honor us with their presence. Having gone through some serious angst these past 10 days, I feel God is there for us and so I am thankful -- just another week in the life of being the only priest here!


Who Are You?
