

Hello everyone,

On Mondays right after the 8:30 Mass we pray together the <u>Perpetual Novena in Honor of Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal</u>. There are many sentences contained in it that are interesting to think about and pray over, and one is in the opening prayer which ends, "Grant us in the same Spirit to be truly wise and ever to rejoice in His consolation". To be <u>truly</u> wise is also an interesting concept to think about and prayerfully adopt, but it is "consolation" that interests me more today.

The reason is because we all need to be consoled once in a while including priests. The pain and difficulties of life can be so overwhelming at times for all of us. We hope to be consoled by a very loving and giving family member or friend. At times like these we miss our mothers a lot for they most of the time were wonderful consolers. My mother was at her best when we were sick or feeling heavily burdened and now, like for most of us, there is no one to fill her shoes.

But actually there is someone: God, our Creator and Redeemer and Sanctifier. His consolation is witnessed to throughout the Bible. God is loving and merciful, especially during times of distress, sorrow, and suffering. As Psalm 23 declares, "Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for You are with me; Your rod and Your staff, they comfort me." In Isaiah 40, God commands, "Comfort, give comfort my people, says your God." Most certainly God wants us to try and comfort one another as He comforts us.

In the New Testament, God's consolation is embodied by Jesus, who heals so many out of compassion and mercy. In Mt. 11, He says, "Come to me, all you who are weary and find life burdensome, and I will give you rest." When we pray, besides telling God our needs and others' needs, we rest in His healing, consoling, presence and are refreshed.

And we must never forget the Holy Spirit, called The Comforter among other titles, who is always there to provide believers with ongoing comfort and guidance.

I am not going to write anymore—I need to go right now to the chapel to rest in God's healing, comforting, presence! I pray you will want to also after reading this and being reminded of the great wondrous consolation that God provides us when we are down and feeling almost out for the count. Praise and thanks be to God!

A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS

His Word today, by Rev. William J. Reilly Most Holy Name Catholic Church, Garfield, NJ Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time October 19, 2025

"I charge you in the presence of God and Christ Jesus, who will judge the living and the dead, and by his appearing and his kingly power, proclaim the word, be persistent, whether it is convenient or inconvenient; convince, reprimand, encourage through all patience and teaching... remain faithful to what you have learned and believed, because you know from whom you have learned it."

Although Paul wrote this letter to Timothy, why not consider it to be a message personally sent to you. We can all seek to let God's inspired word change our lives, even at some cost, if it brings us closer to the Lord. Am I convinced that the Lord is speaking to me? Do I see something that I must change and correct in my life? Am I able to be a source of encouragement for someone else who is down or wandering?

As I hear the word and reflect upon it, remember the prophetic statement, 'Speak Lord, your servant is listening.'



CALLING ALL PARISHIONERS

At a loss?

Although we want to heed the Lord's command to "Pray always" (Luke 18:1), sometimes we might feel at a loss for whom to pray beyond our close-knit circle of family and friends for whom we regularly ask the Lord for favors. This week when you spend time in the Lord's Holy Presence, you might ask Him to inspire you to take a more generous, wider intercessory prayer perspective as a member of His Universal Church. In that regard, any day of the week throughout the year, you might consider using as a springboard for your wider prayers the nine intentions, close to His Merciful Heart, that the Lord Himself gave St. Faustina to pray on the nine days of the Divine Mercy Novena. Specifically, He asked her to bring to Him these nine groups, immersing them in His boundless Mercy: (1) all mankind, especially all sinners; (2) souls of priests and religious; (3) all devout and faithful souls; (4) those who do not believe in God and those who do not know Jesus; (5) souls of those persons who have separated themselves from His Church; (6) meek and humble souls and souls of little children; (7) souls of those who especially venerate and glorify His Mercy; (8) souls who are in the prison of Purgatory, and (9) souls that have become lukewarm. (Whew! After reading the desires of the Lord's Merciful Heart, we no longer need to be at a loss over for whom to pray. *Right?*)

In all of your prayers and entreaties, pray always in the Spirit. To that end, keep alert and always persevere in supplication for all the saints. Eph 6:18


THE LEGION OF MARY

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,


